



A Message from the Premier of Saskatchewan


On behalf of the Government of Saskatchewan, it is an honour for me to provide greetings for the 10th Annual Military Service Recognition Book.

The Estevan Soldiers' Tree

Dedicated September 10, 2016

This carved Monument is dedicated to the memory of the men and women of the Canadian Armed Forces who have laid down their lives in the service of their country.

The Monument also pays tribute to the members of the military who have served, serve today and will serve in the future.

The tree's story began as a sapling planted in 1913 on land owned by the Pawson Family who operated Pawson's Market Garden south west of Estevan. In 2015 the family donated the 102 year old tree for the Monument.

The carving of the Monument by Darren Jones of Rimby, Alberta began in 2015 and the completed tree was moved to the present location in 2016.

The Monument depicts battle scenes and service men and women from World War 2. The Queen's Colour and badge of the South Saskatchewan Regiment are proudly displayed in tribute to the contribution of people from southern Saskatchewan.





First of all, we want you to know that at the Royal Canadian Legion, veterans are Canadian Armed and Allied Forces personnel and RCMP who have served and are serving.

Next, we want you to know that, by observing the Legion's three pillars—Veterans, Remembrance, Community—Saskatchewan Command, as the Saskatchewan arm of the Legion, is an active presence in communities across the province. But how, you ask? Well, read on, to discover how the head office in Regina works closely with its Executive Council, 171 branches around the province, and over 10,000 members to support Veterans, Remembrance and Community.

Veterans

Veterans requiring support of any kind can contact their local Legion branch in confidentiality which will put them in contact with a branch service officer. Veterans can also contact the Provincial Service Officer at 306-525-8739 or toll-free at 1-866-471-8387. Service officers conduct needs assessments and based on the results, develop a plan for the veteran to move forward which often includes a community and team effort of businesses, health professionals and other service organizations. A plan could include the service officer assisting the veteran to fill out paperwork from Veterans Affairs Canada, the service officer acquiring furniture for the veteran donated by local businesses, and the service officer connecting the veteran to health professionals.




Here are some of our programs that your donations go toward so that veterans receive the care, benefits and support that is the mandate of the Legion.

Leave the Streets Behind – for homeless and near-homeless veterans.

<u>Paws for Veterans</u> – matches service dogs to qualifying veterans suffering from operational stress injuries (OSIs) such as anxiety, depression and post-traumatic stress disorder. It also raises public awareness about service dogs and their presence in society.

<u>Discovering the Power in Me</u> – In partnership with Wounded Warriors Weekend Foundation and the Pacific Institute, Saskatchewan Command offers this seminar for Saskatchewan veterans and their families, offering tools to deal with operational stress injuries (OSIs).

<u>Wounded Warriors Weekend</u> – For veterans, reservists and first responders suffering from OSIs, and their families to engage in leisurely indoor and outdoor activities while at the same time receiving support from health professionals.

<u>OSI-CAN</u> (Operational Stress Injury Canada) – With support from the Canadian Mental Health Association and Saskatchewan Command, OSI-CAN offers a weekly or monthly support group in the communities of Regina, Weyburn, Saskatoon and Prince Albert to veterans, first responders and Correctional Service workers. It also offers access to equine therapy and service dogs.

<u>Funeral and Burial</u> – The Royal Canadian Legion delivers the Veterans Affairs Funeral and Burial Program which provides funeral, burial and grave marking benefits for eligible Canadian and Allied veterans. Its mission is to ensure that no veteran is denied a dignified funeral and burial as well as a military gravestone because of insufficient funds.

Remembrance

Poppy Campaign – The Royal Canadian Legion, since its inception in 1926, has become known for its annual organization of November 11th Remembrance Day services and events, held in many communities across Canada to honour veterans. Along with Remembrance Day is the poppy campaign, which always runs from the **last Friday in October through to Nov. 11** — this period marks the time when The Royal Canadian Legion distributes poppies and encourages the public to wear them as a reminder of the service given by our veterans.

Poster and Literary Contests – Every year, Legion branches offer local schools the opportunity for their students to submit entries in the form of a poster, poem or essay with veterans as the theme. The contests start at the branch level in October, with winning submissions moving up the Legion ladder until finally, 14 entries from students in Saskatchewan are sent to Dominion Command in Ottawa for judging.

At this highest level, the winning entries are displayed at the Canadian War Museum from July 1 to May 1 of the following year. For the poster contest, the second-place winners and any

<u>Branch Sports</u> – Branches may offer such sports as bowling, cribbage, curling, darts, 8-ball pool and golf.





Submissions to be added to the Virtual Wall of Honour and Remembrance for November 2017

must be received by October 27, 2017. Later submissions will be included in the 2018 edition.

Criteria for photographs

- Any deceased Canadian Veteran whose death was attributable to any cause before or after they served may be honoured. A Canadian Veteran is any person who is serving or has honourably served in the Canadian Armed Forces or as a Regular Member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, or as a Peace Officer in a Special Duty Area or on a Special Duty Operation, or who has served in the Merchant Navy or Ferry Command during wartime.
- The photos should be high-resolution electronic-image files or high-resolution photo prints (no originals please as they cannot be returned).
- The quality of the image submitted dictates the quality of the image displayed on the Virtual Wall (please do not send photocopies as the image quality is poor).

The Estevan Soldiers' Tree

The actual chainsaw sculpturing took about 18 days as the tree stood where it had grown for 102 vears on a farm near Estevan. Then, two park benches were carved from B.C. cedar trees to complement the military theme: Seated on the ends of the benches are a WWII sailor from HMCS Saskatchewan, a WWI soldier PPCLI, a WWII RCAF pilot officer and a modern-day soldier PPCLI. The latter was carved in the likeness of Warrant Officer Ivan Finstad, a native of Estevan. The 6-ft-wide tree with 18-ft circumference, along with the benches, were painstakingly transported to downtown Estevan: a crane lowered them into position on the Courthouse grounds near the cenotaph.

Carvings in the 20-ft-tall tree include personnel of the Royal Canadian Navy, Canadian Army

and Royal Canadian Air Force: a sergeant-at-arms; pilot; sailor; female Air Force sergeant; and a South Saskatchewan Regiment corporal helping his buddy to safety. Also depicted in the carving are the hat badge and the Queen's Colours of the South Saskatchewan Regiment.

From the planning stage to the dedication ceremony, The Royal Canadian Legion's Estevan Branch 060 was heavily involved in the project by volunteering time, donating money, fundraising, and sharing military memories and expertise.


At the dedication ceremony on September 10, 2016, the Legion Colour Party led the parade along with veterans of past conflicts and a Guard of Honour consisting of 26 soldiers from the 3rd Battalion PPCLI Edmonton. A pair of WWII Bren Gun Carriers brought up the rear of the parade transporting five WWII veterans to the monument to hold the ribbon for the ribbon-cutting ceremony. Following an address by Brigadier General Ray Romses, the ribbon cutting was performed by a PPCLI soldier from 3rd Battalion PPCLI Edmonton and a veteran of the Afghanistan conflict. Then, in front of over 2500 attendees, Estevan Branch took a vow of care accepting responsibility for maintenance of The Soldiers' Tree.

Estevan Branch is honoured to take responsibility for maintaining the Solders' Tree that displays carvings of Spitfire fighter plane, poems, sprays of poppies, and a combat helmet on a cross.

Bronze Plaque on the Carievale Cenotaph

After the Carievale Hall was built, it was decided to build a cairn. In 1953, Rene Hoefer hauled gravel, cement was obtained from A.W. Fuller, and a crew of volunteers poured a cement base for the cairn. In the summer of 1954, Mr. W. McElvenna, a stone mason from Oxbow, was hired to erect the cairn from field stone and mortar, at a cost of \$125.00. A glass dome that had been used on top of a gas bowser was obtained from N. W Burke, and Allen Harrison did the wiring.

In 1955, a bronze plaque was obtained and engraved with the names of all the soldiers who were killed in action in the two world wars. The plaque was fastened to the front of the cairn.

In 1958, it was decided to add a flag pole. Through the very capable efforts of Frank Raynor, some pipe was obtained and he manufactured a pole that was erected. Legion members poured a cement base and the finished product became a reality.

This video will be shown at Government House, the Legislative Building and on the Archives' YouTube channel. The video series has been made possible, in part, by the Government of Canada.







The Carnduff Community Memorial to the soldiers of the district who gave their lives in the Great War was dedicated in May 1933. The memorial consists of three parts - the park, the swimming pool and the cenotaph. One of the chief agitators for the building of the park was Mr. John Griffin.

The monument is made of tyndal stone on a concrete base and core. Complete, it stands nine feet high and rises in three steps from the base. The column is two-and-a-half feet square with a threefoot, square cap, carrying a stone ball about one foot in diameter. A marble plaque fastened to the front, contains the names of 27 men in whose honour it was erected. A dedication was held for it, with over 1,000 in attendance.

After World War Two, the names of the men who lost their lives in that war were added to the plaque on the face of the monument. In later years, the Legion improved the ground around the cenotaph and put in the paved walkway leading to the cenotaph.

In 2005, the Carnduff Legion took on a project of obtaining veterans' names and placing them on separate boards beside the cenotaph, as well as one for deceased Associate Members and Auxiliary Members' names. It was dedicated at the homecoming in 2005 by the Legion members.

The Town of Carnduff had the cenotaph redone in 2013. They replaced the marble plaque at the front. For Homecoming celebrations in 2015, Carnduff Legion Branch erected the former plaque on a stand at the door of the Legion hall. A plaque is also on the wall of the Legion with its history for a Walk of Remembrance of the Town.

Remembering Vimy

The 100th anniversary of the Battle of Vimy Ridge will be marked in April 2017 with special events in France and Canada. The First World War's Battle of Vimy Ridge was fought April 9 to 12, 1917, in northern France. There, the Canadian Corps won a remarkable victory over the Germans, capturing the heavily-defended ridge that the Allies had previously attempted to take.

The 2016 Veterans' Week poster features the Canadian National Vimy Memorial in the foreground. This beautiful and richly symbolic monument commemorates Canadians who served during the bloody First World War. Engraved on its walls are the names of the 11,285 Canadians who died in France and have no known grave. Two towering pylons sitting on a massive base represent Canada and France. The monument also incorporates 20 large stone sculptures of figures that represent ideals for which Canada fought, such as truth, justice, hope and peace.

In the background of the poster, "Canada Bereft" is featured in detail: a striking statue of a woman, her chin forlornly resting on her hand as she gazes downward brooding over the graves of her valiant dead. The statue represents those who were left behind to mourn their loss.

An historical photograph taken during the Battle of Vimy Ridge completes the poster's design. It depicts the advance of the Canadian Corps' 29th (Vancouver) Battalion across No Man's Land and through the German barbed wire at Vimy. In total, some 3,600 Canadians lost their lives and over 7,000 more were wounded.

2017 marks the 150th anniversary of Confederation. It is very fitting that this same year includes the centenary of the Battle of Vimy Ridge, where many suggest that Canada came of age as a nation.

My Uncle by W. O. Minish

Victor Albert Hare was my uncle. Although I never knew him, my mother often spoke fondly of her younger brother who had died in the Great War. Throughout my early childhood, Victor smiled down from a large oval-framed picture which hung in our living room. That picture showed Victor seated beside his brother Fred, both in uniform. I believe the picture was taken somewhere in France.

Victor was born on May 21, 1897 in or near Britannia, Ontario. He and three of his younger brothers went west with their mother in 1910 to join their father, Albert, and their eldest brother, George. For the next six years Victor lived at the family homestead helping with the farming.

He enlisted in the Canadian Overseas Expeditionary Force at Rosetown, Saskatchewan on May 3, 1916, when he described himself as a farmer (and a Methodist). Assigned regimental number 1018237, his "Attestation Paper" (his enlistment document) shows him to have been five feet ten inches tall, with brown hair and blue eyes. Strangely no weight is mentioned but his medium complexion and fully expanded chest girth of 37 ½ inches with a range of expansion of 5 ½ inches are recorded. The paper was stamped at the Orderly Room of the 232nd Battalion Canadian Expeditionary Force on the 5th of May which was probably the day that he reported for duty.

The progress of Victor's war is sketchily outlined in other documents: "Embarked Canada Halifax 17-4-17 on the S.S. Northland"; "Debarked England Liverpool 29-4-17"; "Ent'd Segregation Camp Bramshott 30-4-17"; "Taken on the Strength of the 15th Can Res Battn." Bramshott, on 29 April 1917; sent on August 9th to 51st Howitzer Battery, 13th Brigade of the Canadian Field Artillery at Milford Camp; proceeded, a few days later, on August 24th, overseas with the 13th Brigade, landing the same day at "Havre" in France.

Between March 3 and 15, 1918, he underwent a Signals Course in the "Field" after which he rejoined his unit. On April 1, 1918, Victor suffered what was described as "G. S. W. Neck Slight. At Duty" – a slight gunshot wound to the neck, suffered while on duty.



On September 11, 1918, Victor was caught in a poison gas attack and suffered severe burns and inflammation of the eyes. Following this attack he spent six to seven weeks in hospitals and rest centres.

Victor was transferred from the 25th General to 5 Rest Camp on October 4th. On October 7th, while he was still at the CCRC, Victor was "Awarded Military Medal for Bravery in the Field." We have no more information on the nature of the action for which the MM was awarded. Victor "Rejoined Unit from CCRC" on October 31st. Four days later, on November 4, 1918, he was killed in action, seven days before the war ended.









The following is a transcription of one of Victor's few surviving letters home:

France Sept 25, 1917

Dear Mother:

I haven't had any word from you since I wrote last, but Fred got a letter so that was nearly as good. I was going to write on Sunday but we had to work all day and I was on picquet at night so I decided to write last night, but I was just getting into bed (I do my writing in bed nowadays) when the Quartermaster came along looking for men to go up the line to haul ammunition from the rail head to the guns, it is pretty hard work so any of the fellows who were dressed and had any chance, beat it out of sight instantly, but I was helpless having no clothes on so I had to dress and go up. We got up about eleven o'clock so we had to wait two hours for it, we were wrestling shells from then until after five o'c. and it was after seven when we got back to our horse line, we sure had a good nights work. I don't blame anyone for trying to get out of it, I would have if I had a chance, of course we have regular turns for going up and we don't mind that but when one of these extra turns come around we generally make ourselves scarce.

Fred has been pretty sick these last few days, some stomach trouble but he is nearly all right now.

I hear we may have to move our horse lines again, we all feel pretty sore about it as we have been working pretty hard to get this place fixed up and now we will likely have to leave it, we will be lucky if we strike as good a place again, if we get any cover for the horses we will soon build a shelter for ourselves. Well I think I will have to bring this to a speedy close as I can hardly keep awake, I dozed off once since I started this letter so if it's not very sensible you will know it is because I am sleepy. Suppose threshing will be in full swing by now, we will try and thrash a few of the germens, it is pretty slow work but I think we are giving them more than we have to take from them so I guess it will all come right in time.

Well I will close now and will write again when I am not so sleepy.

The last known letter that Victor wrote to his mother is transcribed below. This letter mentions "2nd" hospital but the military records indicate he was at the 25th General Hospital at or near Etables, a small centre near the mouth of the Canche River on the Pas-de-Calais (the Straight of Dover).

France Sept 21, 1918

Dear Mother:

I guess you have heard by now that I have got a touch of gas and by the time you get this I will be back with the battery. It is eleven days since I left, the first five days I couldn't open my eyes and I was washed and fed and looked after like a little baby. My eyes are nearly better now but my skin got burned a bit and is peeling off now and I shall be all right again before long.

I am down near the sea shore now where the cool sea breezes blow and they sure are cool in the morning.

We have a great time in our ward arguing about the war. We have Canadians, Australians, New Zealanders, Americans, Scotch, English and Irish and we have some good chewing matches. That's about all we have to do so it helps to pass the time away.

It feels good to get a bath every day and a good bed with white sheets to sleep in, rather different from sleeping with a great coat and a rubber sheet like I have been doing since we started the push in August.

I haven't got any mail since I came here but I expect it will be coming along any day now. I suppose you will be all through harvest by now, what there is of it, and ready for threshing.

I wish I was at it instead of lying around 2nd hospital but I think we will be back for the next harvest.

Well I haven't much more to say now so I will close.

He enlisted in Estevan, SK on February 8, 1916 to join the Canadian Overseas Expeditionary Force assigned to the 152nd Overseas Battalion under Captain and Adjutant G.W. Hemmans. Bert was a lightweight battalion boxing champion. He applied for a homestead at Copeau, SK and a soldier's grant. For a time, he was a special constable for the RCMP in Saskatoon delivering prisoners to the penitentiary, and was also guard of the jail. Herbert passed away in 1964.

ADAMSON, John Bernard "Jack"

WWI

Jack was born in East London, Peckham, United Kingdom in 1891 to Thomas Adamson and Alice Sandall, who homesteaded in Leslie, SK in 1910. Jack enlisted in the Army in Yorkton, SK in 1916 and served with the 188th Battalion C.E.F. during the First World War. He was later transferred to the 46th Battalion, Canadian Infantry (SK Regiment). He was awarded the Military Medal for his actions on the night of August 24-25, 1917 when he brought in wounded men under heavy enemy fire. He was given the Bar to that medal for his conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty, when on October 26, 1917 he took charge of an advance post during the consolidation of the new line, which resulted in all company N.C.O.'s becoming casualties. He was promoted to Corporal on February 2, 1918 and to Apptd L. Sgt on September 23, 1918. Jack was killed in action in France during an assault on Canal du Nord in 1918, and is buried in the Fourth Division Cemetery Inchy-En-Sectors, Triangle Cemetery, Inchy-En-Artois, Pas de Calais, France.

ADAMSON, Richard Henry "Dick"

WWI

Richard was born in Croyden, England to Thomas Adamson and Alice Sandall. On August 15, 1915, Richard volunteered at Carnduff, SK for the CEF, although attestation papers show Sewell, MB. He served with the 45th Battalion in Canada, Britain and France during the First World War. He served until demobilization on April 3, 1919 and received the British War Medal and Victory Medal. His war service is recorded in his book "All For Nothing" available from Canadian National Archives. On April 4, 1919, all Veterans of the old 45th Battalion were offered keys to the city, then they continued on to Oxbow, SK. An old Colonel hired him for Manitoba Provincial Police as undercover agent. He served until the night he accompanied the regular detective staff on a raid to capture Chas Buller. Buller opened up with two automatic guns and slayed many of the detectives. Richard passed away on June 12, 1996.





ALLEN, Harold Gordon

WWII

Harold was born in 1917 in Willow Bunch, SK. He enlisted with the Royal Canadian Air Force and served with the 49th and the 617th Squadron "The Dam Busters". He flew 47 missions on Lancaster Bombers during the war. He was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion Kelvington Branch for thirty years. Harold passed away in 2003.

Prior to his discharge from the Air Force, he married Mary Martin and they settled in Winnipeg. Carl worked for the Greater Winnipeg Transit Commission for thirty-four years as a bus mechanic and was a supervisor at the time of his retirement. Carl and Mary had three daughters: Janice, Colleen and Heather. He was an active member of Ness Avenue Baptist Church for many years. At the time of his death on September 16, 1993, he had five grandchildren. Carl passed away on his and Mary's 49th wedding anniversary in 1993.





ANDERSON, Omar Carl

Carl was born in 1919 in Leroy, SK. He worked as a farm laborer until he joined the Regina Light Infantry in Regina. He spent a long time in England before being sent to Holland during the German Occupation. When he returned to Canada he farmed briefly before working at the Silver Head mines in Trail, BC. He also worked in the Ontario woods, on the Hudson Hope Dam, Fort St. John, BC, and on oilrigs in Alberta. He became a carpenter and built many houses and renovated buildings. He retired to the original farm and developed a large garden and orchard. Omar passed away in 2007.











ANDERSON, Robert A. "Bob"

WWII


Bob was born in 1920 in Kincaid, SK. He joined active service with the 60th Battery RCA at Aneroid, SK on July 24, 1940. He trained in Canada as a member of the 17th Field Regiment RCA and went overseas to England in November 1941. He took part in all Canadian Corps battles in Italy from Ortona to the Hitler Line. With a short stop in Belgium, the regiment went into action in Holland. At the cessation of hostilities he returned to Canada, having served his country to the utmost. WWII

Ron was born in Rocanville in 1917. He joined the RCAF in late 1940. After training in Ontario and Britain as a radar technician, he served in Scotland and North Africa before taking part in the invasion of Sicily and Italy while he served with Air Ministry Experimental Units, which were mobile, self-contained radar stations. He served with 6039 A.M.E.S., 15052 A.M.E.S. and 11 Radio Unit during the Second World War. He returned to Canada in 1945, where he married his sweetheart, Anita, whom he had not seen for three-and-a-half years. They moved to Pangman, SK where he became the administrator of the RM of Norton #69 and of the Village of Pangman. Ron and Anita had a son and a daughter and eventually enjoyed seven grandchildren. Ron retired in 1980, and subsequently enjoyed summers in Saskatchewan and winters in Texas for fourteen years until his death in 1994. He was a member of Pangman Legion Branch 180 for forty-five years.

ARMSTRONG, Gerald Gordon

WWII

Gerald was born at Macoun, SK on June 19, 1918, son of Gordon William and Martha Henrietta Armstrong, owners of the Armstrong & Co. General Store until 1930. After completing school in Macoun in 1935, Gerald worked with the Royal Bank of Canada in Oxbow, Assiniboia, Craik, Wilkie and Weyburn, SK. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1940, receiving his wings shortly thereafter. In May 1941, Flight Sergeant Gerald Armstrong was posted to England and attached to the Royal Air Force bomber squadron flying Wellington Bombers. On November 17, 1941, Gerald's plane went down into the North Sea off the east coast of England while returning from operations. He is buried in Aylesham Cemetery, Kent, England. Gerald Lake, near Ile-A-La-Crosse in northern Saskatchewan, is named after him.

ARMSTRONG, Kenneth Algernon

WWII

Kenneth was born on October 2, 1914, the first child of Gordon and Martha Armstrong. After completing elementary and high school, he was employed by McBrides Ltd in Macoun, Midale, Moose Jaw, Estevan and Weyburn, managing the Macoun store in 1941. He married Norma Steele of Macoun on July 10, 1940 and together, they had four children. On November 11, 1941 Kenneth enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force and was stationed in Toronto, St. Thomas (Ontario), Winnipeg and Montreal. He was discharged in June 1945 and went back home to Macoun to farm. In the fall of 1950, Kenneth and his family moved to Midale to operate a store with his brother, Mel. He operated the store until 1973 when he closed the store and returned to farming.






ARNASON, Oli B.

WWII

Oli was born in 1918 on a farm near Leslie, SK. As a young man he joined the Army and was sent to England to take his training as a machine gunner. While he was in England he achieved the rank of Sergeant. He served in England, Belgium and Italy. Oli was killed in action while serving in Italy in 1944.

WWII



He was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion Birch Hills Branch 122 for thirty-three years. William passed away in 1979.





BACHORCIK, Paul

WWII

Paul was born in 1924 in Czechoslovakia, coming to Canada with his parents, Stephen and Augusta Bachorcik, at four years of age. Paul joined the Royal Canadian Navy in May 1943, enlisting at HMCS Queen in Regina and served his basic training there until July 11, 1943. He became a gunner and served on several HMCS ships: Naden, Givanchy III, Niobe, Excellent, Pereguine and on a landing craft (LCI) #302 from February 29 to September 4, 1944. Paul participated in the D-Day landing at Normandy in France on June 6, 1944. In general, Paul spent long days at sea, helping others with the cooking and keeping the ship in order. He returned to Macoun in the fall of 1945 and like many of the returning service men, suffered from post-traumatic stress and had difficulty adjusting to civilian life. In 1946, Paul married Doreen Dawson from Halbrite, a teacher at McGregor School, and they had six children. They spent the early years of their marriage in British Columbia before returning to the family farm to build a new home.

WWII

Steve was born in Czechoslovakia in 1897. He came to Canada in 1927 and to Saskatchewan, first to Gravelbourg and then to Macoun. In 1940, at the age of 42, Steve joined the Canadian Army. He was stationed at Dundurn, SK and at Nedder Crossing near Chilliwack, BC. He had received a degree as a tailor from his country of birth and became a tailor for the Army. He could make a suit in four days and made many for the officers. After the war, he and his wife, Augusta, bought an apartment building in Vancouver, BC and opened a tailor shop there. Steve and Augusta had one daughter, Anne, and two sons, Mirko (Mac) and Paul. Steve died in Vancouver in 1960.

BAKER, Cecil Claude

WWII

Cecil was born on April 27, 1919 in Wallard, SK. He joined the 60th Field Battery (later the 17th Field Regiment), Royal Canadian Artillery on July 24, 1940 and he trained to be a Gunner. He served in Canada, Italy, France, England, and Germany. While in service he was awarded an efficiency chevron, SOS Canadian Army (UK), T.O.S. Canadian Army (Mediterranean), Canadian Volunteer Service Medal, 1 silver and 3 red service chevrons, SOS Canadian Army CMF, Good Conduct, second Good Conduct, 1939-1945 Star, Italy Star, France Star, Germany Star, and Defence Medal. Cecil passed away on December 4, 1986.





BAKER, Douglas Charles

WWII

Douglas was born in 1922 in Parkman, SK. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force and graduated as a Pilot, flying heavy bombers. He was flying with #432 Leaside Squadron on a bombing mission over Hanover Germany and was shot down. Douglas was killed in action on October 9, 1943 at the age of 21 years. He is buried in the Hanover War Cemetery in Hanover, Germany. Baker Creek in northern Saskatchewan was named in his honour on December 15, 1967.

WWI

Sidney was born in 1878 in Sapiston, Suffolk, England. He enlisted with the Canadian Expeditionary Force, 16th Regiment on April 14, 1916. He was in France by June 10th, and he built pontoon bridges over waterways, dismantled unexploded enemy shells, trained as a detonator, etc. After being shell shocked, gassed and severely wounded, he was placed in Buxton, England hospital. He received his discharge on December 31, 1918. He received the 1914-1918 British War Medal and the Victory Medal of The Great War For Civilization 1914-1918. Sidney passed away on September 26, 1960.

BALABERDA, Thomas Ferdinent

WWII

Thomas was born in 1922 in Plainview, SK. He enlisted with the 3rd Battalion, Irish Fusiliers and served for a total of 37 months in Canada, the United Kingdom and Continental Europe as an infantry soldier and shoemaker group "C". He was awarded the France and Germany Star and the 1939-1945 Star. Thomas was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion Pierceland Branch 178. He passed away in 1985.



BALL, Jacob Max

WWII

Jacob was born in 1918 in Holdfast, SK. He enlisted in the Army on February 19, 1942 and embarked for overseas on January 10, 1945. He returned to Canada on February 3, 1946 and was discharged on March 21, 1946. He served with the Kings Own Rifles of Canada as a Rifleman, was a Private in the Midland Regiment and Lake Superior Regiment in Canada, Britain and Northwest Europe during the Second World War. Jacob also took part in the chemical warfare agent tests in Suffield, Alberta Experimental Station where military personnel participated in many hazardous and secret trials. The collective service of all these participants was significant and while their efforts were unknown in the past, their duty was, by every measure, exceptional, and was gratefully recognized by the Government of Canada on February 19, 2004. Jacob passed away in 1995.









BALLAGH, John Clarence

WWII

John was born in 1917 in Abernethy, SK. He enlisted with the Canadian Army during the Second World War and served in Canada until his discharge. John passed away in 2000.

BANKS, Henry "Harry"

wwi

Harry was born in 1891 in Yorkshire England. He enlisted with the First Canadian Mounted Rifles SK Regiment in Moose Jaw on March 30, 1917. He served in England, France and Belgium until his discharge in 1919. Harry passed away in 1961.





BANKS, Richard

WWI

Richard was born in 1889 in Yorkshire England. He enlisted with the First Canadian Mounted Rifles Saskatchewan Regiment in Moose Jaw on March 30, 1917. He served in England, France and Belgium until his discharge on March 25, 1919. He was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion before he passed away in 1964.










BARKMAN, Albert

Carl was born on April 3, 1924. He enlisted with the Royal Canadian Air Force and served in Canada until his discharge. Carl passed away on June 30, 1991.





BLONDEAU, George William "Bill"








BLOOR, Elmer







BOYER, Francis Lawrence "Frankie" WWII

He attended McGregor School and completed his grade 12 by correspondence when Gerry, his son, was attending the University of Saskatchewan. As a young man, Francis held various jobs in Estevan, participated in sports, loved to hunt, dance and socialize. Francis joined the Army later in the war and returned to the farm at war's end. He married Ruby Lindgren in 1948 and they had two sons who were raised on the farm. Francis passed away in March 1976.

BOYER, George Damas

WWII

George joined the family of Damas (Tom) and Mary (Davis) Boyer as one of their ten children, living for the most part, at the "Pump House" farm south of Macoun, SK. In 1939, George married Lillian Liese of Macoun. Shortly thereafter, he joined the Canadian Army in Regina, SK. George worked at the M&S Coal Mines until his accidental death there in 1961. George and Lillian had eight children - five girls and three boys.

On June 9, 1942, George enlisted with the Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve in Regina, SK and began active service on July 9, 1942, serving in Canada, the High Seas, and United Kingdom. He was on escort duty transporting prisoners of war to Canada then reassigned to the aircraft carrier Nabob which was torpedoed on August 15, 1943, suffering 23 casualties and severe physical damage but still afloat. George went home on leave and then returned to Halifax where he was on guard duty the day after the armistice was signed. He received the 1939-1945 Star, the Atlantic Star, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp and the War Medal 1939-1945. He was discharged on August 30, 1945 and married Norma Linton that fall. They had three children. In 1971, he married Kay Fraser. George worked for most of his life with Saskem as a salesman. George died on November 30, 1979.


Alfred was born on November 4, 1915 in Humboldt, SK. He had eight siblings, two of whom also served in the Second World War. He married Burnace Parker of Winnipeg shortly before he was ordered to England. On July 21, 1944, Alfred and six other young men were killed in action over Haarl, near Tubbergen, Overijssel, Holland, when a German fighter aircraft collided with a Lancaster aircraft #PB 174 at 8,000 feet. The information about the #405 City of Vancouver Squadron, Pathfinder Force is recorded in two brief notes included in a memorial book that is on display in the British Columbia Aviation Museum.

BROCK, John William Angus

WWII

John was born on November 17, 1924 in McTaggart, SK. He served with the Royal Canadian Air Force with 437 Husky Squadron, 8 Wing/ CFB Trenton, ON. He was in this squadron when it was formed in September 1944 until its disbandment in June 1946. He received the following medals for his service: Bomber Command Commemorative Medal, France and Germany Star, Defence Medal, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Bar and the 1939-1945 War Medal. He joined The Royal Canadian Legion Abernethy Branch 26 and was an officer. John passed away on April 6, 2002.





BROMSTAD, Carleton

WWII

Carleton, born on April 5, 1916, was one of three children of Peter and Bergit Bromstad who homesteaded eight miles northeast of Midale, SK. He attended Bromstad and Macoun Schools, later going on to Normal School in Moose Jaw, SK, after which he became a teacher. Carleton was called to war service, trained in Canada and was sent overseas. He met and married Pauline Collier from Wales with whom he had two boys. Upon completion of his war service, Carleton and Pauline returned to the farm, moving to Prince Albert, SK in 1947. He worked for the postal service there and retired after thirty-one years. Carlton passed away in 1991.







BROWN, Norman Clifford

WWII









BUCHANAN, John


WWII














BUCHANAN, Steward Roderick "Rod" WWII



















BURNS, Robert

WWII




Edward was born in 1895 in Clearwater, Manitoba. He enlisted in the Canadian Army during the First World War. Edward passed away in 1949.

Robert was born in Osmotherly, England on March 15, 1914 to Emma and George Chapman. His father served in the First World War and was killed in action after he stepped on a bomb in France. When Robert was fifteen, he and two of his friends boarded a ship to Canada where they worked on his uncle's farm in Moose Jaw, SK for about ten years. When the Second World War broke out, Robert signed up with the Saskatoon Light Infantry to train at the Dundurn Military Camp. He soon became a Machine Gun Instructor and a Sergeant. He fought in Italy and also participated in the Liberation of Holland, where he formed a bond with a little orphaned boy that he pulled out from a dark basement. After the war, Robert took over his uncle's farm, married Myrtle Moncrief on August 3, 1946 and had a daughter and a son. Twenty-four years later, Robert received a visit from H. William Dekker, the little orphaned boy. Robert was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion Branch 63 in Saskatoon until his death in 1996.

CHOVIN, James Wilson

wwii

James was born in Asquith, SK in 1924. He enlisted in the Canadian Army in 1943 and took his basic training in Saskatchewan. He received further training with the Canadian Parachute Corps at Shilo, Manitoba, and was shipped overseas in the fall of 1943. Jim eventually joined the Royal Winnipeg Rifles, and served as Sharpshooter on the first-wave landing of the D-Day Invasion on Juno Beach. He fought the battle for Carpiquet Airfield, and was wounded on the outskirts of Caen. Jim was removed for the duration of the war and spent a year convalescing at Ballingstone Military Hospital in England. He often joked about returning to Canada escorting a ship full of war brides. He further recuperated at Portage la Prairie. Jim was discharged in 1946 at the age of 21, and was plagued by flashbacks until his death at 84 years old in 2008. He was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion Saskatoon Branch 63 for over fifty years. His medals include the France and Germany Star, 1939-1945 Star, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal, Defence Medal and King George VI 1939-1945 Medal.





CINNAMON, Roy

Roy was born in Oshawa, Ontario in 1897. He joined the Armed Forces in 1917 and returned in 1918. Roy passed away in 1982.

CLINE (BELL), Margaret


WWII






DIXON, Henry Ward






WWI



DUBOIS, Albert







WWII



WWII







FITCHELL (LOW), Doris Lilian "Betty" WWII



FRANCIS, David



WWII


























GALIPEAU, Arthur














GREEN, Moses


WWI






















GRUMETZA, Metro

HARRIS, Reginald William WWII & PEACETIME



HART, Manfred L. "Fred"



WWI, WWII & RCMP

Jim was born on November 16, 1898 in England. He enlisted in the Army on February 3, 1914 and served in England until February 2, 1920. He went to Canada in 1925 and joined the RCMP and moved to the Arborfield, SK area in 1929 to homestead. He re-enlisted in the Army on June 3, 1943 and served as a Police Escort until March 19, 1946. Jim passed away on May 13, 1970.

KENDALL, William

BOER WAR

William Kendall Jr. was born on August 20, 1879 in Cumbria, England to William and Jane Kendall. He joined the Army to serve in the Boer War at the age of twenty. Upon returning to England, he joined the 19th Hussars Cavalry Unit, serving two years in Africa before receiving his discharge in time to immigrate to Canada with his family in 1903. In 1904, William and his father and brothers filed homesteads in the Macrorie, SK area where William farmed until his passing in January 1962. He and his wife Margaret (Steele; 1874-1958) had no family.





KENNETH, Ed

WWII

Ed was born in Parkman, SK in 1925. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1943 at the age of eighteen and was recruited as a Bomb Aimer with his 20/20 vision. His training took him to Lethbridge and Edmonton, AB, then Gimli, MB and then Trois-Rivières, QC during the Second World War. He was released from service on November 17, 1944. He lost two of his best friends in the war, Tom Wilson and Russell Dennis, and was haunted by their deaths. "Lest we forget" always held special meaning for Ed. He worked with Aerial Photographer Doug Chisholm who took commemorative photos of geographical areas in Northern Saskatchewan that were named after fallen war Veterans, and are on display on the Veterans' Wall of Remembrance in The Legion Branch in Wawota, SK. Ed married Doris Armitage and they raised four daughters: Diane, Kim, Kristal and Deb. He was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion Wawota Branch 113 for forty-five years before he passed away in 2011.



WWII & KOREAN WAR





KIRKPATRICK, Gordon Daniel

WWII

Flight Lieutenant Gordon Daniel Kirkpatrick, the third son of Roy and Stella Kirkpatrick, was born on the Riebel farm north of Truax, SK in 1922. Gordon enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1944 and served during the Second World War. After training in Canada and England, he served as a Transport Pilot with 435 (Chinte) Squadron in Burma. From 1945 to 1946, he flew with 436 (Elephant) Squadron in Europe. He was awarded the standard medals for volunteer service and participation. Upon returning home to Saskatchewan, Gordon worked as an electrician with his father and, in 1947, began farming in the Truax area. In 1950, he married Mary Beingessner, also from Truax, who had worked as a nurse in Moose Jaw, Leader, Mossbank and Calgary, AB. They raised six children on the farm: Toni, Faith, Judy, Fred, Elaine and Jeannette. Gordon has been a member of The Royal Canadian Legion in Truax.

KIRKPATRICK, Raymond Charles "Raym" WWII

Raymond Charles Kirkpatrick was born near Truax, SK on November 29, 1919, the second child of Roy and Stella Kirkpatrick. He attended Sanderson School, east of Avonlea, and enlisted in the Army in 1941, where he took an electric trade course in Regina, SK and Hamilton, BC before going to England. He served with the 28th Armoured Regiment of British Columbia in England during the Second World War. Raymond was injured in a gasoline torch explosion while training in England just before D-Day, June 6, 1944, and sent back to Canada six months later to continue recuperating. After he was discharged in 1944, Raymond and his wife Eileen (McCabe) farmed at Carrot River and Lafleche, SK then worked at the Lafleche Co-Op Store. Raym and Eileen had eight sons and two daughters: Len, Janet, John, Ralph, Marian, Murray, Floyd, Vince, Terry and Brian.





KLEMPP, Theodore

WWI

Theodore was born in Neustadt, Ontario in 1888, son of George Klempp Sr. He joined the Army and served with the 46th Battalion, Saskatchewan Regiment in Canada, England and France during the First World War. Private Klempp was killed in action on November 1, 1918 at Valenciennes, France and is buried at Aulnoy Communal Cemetery, south of Valenciennes, France.



KNIGHT, William Lawson


WWI & WWII








KREPTUL, Alex

WWII








LANGIN, John "Jack"

WWII





He married Isabella (Ashfield) Mallough of Grenfell, SK and was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion Nutana Branch 362 for thirty years. David passed away in 1980.





McCREA, Maurice


WWII



McGREGOR, Bruce

WWII

Bruce was raised in Hitchcock, SK and signed up with the Reserves in the Canadian Scottish 2nd Battalion Machine Gun in the spring of 1938. Bruce and his brother Jack transferred to the PPCLI, Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry and Bruce sailed to Liverpool on the Duchess of Bedford in May 1940 where he was assigned as a Driver and during the Battle of Britain, he was stationed in various secret locations south of London where he worked out of headquarters, driving officers around. In June 1943, Bruce was with the 2nd Brigade Headquarters as they prepared for the invasion of Sicily. The invasion of Italy followed in September and Bruce drove a ¾-ton water truck supplying water for headquarters' soldiers and medical facilities. While in Italy, Bruce was promoted to Corporal. After being in the army for six years, Bruce has been a resident of the Veterans' Ward of Wascana Rehabilitation Center in Regina. At the age of 93, he composed a poem about the bravest man in the army, *"The lone piper who led the soldiers into battle"*.

McGREGOR, Earl Robert

wwii

Earl was born in 1920 in Saskatchewan. He enlisted in the Army with the 16/22 Saskatchewan Horse Regiment on January 16, 1942 and served with the Infantry Corps in the United Kingdom, Continental Europe and the Mediterranean until his discharge in 1945. He received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp, the France and Germany Star, the 1939-1945 Star, the Italy Star, the Defence Medal and the War Service Badge "General Service Class". Earl passed away on December 25, 2000.



McGREGOR, Jack

WWII

Jack was raised in Hitchcock, SK. He signed up with the Canadian Scottish 2nd Battalion Machine Gun at the outbreak of the war. Jack and his brother Bruce took the train to Winnipeg and transferred to the PPCLI, Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry. During their stay in Winnipeg, Jack met Irma Mildred Zradicka, and they were married on April 26, 1940. Jack was shipped overseas the following June and was not to see his bride again until the end of the war in 1945. Jack had the dangerous job of digging up unexploded bombs south of London. He remained in England for the duration of the war and ended up with the tough job of dealing with the aftermath of the battles. He saw the results of the horror first hand. Having become severely ill, Jack spent a lot of time in hospitals between his guard duty on the coast and hiking in all kinds of terrain and weather. From 1943 until the end of the war, he worked in the Medical Corps as an orderly. Jack passed away in 1997.

MOSKOWEC, Peter


WWII

MUNRO, George McLeod

WWII

George was born in Morden, MB in 1904. He was the brother of Hugh, William and James. He attended Victoria School, Nutana Collegiate, Saskatoon Normal School (Teachers' College) and taught in various Saskatchewan communities. He graduated with a Bachelor of Science Degree from Queen's University and was principal at Rosetown, SK. In October 1941, he enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force and was sent to Alliford Bay, North West Area of Operation where he was a Flight Officer in Education Branch, then was sent to Sea Island and Ucluelet. He applied for transfer to Signals (Security) Branch, but was refused due to scarcity of Education Officers. He was discharged in August 1945. Post war, he received a Bachelor of Education from the University of Saskatchewan and taught at Saskatoon Technical Collegiate and was principal of Nutana Collegiate. George never married and passed away in 1969. He is buried in Woodlawn Cemetery in Saskatoon.

MUNRO, Hector William

wwii

Hector was a Flying Officer Pilot serving with the RAF Squadron 170. He was killed in a flying accident on a Mustang Aircraft just outside the village of Bishop's Stortford, Hertfordshire County, England on November 24, 1943. He is buried in the Brookwood Military Cemetery in Woking, Surrey, England.



MUNRO, Hugh Archibald

WWI

Hugh was born in Stockton, MB in 1897. The family moved from Morden, MB to Saskatoon in 1907. His brothers were William, James and George. Hugh attended Nutana Collegiate and became a teacher. In April 1916, he joined the Army with the 196th Overseas Battalion, Canadian Expeditionary Force (Western Universities Battalion). He left Halifax on November 1, 1916, arrived in France on January 1, 1917, joined the 46th Battalion and served in France, Germany and Belgium. On October 28, 1917, he was wounded in action with a gunshot to the head and was transferred to Bristol Hospital. In April 1918, he was sent back to the 46th Battalion and in 1919, was sent to C.C. Survey Section Field. Hugh was discharged on June 26 and returned to Canada in September 1919. After the war, he taught at schools in Saskatchewan, became Post Master of Marsden, SK where he became a valued member of the community as a Scoutmaster, Secretary Board of Trade and Legion member. Hugh passed away in 1951. He is buried in Woodlawn Cemetery in Saskatoon.

wwii

James was born in Morden, MB in 1898. He was the brother of Hugh, William and George. He graduated from the University of Saskatchewan and Knox Presbyterian College. He became a Presbyterian Minister at Rosetown, SK. In September 1940, he enlisted in Chaplaincy Corps as Hon. Captain and served in 5th Division of Canadian Corps in France, Italy, Holland and Germany. He rose to Deputy Senior Protestant Chaplain, with rank of Hon. Major. He was awarded the Italy Star, France and Germany Star, and in September 1944, was in the battle at Fortuna Ridge, Italy for which he was awarded the Military Cross for outstanding faithfulness to duty while conducting burial services for five men and aiding in the evacuation of wounded under enemy shellfire. He was wounded while visiting forward troops near Lamone River. After the war, he became Superintendent of Western Missions of Presbyterian Church and Executive Director of the National Development Fund in Canada. In 1965, he became the Moderator of the 91st General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada. James passed away in 1972.

MUNRO, William McKeith

WWI & WWII

William was born in 1895 in Emmerson, MB. His brothers were Hugh, James and George. He attended Nutana Collegiate and studied to be a lawyer. In March 1916, he enlisted in the Army with the 196th Battalion of the Canadian Expeditionary Force (Western Universities Battalion). He landed in Liverpool in November 1916, joined the 96th Battalion in 1917 and was wounded at the Battle of Passchendaele on October 26 with a gunshot and shrapnel to the chest. He was wounded to the shoulder in September 1918 and was discharged in May 1919. After the war, he taught school in various Saskatchewan towns. William married and had three daughters. He enlisted in the Saskatoon Light Infantry in 1939 as Seargent and was part of the first contingent of Canadian Forces to land in England where he received a letter of welcome from King George VI on December 17, 1939. While in England, he suffered health problems relating to the First World War and was discharged in 1941. William passed away in December 1946 and is buried in Woodlawn Cemetery in Saskatoon, SK.





MURRELL, Ray

WWII

Ray was born on May 8, 1922 in Darmoody, SK. He enlisted in the Canadian Army Active on April 15, 1941 and served in Canada, the United Kingdom and Continental Europe as a member of the 16/22 Saskatchewan Horse Regiment. That Regiment was disbanded and he was transferred to the Governor General's Foot Guards until his discharge as Corporal on December 15, 1945. He was awarded the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal, 1939-1945 Star and the France and Germany Star. Ray passed away in 1994.

ORBAN, Joseph Louis "Joe"


WWII

WWII



SMITH, John Taylor


WWI

SMITH, William Herbert


RCMP

WWI



Harold was born on April 24, 1917 in Saskatoon, SK. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force during the Second World War on March 7, 1941. He took his basic training at #2 Manning Depot (Brandon). He finished his Service Flying training and obtained his Pilot's Flying Badge (Wings) on December 5, 1941 at RCAF Yorkton. He remained in Canada between January 1942 and June 1944 as a Flying Instructor and Squadron Commander and reached the rank of Flight Lieutenant. He was sent overseas to the United Kingdom on August 3, 1944. Flying Hurricanes and Spitfires he served with RAF 541 Squadron (Photo Reconnaissance), 41 Squadron (Fighter Reconnaissance) and 51 Squadron (Night Fighter). He returned to Canada on August 12, 1945 and was discharged on September 21, 1945. Harold was awarded the Defence Medal, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp, and the 1939-1945 War Medal. Harold passed away on January 15, 2009.





TAYLOR, Malcolm

Malcolm was born on November 1, 1917 to Simon and Matilda Taylor. He was born four years after the family moved permanently to Macoun, SK. He was the only child born in Canada, as the other five were born in Minnesota, USA. Malcolm married Elaine Penny of Macoun and they had five children. SPECIAL DUTY AREA



WAGNER, John

wwii

John was born on June 14, 1920 in the Gregherd School District north of Markinch, SK. He farmed with his family until he enlisted in the Army on January 7, 1942, eventually becoming a member of the Regina Rifles. After training in Vernon, BC and Shilo, MB, he was shipped to the United Kingdom during the Second World War. He participated in the Normandy Invasion on June 6, 1944 and was taken Prisoner of War on June 8, 1944. He remained in captivity until Europe was liberated by the Allied Forces in 1945. After his discharge in August 1945, he returned to his father's farm, and eventually purchased a farm of his own under the Veterans' Land Act. John married in 1946 and had two children. He was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion Branch Cupar & District 217. John passed away in June 2001.

WALKER, Frank Edward

WWI & WWII

Frank was born in 1893 in Upper Arley, Staffordshire, England. He enlisted in the Army and served as a Private with the Welsh Regiment in Salonika, Greece on the Eastern Front during the First World War. He also served as a cook with Corps Engineers in Chilliwack, BC during the Second World War. Frank was mentioned in dispatches and was awarded the Victory Medal and the British Medal. His records, according to the National Archives in the United Kingdom, were likely lost in the London bombings during the Second World War. He was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion Spiritwood Branch 182. Frank passed away in 1959.

WALL, Alexander

WWII

Alexander was born in 1923. In 1942, he enlisted in the Canadian Army in Prince Albert, SK, served with the Special Services Battalion and later trained in British Columbia and Montana, USA. In October 1943, he was sent to Italy where he served as a Paratrooper and participated in the successful assault on Monte Casino. He was then sent to Anzio where many of the soldiers were disguised as farm boys, hiding in the community, gardening and raising farm animals to feed themselves and the community. Seniors in the area still recall their exploits. Sergeant Wall was killed in action in Italy on May 24, 1944 but was mistakenly buried as an American. He was repatriated and his remains now rest in the Beach Head Cemetery in Anzio, Italy. He was posthumously awarded the Italian Star. "We are richer because of his service and sacrifice – but also poorer due to his loss."

He served as Lance Corporal in the Provost Corps during the Second World War. He was a Military Policeman at several locations and when the war ended, he was a Camp Warden. Jim received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal. He married his childhood friend Mary Isabelle Smith in December 1946 and they farmed at Ryerson, SK and retired to Maryfield, SK. Jim was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion for over forty years. He passed away in 1999.

WARNE, Alfred Richmond Jr.

Alfred was born on December 2, 1918 in Macoun, SK, the only son of Alfred and Grace Warne. The family first lived on the Blondeau farm southwest of Macoun and later moved closer to Macoun. Alfred went to school in Macoun until he joined the Army, enlisting first in the Rocky Mountain Rangers in association with the American Armed Forces. He served in Alaska before transferring to the Calgary Highlanders. He went overseas in 1944 and was killed in action on July 25, 1944 at Caen, France. Alfred is buried at Bretteville-sur-Laize Canadian War Cemetery in Calvados, France.





WEIGHILL, F. C. "Tiny"

Tiny was born in Davidson, SK in 1916. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force and served with the 142 Squadron RAF/RCAF in England during the First World War. He was taken prisoner from October 1942 until May 1945. Tiny passed away in 1973.

WELLBELOVE, John Arthur

WWII

John was born in Eston, SK in 1919. He enlisted in the Army and was a CANLOAN Officer serving with the 1st Battalion, Border Regiment, Royal Canadian Infantry Corps. He was attached to the glider section of the British Airborne Division. Lt. John Wellbelove perished on September 21, 1944 in the ill-fated attack on Arnhem Ridge. As observed by Adjacent British Platoon Commander, A. Wilson: "He kept firing his Sten until he was over run. You can't do any more than that. God knows how many Germans he killed before they got him." His medals include the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp, the 1939-1945 Star, the France and Germany Star, and the War Medal 1939-1945.

WHEELER, William Louis "Bill"

wwii

Bill was born July 1, 1920, the sixth child of Samuel and Rosa (Frank), on the farm in the View Hill District in the Benson RM north of Estevan, SK. He lived there for twenty years until he joined the Royal Canadian Air Force at Yorkton in 1941. He trained in Neepawa, MB and Suffield Air Base, AB. He was sent to Gander, NL and was a heavy equipment operator at the Air Base. He married Bessie Edwards on December 24, 1944. Bill had a one-month furlough in 1945, so with his new bride, they travelled from Montreal to Estevan, SK where Bess stayed with Bill's parents. Bill returned to Dartmouth Air Base in Nova Scotia until he was discharged in 1946. He returned to Saskatchewan to start his new life on the prairies. In 1958 he bought land in the Willmar area. He and Bessie had six children. Bill passed away on December 25, 1994 and is buried in the Arcola Cemetery.



WHITE, William Henry

WWII

William was born in Meldrum, MB in 1901. He received his education at Kisbey and Moose Jaw, SK and had been a banker and a Rawleigh salesman before enlisting in the Royal Canadian Air Force at Regina in 1941. He served as an Aircraftman 1 (RCAF Accounting Clerk) during the Second World War. William died of a fractured skull in 1942 while on strength with No. 2 Initial Training School at Regina. He died "...an accidental death at the Arcadia dance hall...." He was the son of John Weslet and Ellen Hughes (Samways) White. William was married to Clara May (Anderson) and they had two children: Mariana and Robert. He is buried in the Carnduff, SK Cemetery.

Netta loved to garden, knit and play cards. They have three children: George, Blandina and Kathy.

Corporal Grace Mitchell was an RAF Wireless Operator stationed at Royal Air Force Detling Aerodrome in Kent, England when she met William "Bill" John Dixon in 1941. She later transferred to RAF Chicksands in Bedfordshire doing enemy interceptions. Grace talked about being on duty in her wireless hut and the bombs falling overhead. On one occasion, a bomb came through the roof of her hut but failed to detonate. Grace had to carry on with her duties while a disposal unit worked to defuse the bomb because, if she didn't, it would be considered desertion. An RAF doctor advised Grace and her colleagues to take up smoking to help steady their nerves so they all started to smoke. Grace and her crew were commended for intercepting some particular messages which led to the sinking of a German battleship, the Scharnhorst. Grace would visit Bill and Ian McLeod at the Canadian Military Hospital in Bassingstoke. When Grace eventually came to Canada in 1946, the student minister at the Macoun United Church was the same Ian McLeod she had visited at the Canadian Military Hospital. Bill and Grace were married on August 18, 1943 at St. Giles Church, Edinburg, Scotland. Two days later Bill left to join his unit



in Italy. Bill and Grace had a weekend together before Bill was demobilized back to Canada with the LAA Battery at the end of July 1945. Grace was given her travel papers and joined other Canadian war brides sailing on the Cunard White Star Liner Aquitania to Halifax, NS in May 1946. Bill and Grace farmed east of Macoun. They moved into the village in 1968 when Grace took over as Agent for the Ellsworth Telephone Co until they went over to dial in 1973. Bill and Grace had five children.

Mary was born in Glasgow, Scotland. She married Private Chester Charles Smith in Libberton near Biggar, Scotland in 1945. She departed Liverpool, England on board the S.S. Georgic on July 7, 1946 and arrived at Pier 2T in Halifax, Nova Scotia and took a train to Davidson, Saskatchewan and a truck to the farm, 15 miles away. On Sunday, July 21, 1946, there was not one person in view – not even a dog or cat. Her brother-in-law arrived in a Red International Truck, put trunks in back and drove 15 miles out in flat country to the farm in Smithburg (Lothian) and there were twenty people there. From 1946 to 1950, she stayed on the farm. The winter months were a very difficult time. From October to April, there was no driving truck or car. It was forty degrees below zero with loads of snow and travel was done by a team of horses in one large sleigh. They went to town "Davidson" for mail and the odd grocery and they heated bricks in the oven the night before and wrapped them in newspaper. They were covered in horse blankets which were placed on the horses when you got to town if the barn in town was full. She now lives in Red Deer, Alberta and celebrated her 90th birthday at the end of November. "The friendly people of Saskatchewan are priceless." She was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion in Carrot River, SK and is now a member of Legion Branch 35 in Red Deer, AB.





THOMSON (MILLER), Grace Pamela

Grace was born on December 1, 1913. She was raised in St Mary's Orphanage, Cheam, London, UK. She worked at Cane Hill Hospital, Coulsdon where she met her future husband, Joseph King Thomson, at a staff dance. They were married in St Andrews Church in Coulsdon, Surrey on October 19, 1941. Their daughter Sheila was born in 1942. Grace and Sheila came to Canada on June 10, 1946 on the Queen Mary and settled in St Walburg, SK after taking the train from Halifax. When Grace first arrived in St Walburg, she canned everything she could, thinking about the long, hard winters she had heard about (only to be surprised that the local OK Economy Store carried fresh produce even at 40 below). The family moved to Saskatoon in 1949 and she became involved in Girl Guides, teaching Sunday school and singing in the church choir. After Joe's passing, she moved to Grande Prairie, AB to be near Sheila. She acted in many plays, musicals, pantomimes as well as being a member of the War Brides Association, Life Member of Girl Guides, Grande Prairie Legion Branch 54, Ladies Auxiliary, hospital worker, Sunday school teacher, and church choir. Grace passed away on September 18, 2006.




