The Eagle Feather



You will find the Eagle Feather throughout the book. This feather is placed within the bio of a Veteran to indicate their Indigenous background. The Eagle feather is a special connection to the Creator. It represents strength, courage, freedom, honesty. As the eagle flies higher and sees better than any other bird, it brings perspective of all creation.

Many do not realize the contribution that the Indigenous people made to our country in the time of conflict. Early days and even today, Indigenous people have not necessarily been treated as equals. Yet, many of them participated within the military to defend our country without question putting aside their indifferences. The Muskeg Lake Veterans story is a prime example of this.


Community

First of all, we want you to know that at the Royal Canadian Legion, veterans are Canadian Armed and Allied Forces personnel and RCMP who have served and are serving.

Next, we want you to know that, by observing the Legion's three pillars—Veterans, Remembrance, Community—Saskatchewan Command, as the Saskatchewan arm of the Legion, is an active presence in communities across the province. But how, you ask? Well, read on, to discover how the head office in Regina works closely with its Executive Council, 171 branches around the province, and over 10,000 members to support Veterans, Remembrance and Community.

Veterans

Veterans requiring support of any kind can contact their local Legion branch in confidentiality which will put them in contact with a branch service officer. Veterans can also contact the Provincial Service Officer at 306-525-8739 or toll-free at 1-866-471-8387. Service officers conduct needs assessments and based on the results, develop a plan for the veteran to move forward which often includes a community and team effort of businesses, health professionals and other service organizations. A plan could include the service officer assisting the veteran to fill out paperwork from Veterans Affairs Canada, the service officer acquiring furniture for the veteran donated by local businesses, and the service officer connecting the veteran to health professionals.



Here are some of our programs that your donations go toward so that veterans receive the care, benefits and support that is the mandate of the Legion.

Leave the Streets Behind – for homeless and near-homeless veterans.

<u>Paws for Veterans</u> – matches service dogs to qualifying veterans suffering from operational stress injuries (OSIs) such as anxiety, depression and post-traumatic stress disorder. It also raises public awareness about service dogs and their presence in society.

<u>Discovering the Power in Me</u> – In partnership with Wounded Warriors Weekend Foundation and the Pacific Institute, Saskatchewan Command offers this seminar for Saskatchewan veterans and their families, offering tools to deal with operational stress injuries (OSIs).

<u>Wounded Warriors Weekend</u> – For veterans, reservists and first responders suffering from OSIs, and their families to engage in leisurely indoor and outdoor activities while at the same time receiving support from health professionals.

<u>OSI-CAN</u> (Operational Stress Injury Canada) – With support from the Canadian Mental Health Association and Saskatchewan Command, OSI-CAN offers a weekly or monthly support group in the communities of Regina, Weyburn, Saskatoon and Prince Albert to veterans, first responders and Correctional Service workers. It also offers access to equine therapy and service dogs.

<u>Funeral and Burial</u> – The Royal Canadian Legion delivers the Veterans Affairs Funeral and Burial Program which provides funeral, burial and grave marking benefits for eligible Canadian and Allied veterans. Its mission is to ensure that no veteran is denied a dignified funeral and burial as well as a military gravestone because of insufficient funds.

Remembrance

Poppy Campaign – The Royal Canadian Legion, since its inception in 1926, has become known for its annual organization of November 11th Remembrance Day services and events, held in many communities across Canada to honour veterans. Along with Remembrance Day is the poppy campaign, which always runs from the **last Friday in October through to Nov. 11** — this period marks the time when The Royal Canadian Legion distributes poppies and encourages the public to wear them as a reminder of the service given by our veterans.

Poster and Literary Contests – Every year, Legion branches offer local schools the opportunity for their students to submit entries in the form of a poster, poem or essay with veterans as the theme. The contests start at the branch level in October, with winning submissions moving up the Legion ladder until finally, 14 entries from students in Saskatchewan are sent to Dominion Command in Ottawa for judging.

At this highest level, the winning entries are displayed at the Canadian War Museum from July 1 to May 1 of the following year. For the poster contest, the second-place winners and any

Muskeg Lake Cree Nation has a long and rich cultural history. First established in 1881, the core reserve is still home to approximately 367 community members (MLCN Health Records, June 2011). 1,481 additional members live across Saskatchewan and Canada, yet they are still proud to call Muskeg Lake their home and community.

eyes opened to the ways of the world outside the reserve. This shift in perspective has forever changed the way we see ourselves as a community.

In the second half of the 20th century, two agreements—Asimakaniseekan Askiy in 1988 and the Treaty Land Entitlement (TLE) Trust in 1992—led to the growth of Muskeg Lake. These agreements generated a need for the community to reach outward to surrounding governments and municipalities and bring us into a process of community consultation, something which had never before happened. The TLE Trust led to the acquisition of urban and agricultural lands, which fostered economic development for the community through land leasing and entrepreneurial growth.

We Are Our History



Our veterans have played a significant role in the ways we have developed as a community. When community members enlisted for WWI, WWII, the Korean conflict and Peace-time service, they came back changed—not only by war, but by having their

Table of a Fallen Soldier

The tradition of setting a separate table in honour of our prisoners of war and missing comrades has been in place since the end of the Vietnam War. The manner in which this table is decorated is full of special symbols to help us remember our brothers and sisters in arms.

The Table of a Fallen Soldier is set in the hall or dining room, where guests can see it, but where it will not be in the way.

The table is smaller than the others

symbolizing the everlasting concern and remembrance for our fallen comrades.

The white tablecloth

draped evenly represents the purity of their motives while answering the call of duty.

The empty chair

representing the missing comrade.

The single place setting

represents your wish that the fallen men and women of the armed forces could be present at the happy occasion with you.

The white candle

representing the light of hope/light of life.

The single red rose

represents the blood shed/the families who love and keep faith with the men and women who serve.

The ribbou

represents loyally in waiting for those who are serving away from home, while a red ribbon symbolizes the memory of and search for those missing in action.

The slices of lemon

on the bread plate represent the bitter loss of the life of the fallen soldier.

The salt upon the bread plate represents the tears of their families.

The inverted wine glass


placed to the right of the plate, represents the fact that the fallen comrade will not be able to participate in the happy toasts at this event.




Hymm used by the 10th Can Battalian Aymm after Vinly Ridge at Their Hanksgiven Service May 13/18 Great God of nations, at Whose Will, Proud sceptred Empires wax and wane Defend our Empire's people still Unsheathe Thy sword for us again For liberty and right we stand O god arise stretch forth Thy hand. Great God of battle steel their heart, Who serve by land, and air and sea; With honour let them play their part, With duty let their service be, Gainst cruelty and wrong we fight, O God arise put forth Thy Night. O god of pity be Thou nigh, Where lurks the sunk death-dealing mine, Where blazing roof-trees flush the sky, In recking trench and shattered line , For Motherhood and King we fight, O God arise maintain the right. C God of mercy be our shield And hear our dear ones far away; For thum we stand on blood stained field, For us they wait at home and pray, To Thee we turn, to Thee we cry, O God lead on to Victory. Amen.

This poem was first recited at a Service, 13 May 1917, only three weeks after Vimy Ridge: 10th Battalion, First Canadian Division. This hymn was found in the personal possessions of Brigadier-General Danial Mowat Ormond. At this time he was still a Lieutenant-Colonel, 10 Battalion, CEF.

A museum quality replica was donated to Saskatchewan Command by Dr. Paul Kavanagh in an effort to provide the best opportunity for everyone to view it. The original copy of the hymn is held at the Canadian War Museum.



Forever Changed



Forever Changed is a book centered around the major, traumatic events in the life of Alamedaborn Ritchie Scott which led him to sign up for military duty when he was nineteen.

Ritchie's daughter, Cheri Helstrom, tells the story through Ritchie's eyes, using Ritchie's words, taking the reader from rural Saskatchewan to the north, to eastern Canada (Toronto), across the Atlantic to Britain, to the battlefields of Italy during the Second World War, to an English military hospital and, finally, home to Canada.

The resulting post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) had far-reaching effects physically, emotionally, and socially.

Forever Changed honours Ritchie's life and times and celebrates his accomplishments.

Cheri is a retired teacher who lives with her husband, Dave, on a farm near Gray, Saskatchewan.





ALLAN, John

WWII

John was born in 1915. He enlisted in the Air Force and served with the 434 Squadron during the Second World War. John was killed in action on October 5, 1943 and is buried in the Runnymede Memorial Cemetery.

ANDERSON, Carl

WWII


Carl was born in Wynyard, Saskatchewan in 1920. He enlisted in the Army on June 14, 1941 in Wynyard and was discharged on January 22, 1946. He served with the 15th Field Regiment and 110th Field Battery, Royal Canadian Artillery as a Gunner during the Second World War. He went into action two days after Dieppe. He was laying line for signals and went through France, Belgium, ended in Holland freeing the Dutch people from the Germans. He was very thankful he never had to fire his rifle to kill anyone. Carl's brother, William Gudmundur, joined up the day after Carl. They were together until Gudmundur died from T.B. in England in 1943. It was very hard on Carl. The family visited his grave in Brookwood Cemetery in 1977. It has row upon row of white crosses and is well kept. He was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion in Wynyard, Carrot River, Smoky Burn, Langham, Wawota and Saskatoon. Carl passed away in 2003.



ANDERSON, Gisella "Pearl"

wwii

Pearl, granddaughter of Burpee and Mary Anderson of Silton, SK, and daughter of Thomas Anderson, was born at Ninette, Manitoba on December 26, 1923, and, with her brother, James Hunter Anderson, was raised on her parents' farm near Gibbs, SK. She enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force (Women's Division) in 1941 and served in administrative roles at various postings across Canada throughout the war, attaining the rank of Corporal. Following the war, Pearl received her nursing degree, and then married Earl Boal on December 18, 1948. Pearl worked as a home care nurse until illness overcame her. She died of cancer at age 62 in 1986 in Brampton, ON.







ANDERSON, James Alexander "Jim"

WWII

James, the youngest son of Burpee and Mary Anderson, who had homesteaded in 1885 in Longlaketon community, District of Assiniboia, NWT, two miles north of the future village of Silton, SK. He was born on August 3, 1904 in the house on the Anderson farm. At outbreak of war in Europe in 1939, he joined the Royal Canadian Air Force police. Stationed at Manning Depot in Toronto until 1943, he was then posted to the Air Force Police section at Royal Canadian Air Force Station MacDonald at MacDonald, MB, then posted in command of the Air Force Police section at the No. 23 Elementary Flying Training School at Davidson, SK. Jim was discharged in 1945 and returned, with his family, to the Anderson farm, where he remained until his death on September 14, 1985.

ANDERSON, James Hunter "Young Jim"


WWII

James, grandson of Burpee and Mary Anderson of Silton, SK, and son of Thomas Anderson, was born at Cymric, SK, on November 25, 1921, where his father was a grain elevator agent, and then raised on his parents' farm near Gibbs, SK. When war began in 1939, he enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force and trained as an aircraft navigator. As navigator and weapons control officer aboard Mosquito fighter-bombers with Royal Canadian Air Force No. 415 Squadron, he engaged in many battles over Great Britain, France, Gibraltar, Sardinia, Malta and Germany, earning the War Medal with Clasp, France and Germany Star, Italy Star, Defence Medal, 1939-1945 Star, and Canadian Volunteer Service Medal. After the war, James became an engineer in advanced electronics. He passed away on February 11, 2009 in Burnaby, BC.



ANDERSON, Newton Joseph NORTH-WEST REBELLION

Newton was born in Kent County, New Brunswick in 1863. He and his father, Thomas Edward Anderson, went west to the village of Regina, homesteading in the community of Longlaketon, District of Assiniboia, NWT, in 1884. Thomas homesteaded two and one half miles north of the future village of Silton, SK, and Newton located two and one half miles north of Thomas. When the federal government requested civilian volunteers to assist General Middleton's troops in stopping the Metis insurrection, Newton left his homestead and travelled to the village of Saskatoon in April 1885. He joined the militia unit at the Copland homestead encampment grounds, which was then sent as reinforcement for the Battle of Batoche. Once hostilities ceased, Newton returned to his homestead in July 1885. He passed away in 1943.

ANDERSON, Renwick William Hunter "Rennie" WWI

Renwick was born on June 11, 1893 in a log and mud house, the eldest son of Burpee and Mary Anderson, who homesteaded in 1885 in Longlaketon community, District of Assiniboia, NWT, two miles north of the future village of Silton, SK. At outbreak of war in Europe, he left university studies in Saskatoon at Christmas of 1914, and enlisted in the Army with the 46th Battalion on February 2, 1915. He was shipped to England for training on Salisbury Plain; he was then transferred to the 10th Battalion in late 1915 and sent to the front in France. While leading his platoon in crossing Canal du Nord for the assault on Cambrai, he was shot to death by a sniper on September 27, 1918. Renwick is buried at Haynecourt, France.

ANDERSON, Thomas Edward "Tom"

WWI

Thomas, the second eldest son of Burpee and Mary Anderson, who homesteaded in 1885 in Longlaketon community, District of Assiniboia, NWT, two miles north of the future village of Silton, SK, was born on December 10, 1894 in the sod house of his grandparents, who homesteaded in Llewellyn community, six miles northeast of the village of Saskatoon, District of Saskatchewan, NWT. Thomas enlisted in the Army with the 46th Battalion in early 1917; however, the development of a hernia prevented him from being posted overseas. He was retained on active duty, posted to the Home Guard, with duties including guarding war prisoners, and promoted to Corporal in early 1918. Thomas died on May 22, 1972 in Pointe Claire, Quebec, from complications from Type I Diabetes.





ANDERSON, William Gudmundur

WWII

William was born in Wynyard, Saskatchewan in 1915. He enlisted in the Army the day after his brother Carl. He served with the 110th Field Battery, Royal Canadian Artillery. Gunner in the United Kingdom during the Second World War. They were in the same unit until his death from T.B. in England in 1943. He is buried in Brookwood Military Cemetery in Surrey, England. There is a lake named for him – Anderson Lake.

BACON, Dan




Dan was born in England and moved to Canada from England shortly after the First World War. He enlisted and served for Canada during the 1914 to 1918 conflict. He settled in Frobisher but never acquired property of his own. Dan laboured at whatever was available. He lived in the village in whatever quarters were available. Dan worked for the town shovelling snow, opening culverts and making drains in the springtime. He lit gas lamps at the rink, ran the curfew bell every night and pumped the old organ pump organ every Sunday as well for choir practice. He was the town handyman and official gravedigger. He remained a bachelor. When he was unable to work any longer, he spent his remaining days in the St. Anthony Home in Moose Jaw where he was also buried.

BALLS, William Henry

WWI

William was born on January 15, 1873 in Norwich, England. He served in the English Army for thirteen years with the 12th Suffolk Regiment. He farmed in Estevan, SK. He enlisted in the Army on November 23, 1915 and served with the 2nd Infantry Brigade and 5th Battalion and reached the rank of Sergeant during the First World War. He was killed in action at Vimy Ridge on April 9, 1917 and is buried at Nine Elms Military Cemetery in Thelus, France. He was awarded the Memorial Cross and the Plaque and Scroll.





BARDEN, Gerald

WWII

Gerald served in the Second World War with the Royal Canadian Air Force. He lived in Prince Albert, Saskatchewan.





BELL, Elmer John


WWI

Elmer was born in Harriston, Ontario on August 29, 1889. He was living in Disley, SK and working as a barber before enlisting in the Army. He travelled to Regina to enlist on January 6, 1916. In July 1916 he received a bullet wound to the left thigh. The round was removed with no complications. He was killed two years later at Le Quesnoy, France on August 10, 1918. He is buried at Bouchoir New British Cemetery in Somme, France. He served with the 68th Battalion, 1st O.M.R, 19th Res. Battalion and 1st C.M.R during the First World War.

BELLISLE, Arthur Edward

WWII

Arthur was born in Bismark, North Dakota, USA in 1915. He enlisted in the Army and served with the 8th Reconnaissance (8 Recce) Regiment (14th Canadian Hussars) - 2nd Division in Canada, England and possibly France during the Second World War. He was awarded the Defence Medal, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Bar and War Medal 1939-1945. He was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion. Arthur passed away in 1979.





BERRY, George H.

wwi

George was born in 1890. He enlisted in the Army and served as a Corporal with the 5th Battalion. George passed away in 1976 and is buried in Regina Beach Cemetery.



WWI

Adolf was born in November 1895 in Ukraine, Russia. He fought in the First World War in Russia. In 1924, he married Meta and lived there for four years. In 1928, they moved to Canada from Ukraine, Russia and arrived in Frobisher in the month of May. When they arrived, they could speak very little English but picked it up fairly quickly. He moved to a farm south of Alameda with Adolf's brother Henry and while there, twin girls were born though one died at birth. They moved back to a farm south of Frobisher and their son Henry was born. The children attended South Frobisher School. The land was very stony so they decided to move and spend 25 happy years in their home with their family. Adolf passed away in 1983.

BINDER, Anthony

WWI

Anthony was born in 1886 in Biled, Hungary to Nicholas and Kristina Binder. He enlisted in the Army and served with the 10th Battalion, Canadian Engineers in the First World War. During operations on September 7, he was eating supper with the other men of his section around a wagon. The area was being shelled by enemy and a high explosive shell hit the wagon, severely wounding Driver Anthony Binder in the head, right arm and lung. He was immediately evacuated to a Field Ambulance and later to No. 4 Casualty Clearing Station but succumbed to his wounds the following day, September 8, 1918 at 31 years of age. Anthony is buried in the Duisans British Cemetery.





BINKS, Mark

WWI

Mark was born in Hunslet, Leeds, Yorkshire, England on April 1, 1880. He enlisted in the Army on February 29, 1916 in Estevan, Saskatchewan. He served with the 28th Battalion CEF in France during the First World War. Mark was killed in action on May 6, 1917. Mark lived in Frobisher prior to service.





WWI


Reginald was born in Broadstairs, England on July 25, 1886. When he enlisted in the Army he was farming as well as serving as a Lt, with the 16th Light Horse. He signed his papers on December 27, 1915 in Regina. On September 19, 1916 he was wounded when shrapnel hit his right hand causing him to lose his index finger. In October 1917 he was made Captain. He earned the Military Cross when he took command of a captured enemy line and organized the consolidation of the position while for 36 hours moving under fire assisting his men and ensuring the wounded were taken care of. On August 29, 1918 he died of wounds he received. After his death he was awarded the rank of Major as well as Distinguished Service Order. He is buried at Aubigny Communal Cemetery Extension in Aubigny-en-Artois, France.

BOAL, Earl William

wwii

Earl was born in Ceylon, SK, on January 25, 1921 to Roy and Etta Boal and raised in Regina, SK, by his Aunt, Rebecca Enid Taylor. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1940, volunteering for "special work", and was trained as navigator and weapons control officer aboard Mosquito fighter-bombers with Royal Canadian Air Force No. 418 Squadron, where he excelled in "night fighter" operations against enemy aircraft, airfields, and munition trains across Europe, earning the Distinguished Flying Cross with Bar, War Medal 1939-1945, Europe Star, 1939-1945 Star, Defence Medal, Air Crew Medal, and Canadian Volunteer Service Medal. Earl became an engineer after the war and, in 1948; he married Pearl Anderson, sister of James Hunter Anderson. He died in Toronto, ON, on June 13, 2010.





BOGARD, John


John served with the Navy on HMCS Athabascan during the Korean War. He lived in Prince Albert, Saskatchewan.

Corporal Bogard was held at Sham Shui Po and North Point POW Camps. The entire unit he served with was captured and destroyed during the Battle of Hong Kong.

BOUSCHARD, Alfred Dale "Ted"

WWII

Alfred was born on September 9, 1920 in Speers, Saskatchewan. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force on March 9, 1942 and was honourable discharged on August 31, 1945 with the rank of Flight Lieutenant. He was a Rear Gunner on Lancaster Aircraft and later an instructor. He served in Canada, England, the Mediterranean, France and Germany with The Pathfinder Squadron. He made 45 operational flights and was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross and five additional war medals: the 1939-1945 Star, Air Force Crew Europe Star, Defence Medal, 1939-1945 Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and the George IV Medal. He was a member of Drayton Valley Legion Branch 269. Alfred passed away on December 24, 2016.






BOWER (KISZKAN), John William "Johnny"

BRACY, Maurice





BRADLEY, John Edward


WWII

John Edward was born on June 5, 1921 in Lashburn, Saskatchewan. He enlisted in the Air Force on December 30, 1940 in Saskatoon. He listed his occupation as a Store Clerk in Richard, SK. He served with the No. 12 Squadron during the Second World War. At the time he died, January 9, 1943, he was Warrant Officer 2 on a Lancaster aircraft as an air gunner. He is commemorated on the Runnymede Memorial west of London, England.

BRADLEY, John Frank

John was born in London, England on November 18, 1888. He enlisted in the Army in Regina on August 12, 1914 and was sent directly to Valcartier, Quebec to be sworn in on September 18, 1914. He served with the 16th Light Horse, 5th BN, 2nd Infantry Brig and the Machine Gun Corps during the First World War. John was discharged on January 30, 1915 upon appointment to another army.





BRADLEY, John Percy

WWI

John was born in Leicester, England on August 31, 1893. He worked as a bank clerk in Kipling, Saskatchewan where he enlisted in the Army on March 27, 1916. On December 3, 1916 he was promoted to Lance Corporal. He served with the 44th Battalion during the First World War. He succumbed to his wounds he received on June 26, 1917 in France. He is buried at Barlin Communal Cemetery near Bethune, France.









BRADRIDGE, Albert George Henry KOREAN WAR

Albert was born on October 8, 1930 in Souris, Manitoba. He served as Craftsman in Korea with the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry of the Canadian Army from October 26, 1950 to September 19, 1951. He was educated in Ontario. After leaving Sunnybrook Hospital he joined the Ontario Provincial Police. He went on to become a master plumber and pipefitter, bred and showed cattle and horses. His passions were racing homing pigeons, fishing, hockey and wrestling. He married Doreen Orser and they raised two sons and four daughters. He was a Legion Member of Branch 43 in Prince George, British Columbia for 37 years, Alameda Legion Branch 267 for six years, and moved to Saskatchewan in 2009. Battling diabetes, heart failure, TA Strokes, dialysis and leg amputation, he passed away on July 27, 2015. Albert's ashes are buried at Alameda Cemetery.

BRANDON (PENROSE), Doreen

WWII

Doreen was born on August 25, 1924 to Charles and Margaret Anna Mackenzie in Aberdeen, Scotland. She has three sisters. When she was seventeen and a half years old, she volunteered to join the Royal Canadian Air Force on December 2 and served as a hairdresser for three and a half years. She met and married Ross Brandon while in the service on May 5, 1945. Ross left to return to Frobisher in 1945 and Doreen followed on her own in March 1946, a city girl to a strange country and to farm life. Doreen boarded the Ile De France Ship bound for Halifax, then by train to Brandon where Ross met her and together they drove to the homestead in Frobisher. Ross and Doreen had two sons, Bill and Dennis. Doreen is now ninety years old and resides in a Regina care home. She is a 69-year member of the Legion Branch 343 in Frobisher. Doreen also taught dance with the Highlanders.



BRANDON, Ross

WWII

Ross Brandon's father, William Lorne Brandon, left the northern part of Huron County in Ontario and went west on the Harvester Excursion in 1901, got his homestead, built a sod shack, broke the prairie soil and planted wheat on it. He accumulated enough money to go back to Winghame to bring Jessie Cole out west as his bride in 1905. To this union, Lorne, Albert, Margaret and Ross were born. Ross, the youngest, was born on July 22, 1919 in Frobisher, SK. He went to Vineberg School then went through the Youth Training Program in Regina. Ross joined the Air Force in 1941. He spent three years overseas and while there he met and married Doreen Penrose in 1945 in Aberdeen, Scotland. Upon his discharge he was a Corporal. Ross returned home in 1945 to take over the farm from his dad. Doreen followed him in 1946. They had two sons, Bill and Dennis. Ross and Doreen retired at Arcola, SK. Ross passed away on April 5, 2002 and is buried in the Arcola Cemetery. He was a member of Frobisher Legion Branch 143.

WWI

Alexander served with the 5th Battalion in the First World War. During the attack made by his Battalion on Vimy Ridge on the morning of April 9, 1917, Private Alexander Brick was wounded in the stomach. He was evacuated to No. 13 General Hospital in Boulogne. He succumbed to his wounds a few days later, on April 12, 1917. He is buried in Boulogne Easter Cemetery in France.

BRIERE, Arthur Alexander

Arthur was born in Meyronne on October 24, 1916. He served in the Canadian Forces during his life and reached the rank of Corporal. He worked as a carpenter otherwise. Arthur passed away on September 30, 1976 and is buried at the Regina Beach Cemetery.



BROWN, David Barclay

WWI

David was born in Orangeville, Ontario on May 13, 1895. He enlisted in the Army in Regina on December 19, 1914 and listed his occupation as farmer. He served with the 3rd Battalion during the First World War. Private Brown was part of a bombing party whom held their trenches from 04:00 until 15:00 on October 8, 1916. He was one of the two men that were the last to leave the trench. Unfortunately he was struck with a round upon retreat, killing him in Courcelette, France. He was recommended for a Victoria Cross and is commemorated on the Vimy Ridge Memorial.

BROWN, David Oscar

WWII

David was born in Rose Plain, Saskatchewan on July 19, 1914. He was working as a teacher in Regina. He enlisted in the Air Force on May 15, 1942. He was a Flying Officer on a Lancaster aircraft as a navigator. He served with the No 514 Squadron during the Second World War. He was killed in action on July 21, 1944. He is buried at Hunsel Roman Catholic Churchyard in Limburg, Netherlands.

BROWNFIELD, Oscar David

wwii

Oscar was born in Big River, Saskatchewan on September 6, 1912. Aircraftman First Class Brownfield enlisted in the Air Force in Saskatoon during the Second World War. He died on June 10, 1940 on the same Hudson flight as National Defence Minister Norman Rogers. The plane went down at Newcastle, Ontario. Only four men were on the flight. He is buried in his hometown of Big River, SK.



BUCHANAN, Harry Edward

wwi

Harry was born on August 30, 1894 to Archibald and Barbara Louise (McLiesh) in Walhalla, North Dakota. On June 6, 1901 his parents, Harry and sister Daisy arrived in Alameda in Cateville to find the ground white with snow. Their belongings consisted of furniture, two horses, a cow, a walking plow, a six-foot disc and some harrows. Fire was only one of the drawbacks in the early years. There was also hail, frost and one year an early snowstorm. More siblings were born, Bertrand, Marjorie, Inez and Lyla. School was a problem for a while. Harry went to school in Rockland for a time but in 1908, Cateville School was opened. He enlisted in June 1916 in the 152nd Battalion and went in training at Camp Hughes now Shilo. He had a short harvest leave and when it was over was posted overseas. After some time in the lines with the Infantry, he was transferred to the Engineers and ran a gasoline engine on a narrow gauge railway bringing in ammunitions and supplies. He served in this department until the end of the war. He was gassed and hospitalized for a time. Harry was discharged in April 1919. He returned home in the spring and started farming again. Harry married Gertrude Hatchard in 1922 and they had two children, Evelyn and Ronald. Harry and Gertrude parted and Harry married Evelyn Jackson and they bought a farm in the Mayflower district. Harry passed away on May 1952 at the age of 58 and is buried in Alameda Cemetery.

Cyril was born in Essex, England on June 21, 1895. Working as a Drug Clerk in Lumsden, Saskatchewan, he enlisted in the Army in Regina on July 13, 1915. He served with the 10th Royal Fusiliers and 5th Battalion during the First World War. In December 1915, he was appointed Sgt. He lost his life at Arleux-en-Gohelle, France on April 28, 1917 and is commemorated on the Vimy Memorial.

BURNESS, David

WWII

David was born in Alameda, Saskatchewan on March 30, 1915 to James and Margaret (Munro), who died four days after David's birth. He spent his childhood and early adult years in Alameda. After graduating, he decided to become a teacher and attended Regina Normal School. He was a teacher at several of the country schools in the district and also helped at Church Vacation School. David was a veteran of the Second World War and served overseas as a clerk in the supply depot. He married Ema Robstad on July 1, 1948 in his hometown. He later taught school at Outlook, Estevan. WWII


James, known to all as Jimmie, was born on August 18, 1876 in West Cairnbeg, Fordoun, Scotland to George and Jessie (Neilson) and moved to Canada in 1897. He homesteaded in the community north of Frobisher now the Munro School District. He conducted a coal business for many years, was an agent for Imperial Oil Ltd. with a modern service station. In 1912, he left that area and went to Alameda. One year later he moved to farm along the Souris River. He married Margaret Munro in 1897 but she passed away in 1915. To this union was born George, Jessie, Margaret, Jemima (Mimie), Elma, Mae, William (Bill), Florence (Tootie), and David. After serving in the Second World War, Jimmie made a Trans-Atlantic flight back to Scotland, the land of his birth. Jimmie passed away on November 18, 1950 in Alameda and is buried there.

BURNETT, John William

John was born on November 8, 1885. Before enlisting in the Army in Winnipeg, he worked for a butcher in Lumsden, SK. He served with the 43rd Battalion during the First World War. He died of pneumonia on April 9, 1915 and is buried at Elmwood Cemetery in Winnipeg.

Ivan was born in Lumsden, Saskatchewan on July 31, 1896. He was a student when he enlisted in the Army in Lumsden on December 6, 1915. On November 7, 1916 he was appointed to Lance Corporal. He served with the 5th Battalion during the First World War. Ivan gave his life at Arleux-en-Gohelle on April 28, 1917 and is buried at Orchard Dump Cemetery in Arleux-en-Gohelle, France.

WWI

John was born in Keighley, Yorkshire, England on May 6, 1887. He enlisted with the Army in Regina, Saskatchewan on August 24, 1915. He served with the 3rd Canadian Pioneers, the 53rd Battalion, 16th P.F.A. and 1 A.S.C. during First World War. He was killed in a gas attack near Saint-Julien on May 24, 1916. Prior to enlisting he was a storekeeper and had served six years in the Military in varying roles. He was buried as a Private at Menin Road South Military Cemetery in West-Vlaanderen, Belgium.

BUTTERFIELD, John D.

wwi

John was born in Willingham, Lincolnshire, England on April 19, 1890. Prior to enlisting in the Army he was a farmer. He enlisted in Regina, Saskatchewan on January 5, 1915. He served with the Fort Garry Horse/Canadian Reserve Cavalry Regiment during the First World War. On August 11, 1918 he was injured from a round to the left leg; this caused a fractured fibula and tibia. He had reached the rank of Lt. on June 1, 1917. After being injured he was transferred back to Canada with the CRC Regiment. He was then released and given land to Homestead.





BYERS, Everett

wwii

Everett was born in Frobisher. He took his schooling there and farmed in this district until he took up a homestead at Minton, Saskatchewan. He later moved to Broomhead and then to Lintlaw, SK. Everett was a veteran of the Second World War, serving overseas in the Army. He now resides at Bonanza, Alberta.



BYERS, William "Bill"

WWI

William Henry Greer Byers was born on October 8, 1896 to Robert John Byers and Gertrude Lillian Elizabeth Ward in Millbrooke, Ontario. He moved to Frobisher with his parents and brother John in 1898 and got his schooling there. He worked out and farmed there for a number of years before going to take up a homestead in Minton, SK. Bill was overseas in the Army in 1918 to 1919 during the First World War. He married his first wife, Myrtle Typheau Johnston on September 8, 1924 in Ontario. In 1935, he married his second wife, a widow Mrs. Agnes Hamilton of Minton, who had two daughters and they retired to Weyburn. Bill passed away on August 29, 1965 at the age of 65.

CAIRNS, Albert

wwi

Albert is born in Ashington, England on January 28, 1895. He was working as a grocer in Saskatoon. He enlisted in the Army on August 11, 1915 having served one year with the British Army previously. On November 5, 1917 he received a wound to his right arm. He returned to duty on January 2, 1918. On September 22, 1917 he was promoted to Corporal. He served with the 105th Fusiliers and the 46th Battalion during the First World War. On September 10, 1918 he died from wounds in France and is buried at Terlincthun British Cemetery near Boulogne, France.

CAIRNS, Hugh

WWI

Hugh was born on December 4, 1896 in Ashington, England. He enlisted in the Army at the age of eighteen in Saskatoon on August 2, 1915. He served with the 46th Battalion during the First World War. He had been working at the time as a plumber. Making his way through the ranks, he was promoted to Sergeant on October 1, 1918. In August 1917 he was awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal when covering the flank of an attacking Battalion. He had repelled three enemy attacks, covered the retreat and although wounded he did not retreat himself until he ran out of ammunition. He was also posthumously awarded the Victoria Cross and the French Legion of Honour. These were awarded when he single handed rushed a machine gun crew, capturing the gun. He then later rushed forward again this time capturing eighteen men and two guns. Again when the advance was halted he led a party to outflank an enemy position, forcing around fifty men to surrender. After he went with a patrol and captured another sixty men. Being severely wounded though he was eventually rushed, holding his ground he eventually collapsed from wounds he later died from on November 2, 1918 in Valenciennes, France. He is buried at Auberchicourt British Cemetery in France.









CAMPBELL, Alexander



Alexander was born on October 22, 1896 in Dutton, Ontario. He enlisted in August 23, 1918 in Regina and served in the First World War. Alexander lived in Rosetown, Saskatchewan.

He enlisted in the Army on September 23, 1914 in Valcartier and served with the 5th Battalion of the Saskatchewan Regiment during the First World War. WWI

John was born on April 11, 1877 in Wick, Scotland. Before enlisting in the Canadian Army on February 12, 1917 in Regina, Saskatchewan, he worked as a teamster and lived in Bethune, SK. He also served previously in England for eight years with colours and four years reserve. He served with the Cameron Highlanders (UK) and the 28th Battalion (Canada) in South Africa, China, Gibraltar and India during the First World War. He was killed in action near Vimy in France on June 26, 1918. He was buried as a Private at Bellacourt Military Cemetery near Arras, France.

Roger was born in Swinford, England on June 3, 1890. He enlisted in the British Army in 1904 at the age of fourteen. He served in India, Afghanistan and Pakistan under Lord Kitchener in the Second Boer War from 1904 to his discharge in 1911. He immigrated to Canada in 1914 and was a homesteader in Saskatchewan. He worked many jobs and lived in many towns. He and his Irish wife raised four children. He was a longtime Legion member of Simpson and Melville Branches. Roger passed away on May 28, 1980 in his nineteenth year in Melville, SK.

CHAPLIN, Charles Montague

WWI

Charles was born in Leystone, England on June 25, 1882. Working as an Agent and being with an active militia (1st Suffolk & Harwich Royal Garrison Artillery), he enlisted in the Army in Lumsden on November 19, 1915. Serving with Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry, he was given commission to 2LT with the British Army on June 27, 1917. He was killed in action on September 26, 1917 and is commemorated on the Tyne Cot Memorial near Ypres, Belgium.





CHING, Duncan

WWI

Duncan was born on March 4, 1897 in Huron, Ontario to William Ching and Charlotte McCallum. His siblings were William Jr., Florence, Albert and Clarence. The family moved midway between Alameda and Frobisher in 1904. After serving in the Canadian Army during the First World War, Duncan and his wife, Verna Billington from Hirsch, farmed on land adjacent to the Mayflower School until they moved to Alberta in the late 1930s. They returned to Saskatchewan in 1977 and resided in Creighton Lodge in Estevan. Duncan passed away on May 16, 1979. Both Duncan and Verna are buried in Estevan.





2018: 100 Years after the Armistice




In November of 2018, the Provincial Archives of Saskatchewan and the Provincial Capital Commission will premiere the final video in a five-part series honouring Saskatchewan's involvement in the First World War.

Each year beginning in 2014, one video from the series "From the Prairies to the Trenches" has been released commemorating the 100th Anniversary of the First World War (1914 – 1918).

The fifth video, entitled "The German Spring Offensive, The Hundred Days Offensive, Armistice and Aftermath (January 1918 – January 1920)", explores the climactic final campaigns, the November 11th Armistice, and the return home of Saskatchewan's soldiers.

The first four segments can be seen on the Provincial Archives of Saskatchewan YouTube channel, at the Saskatchewan Legislative Building, and at Government House in Regina. The fifth video will be released for public viewing in time for Remembrance Day on November 11, 2018.

The development of this five-part video series was made possible thanks in part to the Government of Canada.











CHRESTENSEN, Aksel Nicholas

WWII

Aksel was born in Denmark in 1911 and was living in Loreburn, Saskatchewan when he enlisted in the Canadian Army in Regina on December 29, 1943. He served as a Sapper with the Royal Canadian Engineers during the Second World War and was stationed at Vedder Crossing, British Columbia and Hamilton, ON before being discharged in 1946. He returned to Loreburn and reopened the garage he had closed up for the duration of his service. He later became administrator of the village. He was a member of Loreburn/Elbow Legion Branch 251. Aksel passed away in 2003.

CLINE, Peter James

WWII

Peter was born in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan in 1919. Peter grew up on the family farm in Zelma, SK. After graduating from the University of Saskatchewan in April 1941 with a diploma in Agriculture, he joined the Royal Canadian Air Force during the Second World War. He arrived in England around Christmas time in 1941. He was stationed first in Ireland and then in Scotland with the Royal Canadian Air Force Radar Squadron. In 1942, when the Royal Air Force asked for volunteers to go to the Middle East, Peter volunteered. Because the Suez Canal was occupied by the Germans, the troop ship they were on had to go all the way around the west coast and up the east coast of Africa to get to Egypt, a journey of two months. Peter spent a total of two years in Africa. Most of that time he was stationed in South Africa where he worked as a radar technician on planes patrolling up and down the coast looking for German U-boats. Following his return to Britain in August 1944, Peter met a young Scottish soldier named Margaret Bell. They were married in February 1945. He was stationed in Iceland for the remainder of the war, returning home to Canada in September 1945. He was an active member of The Royal Canadian Legion Young-Zelma Branch 358 and in 2006 was awarded Lifetime Membership. Peter passed away in 2013.






COLES, Harmon Leigh



WWII

Ken was born on April 29, 1917 on the family farm north of Frobisher the sixth child of Alex and Annie. He took his schooling at Munro and attended Hemphill Engine School in Vancouver, BC and completed his course. When the Second World War broke out in 1939. Ken joined the Air Force and went overseas as a Flight Engineer. On May 1, 1942, he joined the 405 Bomber Squadron and went on a bombing mission with the Pathfinder Force on May 23, 1943 over Essen, Germany. The crew had to bail out while returning from Essen, close to the border of Holland. Two of the crew are buried there. He was taken prisoner for two years in German Prisoner of War camps making silver rings from the foil paper from cigarettes. They melted the silver paper and molded it into rings and brought them home as gifts. He was released on May 2, 1945 and was honourably discharged in September 1945 with the rank of Pilot Officer. On his return home, he married Melba in July 1945 and they had four children, Rennie Ann, Jean, Kenneth and Duane. Ken had always been an active member of The Royal Canadian Legion as chartered president in 1966 to 1967 in the Alameda Branch. He served as Zone 2 Commander for five years then as Dist Commander. Ken passed away on November 11, 1987. He had been scheduled to do the address at the Remembrance Day Service.

CRAIG, Charles

wwi

Charles was born in Scotland on March 24, 1893. After receiving his education, he worked as a trade iron moulder. He served in the First World War. In 1923, he moved to Canada and lived in Hamilton, Ontario for one year. In 1924, he went west to Frobisher and worked as a farm hand for several years before he started a farm for himself. He sold his farm and retired in 1963. Charles was a Life Member of the Frobisher Legion Branch and a member of the Masonic Lodge. In 1967, he moved to Estevan and married Florence Taylor of Estevan. Charles passed away on August 1, 1973.



CREAMER, Ernest Cecil

WWII

Ernest was born in Southey, Saskatchewan in 1922. He enlisted in the Navy and served on HMCS Unicorn in Canada, England and on the High Seas during the Second World War. When he returned from the war, he married Pauline Eleanor Shaffer in their hometown of Semans, SK. They later moved to Regina, SK where Cecil joined the Regina Police Force for a couple of years and then was employed with Esso for 41 years until his death. They went on to have three children: Garry, Cherlyn and Rodger. Cecil and Pauline were dedicated to their church life in Regina and Sherwood Park, Alberta when his work relocated him there in 1973 to the Esso Strathcona Refinery. Cecil also became quite an accomplished carpenter. He never spoke of the war with his children, but he did, when time allowed, watch war documentaries on TV and read books whenever possible. He was a member of Semans Legion Branch 108 for forty years. Cecil passed away in 1987.

CURISTON, Charles Roland

WWI

Charles was born in Manitou, Manitoba on December 20, 1891 and moved to Saskatchewan in 1905. He left his job as a chemist in Woburn, Massachusetts to enlist in the 236th Overseas Battalion, CEF in Fredericton, New Brunswick on September 8, 1917 during the First World War. His older brothers, William John and Samuel Edward had already been killed in action in 1915 and 1916, respectively. Charles joined the 72nd Battalion, Canadian Infantry, British Columbia Regiment and suffered a severe head wound from a sniper's bullet on September 27, 1918 near Cambrai, France. Charles was invalided to Canada in April 1919 and discharged on May 29, 1919 at Kingston, ON. He returned to the School of Pharmacy at the University of Saskatchewan from 1919 to 1920. Charles passed away in Woodrow, SK on May 5, 1921.

CURISTON, Samuel Edward

WWI


Samuel was born on March 10, 1882. He lived in Manitoba and moved to Saskatchewan to homestead in 1905. Samuel enlisted with the 45th Overseas Battalion, CEF, at Portage La Prairie, Manitoba on March 27, 1915 during the First World War. Samuel transferred to the 28th Battalion in France on May 7, 1916 and was reported missing in action on June 6, 1916 at Sanctuary Wood. He was later declared dead and his name is listed on the Menin Gate Memorial in Ypres, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium. Samuel's older brother William John died at the Battle of Festubert on May 8, 1915 and his younger brother Charles Roland was wounded at Cambrai on September 27, 1918.



DALLIN, Raymond

WWII

Raymond was born in 1918. His parents Frederick Thomas and Florence Dallin left Bristol, England in July 1906 with two daughters and one newborn son on the ship Victoria or Victorian and landed at Montreal in August 1906 then proceeded to Frobisher to settle. Six children were born in Frobisher, four girls and two boys, Raymond and Walter making nine living children. Three boys were buried in England as babies. Raymond served in the Air Force in the Second World War and was taken a prisoner of war during his services. After the war, he went through for a Diesel Engineer and is still in the C.N.R. office in Edmonton.











DALLIN, Walter

WWII


Walter was the youngest of the Dallin family living in Frobisher in a large ten room house built by his father, Frederick. He took his education in Frobisher. He was in the Navy in the Second World War. After the war, Walter worked for a bank in Victoria. He married Alma Hannah of Frobisher. They had four children, Sandra, Lynn, Jim and Debbie. Alma passed away in April 1988. Walter married Elsa Campbell formerly of Hirach. They resided in Victoria. Walter passed away in 2010.

WWII




DRIPPS, Matt WWI

DUNBAR, Robert Glass


WWI

Robert was born in Edinburgh, Scotland on December 29, 1872. He enlisted in the Army in Lumsden on November 1, 1915 where he was working as an Insurance Agent. He was sent to the 5th Battalion from the 68th. On September 10, 1916, he suffered shell shock when he was buried alive. He was then killed at Thiepval Ridge on September 26, 1916 and is commemorated on the Vimy Memorial.













EDWARDS, James Francis "Stocky"

WWII

Stocky was born on June 5, 1921 in Nokomis, Saskatchewan. He served in the Air Force from 1940 to 1972. He had an impressive military career. He served with the 94 Squadron, 260 Squadron, 417 Squadron, 92 Squadron and 274 Squadron. During the Second World War, he made a name as one of Canada's best aces. While flying in Europe and the North African Campaign he was credited with nineteen victories, two shared, six and a half probable, seventeen damaged and twelve destroyed ground units. It is said in all reality that it is much higher by those that flew with him. He has flown many different aircraft including a R40, Spitfire XVI and Sabres. After the war he stayed with the Canadian Forces making his way to Lt. Col. Helping to train new pilots. In 1983 a book called "Kittyhawk pilot: Wing Commander J.F. (Stocky) Edwards" was published about his wartime experiences. His decoration include: Distinguished Flying Medal, Distinguished Flying Cross, Canadian Forces Decoration and two Clasps, Order of Canada, Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal and Canada Aviation Hall of Fame.

EDWARDS, William James "Jim"

WWII

Jim was born on March 4, 1924 on the family farm near LeBret, Saskatchewan. He enlisted in the Army at Regina, SK on June 1, 1942 and served with the 83rd Company Tank Brigade in Europe and Italy until the end of the Second World War. Upon returning home, Jim joined The Royal Canadian Legion and remained a member there for 65 years. He married in 1953 and farmed in LeBret until hail forced him to find employment elsewhere. Jim worked for the Department of Highways at Fort Qu'Appelle and Assiniboia. In 1972, they moved to Calgary where Jim worked building roof trusses. When he retired they moved back to Moose Jaw and then Assiniboia to be near family for their remaining years. Jim passed away in June 2013.



ELLERT, Peter Jacob "Pete"

WWII

Pete was born in Tompkins, Saskatchewan in 1919. He took three months basic training in Regina and then joined the Royal Canadian Artillery in March 1941. He then took basic artillery training in Brandon and Shilo, Manitoba. They went to Debert, Nova Scotia. In April 1942, they went overseas to England. Pete served in France, Belgium, Germany and Holland during the Second World War. He met and married his Scottish bride, Helen Murray, in April 1944. Following the war, Pete stayed in England and attended Khaki University to complete his grade twelve. He then returned to Canada in June 1946 and was discharged from depot in Regina with the rank of Lance Sergeant. Pete and Helen raised nine children while farming in Vantage, SK and later moved into Assiniboia, SK to the home they would retire in. Pete has been a member of the Assiniboia Royal Canadian Legion Branch 17 for 48 years.

ELLISON, William Archibald "Willie"

WWI

William enlisted in the Army with the 20th Battalion at Moose Jaw. He went overseas in 1917 during the Second World War and was in the machine gun corps. William was killed in action in 1918 in France and is buried in Flanders.

ELSIE, James Leonard

WWI

James was born in 1850 and he served during the First World War. He was from the Frobisher, Saskatchewan area. James passed away in 1932.



EWAN (MANSELL), Betty Maud

WWII

Betty Maud was born on November 16, 1907, the eldest of four children to Walter Mansell and Maud Gell in Northampton, England. She worked as an accountant. During the war, she worked at a Military-Aircraft Company in Coventry, a one-hour train ride away from Northampton. Every morning in the dark, she boarded the train not knowing it all the tracks at the factory would be there. During the Battle of Britain, Coventry was bombed heavily every night. She married Keith Ewan on January 25, 1941. On June 5, 1944 their son Bruce was born. The birth announcement was on the same page as the headlines about the D-Day invasion. Betty and son Bruce embarked from Liverpool on May 11, 1945 and landed at Pier 21 in Halifax, Nova Scotia on May 23, 1945. Because of wartime security, it was impossible to know when you would leave from England, from which dock, nor the name of the ship. War in Europe was virtually over, but their ship still had to run a zigzag course, just in case some unfriendly submarines were out there. A cabin contained eight women and their children. After a six-day train trip across Canada, they were met at Alameda by the Sillery family and lived with them until Keith went home in September 1945. A daughter, Ann, was born in Oxbow. Betty was involved with The Royal Canadian Legion, Happy Gang, Frobisher U.C.W. and the Frobisher Church.





WWII


Keith was born on September 24, 1914 on the family farm in Munro District to John Bethune Ewan and Elizabeth Storie. He went to the Munro School for grades one to eight and grades nine to eleven were taken by correspondence. Keith drove a fuel truck during the late thirties. When the Second World War was declared in 1939, jobs were scarce so he enlisted in the Princess Pats. He ended up in a Driver and Maintenance Corps. He was sent overseas to the British Army Camp at Aldershot then Southamptonshire, England, then to the Isles of Butte, Scotland for extra training. While on R and R in Scotland, he looked up Ewan relatives. In 1940, he met Betty M. Mansell and after a six week courtship, they were married on Robbie Burns' Day on January 25, 1941 in Northampton, England. Keith went home in September 1945 and farmed in Frobisher from 1949 to 1952. He was involved with Frobisher Wheat Pool Committee, Co-op Association, Royal Canadian Legion, Estevan Barbershoppers, served as Frobisher's Mayor, South-East Library Board, Frobisher Community Choir, Frobisher Lions, Frobisher Happy Gang and the Frobisher Church.

EYRE, John Charles

John was born in Wadena, Saskatchewan in 1944. He served with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police from May 25, 1967 until retiring to pension on May 31, 2001. He trained at "Depot" Division in Regina, SK and "P" Division in Penhold, Alberta. His postings included "D" Division from 1967 to 1978 - HQ Winnipeg Crime Index Section, Winnipeg Detachment, Brandon Detachment, Wasagaming Detachment, Carberry Detachment and Winnipeg Security Service; "HQ" Division in Ottawa from 1978 to 1982 - D Operations Counter Terrorism Section; "K" Division in Ottawa from 1982 to 1985 - Security Service and Canadian Security Intelligence Service (CSIS) Counter Terrorism Section; "F" Division from 1985 to 2001 - Melville Detachment, Rose Valley Detachment (Detachment Commander) and Craik Detachment (Detachment Commander). He was promoted to Corporal in 1975 and to Sergeant in 1988. John was awarded the Long Service Medal with Silver Clasp and Star, and the Saskatchewan Centennial Medal. 




FALLIS, Cecil "Roy"

Fred was born on July 10, 1914 on a farm near Semans. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force as Transport Mechanic on September 11, 1939 during the Second World War. Fred served in many parts of Western Canada before being posted in England in 1943. When the European war was over, he volunteered to go to the Pacific, but that war ended before he was transferred there. Fred was stationed in Eastern Canada until his discharge in 1946. At the time of discharge Fred held the rank of Flight Sergeant. He received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp and the Defence Medal. After discharge, Fred took over his father's farm, farming with his wife Shirley until his retirement in 1974. The Felton farm received Century Farm award in 2005. He was a member of Semans Legion Branch for over 35 years. Fred passed away in 1986.

WWII



After the war, the family settled in London, Ontario where Norman was employed for over twenty years in food services at Western University and later with the Liquor Control Board of Ontario. He was a member of the Semans Legion Branch. Norman passed away in 2004 and was predeceased by Alice in 2003.




FERRIDGE, Charles

Charles was born in 1895 in Kent, England. He served in the Royal Canadian Navy from 1916 to 1919 in the First World War. He served on several British ships escorting troop ships across the Atlantic and later on the HMS Moldavia which was carrying US soldiers. It was torpedoed and sunk in the English Channel with only two hundred of the six hundred persons onboard surviving. This ship lies in two pieces in the bottom of the English Channel and is a destination for experienced divers. From 1941 to 1945 he served in the Royal Canadian Air Force as a fireman at Swift Current, Estevan and Medicine Hat during the Second World War. He was a member of Swift Current Legion Branch 56. Charles passed away in 1983.



WWII







FOLKERTS, Carl


WWII

Henry was born in Leehass, Germany in 1922. Henry served with the South Saskatchewan Regiment during the Second World War. The Folkerts name was first heard in Frobisher in 1949. Henry was employed by the Canadian National Railroad there and when this became permanent he moved his family to Frobisher in 1950, his wife, Clara (Winters), daughters Beverley, Yvonne, Clara Ann (Tanny), and son John. They had previously resided in Wilmar, Saskatchewan. He was a member of the Frobisher Legion Branch 143. Henry was the town mayor, town policeman and volunteered with RCL and St. John's Lutheran Church. Henry passed away in 1979.

FORGAY, Arthur

WWII

Arthur was born to William and Gertrude Elsie Moynes in Lampman, Saskatchewan. In 1926, the family moved to Frobisher. His siblings were Ray and Lowry. Arthur took his schooling in Frobisher and graduated in 1943 and worked in the hardware store. He joined the Army in the Second World War and was posted to Montreal to take university training at McGill. He was given the tasks of training, mostly in light arms instruction. He was scheduled to go overseas to the Pacific War but that assignment was cancelled when the war ended in 1945. After his discharge from the Army, in 1946, he attended Normal School and then the University of Saskatchewan. Arthur taught in Gainsborough in 1949, Carnduff from 1950 to 1953, Estevan Collegiate in 1953 and was appointed principal in 1956 and remained in that position until he resigned in 1969. He married Beryl Gaff of British Columbia in 1953. He had four children, Ann, Faith, Jane and Margaret. Arthur passed away in Regina on September 11, 1997 and is buried at the Riverside Cemetery.



FORGAY, William Yendall "Bill"

WWI

Bill was born on December 11, 1890 in Lansford, Pennsylvania. He had travelled to Ohio and Nebraska but a good left arm and an interest in baseball were the means of the trip to the Canadian prairie. On May 30, 1914, he arrived in Lampman. In 1937, he went to Allantown, PA to join the US Navy and served on the U.S.S. Ohio in the First World War. After his discharge in 1919 as an Engineerman 1st Class, he returned to Lampman. In 1923 he married Gertrude Elsie Moynes. They moved to Frobisher with their baby son Arthur in 1926 and they bought the hardware store. Their living quarters were above the store. Two more sons were born, Ray and Lowry. On November 1, 1956, the store closed but they remained in the home until May 26, 1957. The Forgay family were community minded, Bill in sports especially baseball. The years in Frobisher were happy but were not without difficulties, drought and depression. Bill passed away in 1982 in Regina at the age of 91. His grave is in the Memorial Gardens in Regina. He was a member of Legion Branch 143 in Frobisher.







FORSYTH, William "Rover"

Following the war, he competed in track and field events in both Canadian and Saskatchewan championships. In addition to his running, he won championships in discus and pole vault. William's name was synonymous with winning road races. He won the Regina Standard and Moose Jaw Times' 10-mile road races in 1909, 1910 and 1911. The three-time Moose Jaw News race champion dominated every local and provincial competition he entered. After winning the Winnipeg Telegram road race in 1910 and 1911, William was selected to travel to Stockholm, Sweden to represent Canada in the 1912 Olympics, where he placed sixteenth in the marathon.

Waldon was born on July 3, 1906 in Walkerton, Ontario. He enlisted in the Army and served with the "A" Squadron 14th Canadian Light Horse in England during the Second World War. After the war, he worked in Regina at the Department of National Defence. He was a member of Legion Branch 201 in Fleming, SK and Legion Branch 81 in Moosomin, SK. Waldon passed away in 1987.



WWI

Norman was born in Peterborough, Ontario on October 14, 1892. After moving to Saskatoon from Ontario when he was fifteen years old, Norman quickly made himself known, contributing to sport at both the amateur and professional levels for forty years. He played baseball, soccer and lacrosse, but it was his hockey career where he achieved most of his athletic success. A year after arriving in Saskatoon, in 1908, Norman had secured the goalie position on the Junior Saskatoon Rovers and Saskatoon Bankers. He also joined the Jays Civics and the Humboldt P.A. Mintos before 1915. He served in the Canadian Armed Forces and Canadian Expeditionary Force from 1918 to 1919. Following retirement, he returned to Saskatoon and coached the 1933 Saskatoon Quakers to an Allan Cup victory. With such success, Norman went on to coach the University of Saskatchewan Huskies and the Saskatoon Elites, and helped to organize Pee Wee hockey. One of the greatest hockey players, Gordie Howe is one of Norman's graduates.



SPECIAL DUTY AREA FRANCESCONE, Benito "Ben"

Ben was born in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan in 1936. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1953 at the age of seventeen. After basic training, he was transferred to Macdonald, Manitoba. His next base was Mount Hope in Hamilton, Ontario, then on to 3 (F) Wing in Germany. From Germany, he did a tour at Cold Lake, Alberta; Petawawa, Ontario; Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan and finished off 33 years of service in Trenton. Ben was a flight engineer and accumulated approximately ten thousand flight hours. He was awarded the CD2, Canadian Peacekeeping Service Medal and the Special Services Medal. Ben passed away in December 2016.








FRANCESCONE, Patrick Anthony "Tony"

FRANCIS, Emile



WWII

Emile was born in North Battleford, Saskatchewan on September 13, 1926. He served in the Canadian Armed Forces in 1945. Emile was well known throughout the province, his hockey and baseball roots stemming from North Battleford. Francis played his junior hockey career with the Moose Jaw Canucks and from there joined the National Hockey League's (NHL) Chicago Blackhawks at the age of twenty. In goal from 1947 to 1950, his quick reflexes earned him the nickname "The Cat". Retiring in 1960, Francis coached and managed baseball. During his years with the North Battleford Beavers, the club won six Western Canada championships and represented Canada in the Global World Series in Milwaukee. From 1965 to 1975, Emile was head coach with the New York Rangers, followed by seven years with the St. Louis Blues as executive vice-president, general manager and coach. In 1983, he moved to the position of president and general manager of the Hartford Whalers, where he stayed until 1988.

FRANCISCONE, Antonio "Tony"

WWII


Tony was born in Regina, Saskatchewan in 1922. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force in October 1940 in Regina and served with 100 Squadron during the Second World War. He trained at No. 2 ITS, No. 15 EFTS, and No. 2 BGS. Tony completed a tour of night bombing sorties operating with conspicuous ability over heavily defended targets in western and northern Germany. He was awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal (DFM) on January 10, 1944. He went on to be an instructor and achieved the rank of F/O. He was also awarded the 1939-1945 Star. Air Crew Europe Star, Defence Medal, the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasps, War Medal 1939-1945 and the Royal Canadian Air Force Reserve Badge. Tony passed away in the United States in 1995.



FREISS, Peter "Pete"

WWII

Pete was born on May 5, 1921 near Torquay, the son of George and Monica (Schelling). His siblings were George, Tony, Matt, Ralph, Allie, Tillie, Mary and Pauline. Pete attended Munro School north of Frobisher. The family moved to a farm north of Rockland School. Pete joined the Army at the age of seventeen and served in the Royal Canadian Electrical Mechanical Engineers during the Second World War. In 1941, he enlisted in the S.S.R. and later transferred to Royal Canadian Electrical and Mechanical Engineers. He saw most of his overseas duties in Europe. While stationed in Scotland, he met Margaret McGuire, who was also serving her country in time of war, and married her. Their first daughter Monica was born there. After the war was over, Pete was discharged in November 1945 and returned to Canada, he settled in Torquay for a while then moved to Timmons, Ontario where he worked in a nickel mine for about seven years. They moved to Frobisher which was their home for eight years. Pete worked as a mechanic for Jim Richardson in the 1950s and 1960s. Five of their children attended school in Frobisher. He retired in Virbank.













GEDAK, Joseph Isador

WWII

Isador was born in Estevan in 1922. He served with the Royal Canadian Air Force during the Second World War as a Pilot Officer attached to the #90 Royal Air Force Squadron. The squadron flew 4,613 operational sorties for bomber command during the war and lost 86 aircrafts. Pilot Officer Gedak was killed in action in Duisberg, Germany on May 13, 1943. Joseph and crew left Ridgwell, England Airfield at 00.18 hours. His Stirling aircraft failed to return from night operations in Duisberg. He has no known grave and his name is inscribed on the Runnymede Memorial in Surrey, England. Joseph was the son of Anton and Marianna Gedak, natives of Russia and Romania who moved to Estevan in 1912. Gedak Lake in northern Saskatchewan was named in his honour. He was 21 years old.

GEDAK, Norman Anthony

WWII

Norman was born in Estevan, Saskatchewan on February 24, 1918. He enlisted in Regina, SK on February 26, 1941 with the 14th Armoured Corp 5th Division. In March 1941, he was sent to Kitchener, ON for basic training where he was trained as a Turner (Machinist). On August 13, 1943, he left from Halifax for overseas. He served in Canada, the United Kingdom, France and Continental Europe with the RCASC during the Second World War. He returned to Canada on December 7, 1945. He received the Star of France, the Star of Germany Medals and the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp. He married Helen McManus on February 23, 1941. They had four children: Gary, Thomas, Catherine and Michael. Norman passed away on April 20, 1975 at Estevan and is buried at Estevan City Cemetery in the Veterans plot.






GEIGER, Frank








GIBSON, Arthur








Anton was born in Regina, Saskatchewan on May 2, 1931. He served in the Royal Canadian Navy on Her Majesty's Canadian Ship. A bowler for thirty years, Anton won many singles and doubles events, including the Canadian Singles Championship in 1962. With his partner, Joe Most, he won the Canadian Doubles title in 1964. At that time, he was voted the most outstanding individual in the tournament. Anton has made several contributions to bowling over the years, as an instructor and as vicepresident of the Regina Men's Ten-Pin Association.

GLOVER, Stanley



Stanley was born in Newcastle upon Tyne, England on May 25, 1879. He served in the Canadian Armed Forces with the 46th Battalion from 1916 to 1919. While attending Nutana Collegiate in Saskatoon, Stanley proved unbeatable in 440-yard races, winning four straight provincial inter-collegiate championships. As team captain, Staley also led the Nutana Rifle Marksmanship Team to Dominion Championships in 1924 and 1926. In the summer following high school, Stanley made his mark nationally, capturing the 1926 Canadian Senior Men's 440 yard. He later broke the Alberta senior men's 440-yard record and won the same race at the 1927 National Open Track and Field Competition in Toronto. After placing second in 440-yard at the Canadian Olympic Trials, Stanley was selected to represent Canada in the 1-mile relay at the 1928 Amsterdam Olympics. He competed alongside relay team members Phil Edwards (British Guiana), Alex Wilson (Montreal) and Jimmy Ball (Winnipeg). The team's bronze medal finish behind the United States and Germany still bettered the previous world record by 4/5 of a second. While on tour after the games, Stanley took gold in the 220-yard, 440-yard and Medley Cup relay at the Army, Navy and Air Force Games held in Woolwich, England. Two years later, he competed on a relay team with Alex Wilson, James Ball and A. Scott that finished second in the very first British Empire Games held in Hamilton, ON.



GORDON, Percy Edward


WWI

Percy was born in Campbellville, Ontario on November 4, 1892. He farmed in Disley, SK before enlisting in the Army. With one year of experience with the 15th Light Horse, he re-enlisted in Regina on November 23, 1915. He served with the 52nd Battalion and the 68th Overseas Battalion during the First World War. On September 22, 1916 he received a gunshot wound to the left thigh at Somme causing fractures, hemorrhaging and muscle herniation. On September 26, 1916, they amputated his leg in the morning and he died of shock at 18:55 that evening. The Memorial Cross was given to his wife and to his mother. He is buried at Morton Cemetery, Keighley, England.













GORE, Horace Victor

WWI

Horace was born in Simcoe, Ontario on August 18, 1885. He was a Steam Engineer in Regina when he travelled to Winnipeg to enlist in the Army on December 14, 1914. He served with the 5th Battalion during the First World War. On March 27, 1915 he developed acute appendicitis. He returned to active duty four months later. He was killed during the Battle of Sanctuary Wood in Belgium on June 6, 1916. He is buried at the Larch Wood Cemetery near Leper, Belgium.

GOUDY, Emerson

Emerson was born in Lenox, Addington County, Ontario on March 28, 1892 to Ashley and Lucinda (Brown). The family went west on a colonist train and landed in Alameda on Easter Sunday in 1900. They lived in a teepee made of lumber until a sod shack was built. In 1917, Emerson joined the Air Force and was stationed at Toronto during the First World War, returning to Alameda when the war ended in 1918. He married Elda Erdman of Frobisher and ran a garage. They moved to Lampman as a linesman and his territory extended to take in Frobisher, Benson and Lampman. In the early 1930s he built the switchboard in the phone office a Lampman and also as a hobby, he built his own snow plane which he used in his line of work and also to drive the doctor around the country. He passed away on October 12, 1956 and is buried at the Thompson Cemetery.





GOUDY, Warren Alexander Titus

WWI

Warren was born in Kingston, Ontario on January 14, 1897. He enlisted in the Army in Estevan on December 24, 1915. He listed his occupation as a farmer. He served with the 152nd Bn during the First World War.







GRAHAM, James Thomas



GRASSICK, Gordon "Greg" SASKATCHEWAN SPORTS HALL OF FAME





GREBINSKI, Stanley Walter


WWII














GREEN, Ross

WWII


Ross was born on April 18, 1922 in North Battleford and enlisted with the Royal Canadian Navy in April 1942. After weeks of training he was posted to HMCS Charlottetown II with the rank of Visual Signalman during the Second World War. He served in the Atlantic Ocean, Pacific Ocean, St. Lawrence Seaway, Irish Sea, English Channel, Mediterranean Sea, and the Straits of Gibraltar. Their duties were carrying ammunition to be off loaded to other ships, patrolling and escorting which placed them in a dangerous roll. His duties included the application of Morse code, sending and receiving light patterns and watches, as travel at night was done without lights visual to the enemy. Ross was honourably discharged in the fall of 1945 and received four war medals for his service. He is a past president of Battleford Legion Branch 9 and has a 38-year membership.

GREYEYES, David





David was born on Muskeg Lake Reserve, Saskatchewan on Decemeber 14, 1914. He was an outstanding soccer player and a three-time provincial All-Star selection. David played on the team in the 1937 match again Charleton Athletics, in 1938 against Islington Corinthians, and in 1949 against Newcastle United. He served in the Royal Canadian Air and Army Cadets. In 1942, David was a member of the Canadian Team that won the Overseas Army Championship. He also played with the team in Inter-Allied games. Upon returning to Saskatchewan, David formed and coached a soccer team, and was once more selected to the Saskatchewan All-Stars in 1949.



GRIFFIN, James Ainsley

WWII

James was born in Yellowgrass, Saskatchewan on February 29, 1924. He enlisted in the Air Force and served during the Second World War. He was a navigator in a Lancaster Bomber. After the war, he obtained a law degree and practiced in Regina, SK. He retired in 2012. He enjoyed travelling, astronomy, farming, hunting, education and the Saskatchewan Roughriders. James passed away on August 27, 2017.





WWI


Joe was born in Port Talbot, Wales on May 10, 1885. He served in the Canadian Expeditionary Force from 1916 to 1918. For 32 years, 1919 to 1951, while working at the University of Saskatchewan, Joe Griffiths made a great impact on athletics. He coached high school and university track and swim teams, and was the Canadian Olympic team coach in both these sports in the 1936 and 1948 Olympics. Joe was a life member of the Royal Life Saving Society, Saskatoon's Citizen of the Year, and he received the coveted honour award from the Canadian Association for Health, Physical Education and Recreation in 1948.


GUTHERIDGE, Stanley "Hub"

Stanley was born in London, England on September 19, 1905. He first played basketball in the Moose Jaw YMCA around 1919 at the age of fourteen. He took part in the Y's house league, then in the men's city league, and later in inter-city competition with Regina. He served with the Canadian Armed Forces from 1942 to 1946. In 1946, he was appointed Supervisor of Physical Education for the Moose Jaw Public School Board. In this capacity, he organized and administered all basketball for elementary and secondary schools, and could be given credit for much of the success of the game of basketball in Moose Jaw.






HALE, George Leslie

Victor was born in Muskoka, Ontario on July 1, 1877. He moved to Saskatchewan in 1900, homesteading southwest of Arcola and later moved to British Columbia. Victor enlisted in the Army on May 17, 1916 at Brisco, British Columbia. He served with the D Company 16th Reserve, CEF in Continental Europe during the First World War. Victor passed away in 1921.





HALFPENNY, James

WWI

James was born in Mid Louther, Scotland on January 11, 1896. Enlisting in the Army on December 18, 1915, he left farming in Kennel, Saskatchewan to join the war effort. He served with the 68th and 8th Battalions during the First World War. He earned the Memorial Cross when he lost his life on July 5, 1916 in the defence of the Ypres Salient. He is commemorated on the Menin Gate Memorial at Ypres, Belgium.

Burns was born in Wawota, Saskatchewan in 1920. In the fall of 1940, Burns filled out an application for RCE Regina. He was categorized as a "B" man because of the loss of a thumb. As the war progressed, they began to accept "B" men. On October 16, 1941, Burns enlisted in the 101 L.A.A. Battery. He was on the Cape Town Castle, the flagship in the 24 ships to cross the Atlantic. He trained in Claxton, England as a bombardier (gunner). Orders arrived and they were moved to allied headquarters at Portsmouth, then crossing the English Channel. After landing in France, they spent two days getting guns ready, then into action. Burns served in France, Belgium, the Netherlands, and Germany during the Second World War. He returned home in 1945. He was a member of Wawota Legion Branch 113 for more than thirty years. Burns passed away in 1991.

HANNAH, Arthur James "Jim"

WWII

Arthur, known to all as Jim, was the sixth and youngest son of Bob and Kate. He was born in Frobisher, Saskatchewan on July 6, 1926. His other siblings were: Gordon, Harold, Robert, Ernest, Alma and Patricia. Jim attended Frobisher School. As a young lad, he enjoyed playing baseball and hockey. He held various jobs working on the CN Railway, driving a truck for Hamill & Goodwin and helped with the threshing. In 1945, he enlisted in the Canadian Army during the Second World War and when the war ended, he decided to take a barbering course in Moose Jaw. Upon completion of his course, he followed his father's footsteps and started barbering in Frobisher on October 29, 1947 (a haircut cost fifty cents). He married schoolteacher Olive Jennie McConville on July 22, 1952. They had four children: Margaret Ellen, Arthur Stanley, Betty-Ann and Douglas Wayne. Their golden years of retirement were spent in the Frobisher.



HANNAH, Ernest "Ernie"

WWII

Ernie, the fourth child of Robert Henry and Catherine Rosella Hannah, was born on October 28, 1920 in Wakaw, Saskatchewan. He had three older brothers: Gordon, Harold and Robert and one younger sister, Alma. The family moved to Alameda in 1924 and then to Frobisher. Two more siblings joined the family, Jim and Patricia. Horses were always a passion and a joy in Ernie's life. He started and completed his education in Frobisher. Life was not easy for a teenage boy in the 1930's. Ernie worked on a farm for the sum of one dollar per week. Gathering clouds of war over Europe and other world events brought about a significant change in the lives of the Hannah family - sons were heading off to war. On April 12, 1940, Ernie enlisted in the South Saskatchewan Regiment at Weyburn during the Second World War. Once overseas, he held many positions on coastal defence such as rifleman (foot slogger), signalman (delivered messages from headquarters to the office), transport, and chauffeur (drove an officer for a year). Ernie returned to Canada on July 22, 1945 to Frobisher. The return home was a time of new beginnings. His brother, Bob had been killed in the war and his mother also died when he was away. He married Linda Emma Nagel on October 28, 1947 at the church manse by Rev Billy Graham. To this union were born - Robert James, Kathryn Colleen and Melvin Gordon. Travel was part of Ernie and Linda's retirement plans – a Legion trip to Europe to relive memories of the war. They moved to Yorkton on March 21, 1977 along with the horses. Ernie passed away on September 12, 1999.



WWII

Glen served with the South Saskatchewan Regiment during the Second World War. He worked wire land well servicing. Glen married Erma Smith and had two daughters.

HANNAH, Gordon

WWII

Gordon, the eldest in the family of Bob and Kate (Gordon) was born in Wakaw, Saskatchewan on April 23, 1914. Gordon was truly a prairie boy. He played hockey as a goaltender in his youth and in the Great Depression he worked on a threshing crew for two dollars a day. By 1937, he had joined the Auxiliary Air Force and was working at Ashdown's Hardware in Regina. He trained at Balfour Technical School in Regina, the Brandon and Calgary #2 Wireless School. With the outbreak of the Second World War, Gordon joined the Royal Canadian Air Force and was shipped overseas, arriving in England during the Battle of Britain in November 1940. After the war, he returned to his beloved prairies for several years. He bought a motorcycle, farmed in Frobisher, worked as an order clerk in Ashdown's, travelling salesman for a grocery chain, grain buyer at Steelman, but the lure of the west coast lingered so in 1951 he travelled to Victoria, BC to work in the shipyards. However, he frequently returned to the prairies. His first wife, Alice, passed away in 1969 and in 1972 he remarried to Barbara Woods, whom he knew during the war in England. Their happy marriage lasted over thirty years, until Gordon passed away on October 6, 2003 in his ninetieth year.



HANNAH, Harold

WWII

Harold, the second son of Bob and Kate, was born in Wakaw, Saskatchewan in 1916. During his teen years, he worked at a United Church summer camp at Carlyle as a youth counsellor. After completing high school, he enrolled as a student at St. Andrew's College in Saskatoon to undertake the Ministry. After a year and armed with the good book, he headed out to set up a practice in Ardill, SK, but soon discovered the life of a minister was not for him. So he enrolled in Normal School in Regina. He found a job teaching a one-room school in Semans, SK. At the start of the Second World War, Harold enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force. Due to his teaching/religious training, he was posted to a Commonwealth Air Training base in Brantford, Ontario. His teaching role was that of bombing instructor and by the close of war, he achieved the rank of Flight Sergeant. He did not see overseas service like most of his brothers, but it did permit him to meet his future wife, Barbara Richards. They were married in Brantford in 1944. After the war, he completed his BSc at McMaster University in Hamilton, ON. He then accepted a teaching position at Brandon College and raised three children: Richard, Sharon and Patrick. He belonged to the Masonic Lodge and was elected for a term as the Grand Master of Manitoba, also Lodges -Scottish Rite and Shriners. Harold passed away in 1990 and Bernice in April 2005.







HANNAH, Ross

HANSON, George

WWII

George was born on May 5, 1919 in Torquay, Saskatchewan. He enlisted with the South Saskatchewan Regiment during the Second World War. He joined the 14th Canadian Hussars, 8th Reconnaissance Regiment on February 8, 1941 and served in England, France, Holland, Belgium and Germany. He was discharged on November 9, 1945 with the rank of Corporal. After his discharge, George worked as a mechanic for Massey Harris dealership in Lake Alma until 1950 when he began farming. He married Mamie Anderson of Lake Alma on December 2, 1947 and together they raised nine children. He was a member of South Saskatchewan Legion Branch 306 in Oungre, SK. WWII

Sidney was born in Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan on August 16, 1913 to Ernest and Alice May Haresign. He enlisted in the Army and served with the Perth Regiment Royal Canadian Infantry Corps in Europe during the Second World War. Private Haresign was killed in action in Italy on September 28, 1944 and is buried in Italy at the Cesena War Cemetery. He was awarded the 1939-1945 Star, Italy Star and the War Medal.



HARRISON, Stanley "Cap"



WWI

Stanley was born in Preston, England on March 24, 1886. He served with the Canadian Armed Forces and Canadian Expeditionary Force from 1916 to 1918. Saskatchewan's most distinguished builder of the sport of thoroughbred racing, Stanley was recognized for his contributions as a breeder, trainer, writer and race official. He used his talent to capture the spirit of his thoroughbreds for the enjoyment of the countless followers of the equestrian arts. Stanley judged at horse shows throughout the west. He spent many years as Saskatchewan's director of the Canadian Thoroughbred Horse Society, and served as a steward at Assiniboia Downs in 1958. He was a founding director of the Prairie Thoroughbred Breeders Association.

HARTLEY, George Richard

WWII

George was born in Estevan on March 2, 1916 to Alfred and Elsie (Chammey). During the Second World War, in 1939, George volunteered for service in the Army. He was the second man in Saskatchewan to volunteer and served with the Saskatoon Light Infantry from 1939 to 1945. He fought in the battles of Ortona, Sicily, mainland Italy and the liberation of Rotterdam, Holland earning the rank of Sergeant. During the war, on August 4, 1943, he married Joan Winnifred Piper in Wadhurst, Sussex, England. Their son Paul was born. When George was ready to return to Canada, Joan wanted to stay with her parents, so they divorced and he returned alone. On September 17, 1947, he married Evelyn Mary McWirter in Regina. They had two girls, Dolores Dianne and Deborah Elizabeth. They moved around to Carnduff, Glen Ewen and Oxbow before going to Frobisher, then Bienfait and finally retiring in Estevan. George passed away on September 3, 1986.

WWII


Martin served with the Royal Canadian Air Force out of Gander, Newfoundland during the Second World War. He lived in Prince Albert, Saskatchewan.



HASSARD, Clarence


WWI

Clarence was born on June 11, 1896 in Aberdeen, South Dakota, USA and moved to Alameda as a four-year-old. He was well known around as a great ball player. He took his schooling there and finished just in time to get ready to become involved in the First Great War. In the fall of 1915, he enlisted in "C" Company of the 152nd Battalion, was quartered that winter in the Empire Hotel in Estevan. He moved in and joined to A, B, and D Companies at Weyburn waiting for orders to move to Camp Hughes (Shilo) or go overseas. HASSARD, Elwin "Bud"


WWII

Bud was born in 1916 and raised north of Frobisher to Fred and Edna (Snider). His siblings were: Muriel, Mary, Freda, Ruby and Rodger. Times were a bit rough; a cyclone took the house then two years later the house burned down, then another cyclone hit. When Bud turned sixteen, he went to work at M and S mines at Bienfait for the next five to six years during winters. In the summer he went to northern Saskatchewan where the crops were better. In 1936 he met Edna Callfas and she became his wife. They lived in Briquette plant until Bud joined the Army in Regina on September 6, 1939. He went overseas and returned six years later. Edna and oldest son, Lorne, lived in Regina. Upon his return from overseas, they farmed north of Frobisher. He received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal, 1939-1945 Star, Italy Star, France and Germany Star and the Defence Medal. After the war another son, Glen, was born. In 1947, he bought the old Frobisher Hotel with Charlie Poston. A daughter was born, Penny. He owned the hotel until 1956 and then operated Bud's Meat Market until 1965. They lived in Victoria where Bud passed away in August 1993.

HASSARD, Lorne

PEACETIME

Lorne was born in Frobisher, Saskatchewan on December 14, 1938 to Bus and Enda. He got his education in Frobisher. His siblings were Glen and Penny. Lorne and his mother lived in Regina for six years when his dad served in the Army. When he returned, they moved back to Frobisher. Lorne married Bea. He retired after 26 years in the Canadian Armed Forces. He spent thirteen years with Kingston Police Force as a part time sheriff and Court Services Officer for Frontenac County. They had three girls: Vickie, Sherri and Janie.





HAZEN, John Logan

WWII

John was born in 1926. Private Hazen passed away in 1981 and is buried in Regina Beach Cemetery.













HENDRICKSON, Hjalmar Harold

WWII

Hjalmar was born in Kinistino, Saskatchewan. He enlisted in the Army with the South Saskatchewan Regiment and served in Europe, the Netherlands Liberation. He was in communications, more specially a walkie-talkie and Morse Code Professional. He was devastated emotionally by the number of friends in his unit who died trying to protect him because without communications the unit was essentially isolated and lost. He served his country for three years during the Second World War.


HERLEN, Ernest "Ossie"

Ernest was born in Star City, Saskatchewan on November 26, 1918. He was an excellent boxer and a great sportsman of the late 1930s. He was raised in Saskatoon and started to box at the age of fifteen. Of his 33 fights, Ernest won 12 by decision, 12 by knockouts and three by total knockouts. He lost five by decision and fought to one draw. In his nine years of boxing he was never knocked out. He was the Saskatchewan lightweight champion in 1937 and in 1938 was a Saskatchewan champion again, only this time in the welterweight class. He was also the Welterweight Dominion Champion in Winnipeg the same year. Ernest was named vice-president of the Golden Gloves Amateur Boxing Club for 1937 to 1938. He served in the Royal Canadian Air Force from 1939 to 1944. After entering the Royal Canadian Air Force, he carried on boxing and took the Toronto Garrison Championship in 1940.





HETHERINGTON, Thomas Walter

WWI

Thomas was born on December 26, 1892 in Penrith, Cumberland, England. He travelled from Lumsden, SK where he was an accountant to Winnipeg, Manitoba to enlist in the Army on Christmas Eve of 1914. He served in France with the 34th Fort Garry Horse and 10th Battalion during the First World War. Private Hetherington was killed in action on May 21, 1915 during the Battle of Festubert in France. He has no known grave and is commemorated on the Vimy Ridge Memorial.



HILDEBRAND, Frank





HOLMES, George Raymond

WWI

George was born at Chatham, Ontario on December 24, 1885. He took schooling there. He went west with his brother Walter in 1905 on the harvest excursion train for harvest. Ten dollars made the round trip. Then in 1906, he moved with his parents to Alameda and farmed. He joined the Army in 1916 during the First World War and went overseas. He was a Private in the 100th Battalion. He took sick with the Spanish Flu over there and was sent back to a Winnipeg hospital and passed away while in the Forces on December 3, 1918. George is buried in the soldiers' cemetery in Winnipeg.

HOLMES, George W.

He spent the first ten years of schooling in the little country school, at the time the attendance ranged from 15 to 22 students and one teacher for all ten grades. Those were the depression years. In 1958, two years after joining Imperial, he was transferred to Edmonton, then to Toronto in 1968 and they are now in Agincourt, a Toronto suburb. They have a four boys Kim, Donald, David and Robert.



HOLMES, Henry Chester

WWI

Chester was born on March 5, 1896 at home on the farm near Chatham, Ontario. At the age of ten, he went west with his parents and bother in the spring of 1906 and attended Sandringham and Fairplain schools. In 1909 they moved to the Fairplain school district and also attended school there. In 1913 they moved to a farm south-west of Alameda. In the spring of 1918 Chester enlisted in the army and went overseas. He was released from the Army in July 1919. He worked at Foxwarren and Portage La Prairie, Manitoba. When the cyclone hit his place in 1920 he went home to help with the harvest. In November 1920 he went picking oranges in California. In the fall of 1921 he went home to run the steam engine. On July 30, 1924 he married Violet Lachrisha Jane Moore and moved to a farm south-east of Frobisher. They had two sons, George and Raymond. In December they moved into Frobisher but continued farming until 1970. Chester passed away on July 30, 1984.





WWII



Katie was listed as having served and was from the Estevan area of Saskatchewan.






HOWES, Rollin "Roly"



He served with the 5th Bn in France during the First World War. He died on September 2, 1918 from wounds received at the Drocourt-Quéant Line. He is buried at Ligny-Saint-Flochel British Cemetery west of Arras, France.







HUNT, Harold Victor

WWI

Harold was born in Ontario on November 24, 1889. He enlisted with the Army on May 17, 1917 in Winnipeg, Manitoba. He was a Law student living in Regina, Saskatchewan. He was wounded on August 13, 1918 when he received a gunshot wound to his left hand. He served with the 78th Battalion during the First World War. He returned to Canada because of his injuries and received medical discharge on March 4, 1919. He returned to Regina, SK and was given Homesteading land.













HUNTER (COPLAND), Margaret Elizabeth NORTH-WEST REBELLION

Margaret Copland was born in Scotland in 1849. She trained as a nurse and then married William Hunter in 1870. In 1871 they emigrated to Ontario, and then went west to the village of Saskatoon, District of Saskatchewan, NWT, in 1883. Thomas Copland, her brother, chose a homestead next to the river and Margaret and her husband homesteaded in Llewellyn community, six miles to the northeast. With the outbreak of the Metis insurrection in 1885, General Middleton utilized the Copland homestead as the encampment grounds for the troops. Wounded from both sides were returned to this encampment area, and Margaret provided her nursing skills and medical care until hostilities ceased, after which she returned to the Llewellyn homestead. Margaret died in 1940 in Saskatoon, SK.


HUNTER, William "Bill"



WWII

Bill was born in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan on May 5, 1920. He served in the Royal Canadian Air Force from 1940 to 1944. While growing up in Saskatoon in the 1930s, he founded the Saskatoon Dukes Football Club, the forerunner of the Hilltops. After attending Notre Dame College at Wilcox, he moved to North Battleford and became involved with juvenile hockey and women's softball. Arriving in Regina, Bill began his involvement with the Regina Caps as owner, general manager, and coach. This was followed by a similar position with the Saskatoon Quakers. Bill has received many honours, including his induction into the Notre Dame, Saskatoon, Edmonton, and Alberta Sports Halls of Fame. In 2001, Bill was honoured with his induction into Canada's Sports Hall of Fame.





HUNTLEY, Sydney Lenard

WWI

Sydney was born in London, England on June 7, 1894. Before enlisting in Regina, Saskatchewan on June 22, 1915, he had been working as a farmhand. He served with the 46th and 58th Battalion during the First World War. He died on November 21, 1916 after receiving a gunshot wound to the abdomen while fighting at Regina Trench near the village of Le Sars. He is buried at Sainte-Marie Cemetery in Le Havre, France.

Edward was born in Kendal, England on June 19, 1882. He had lived in Canada for nine years working various jobs, the most recent before enlistment was at the News-Record in Lumsden, Saskatchewan. He enlisted in the Army on August 13, 1915 in Regina. He served with the 46th Battalion and the 2nd Battalion during the First World War. Edward passed away on July 22, 1916 and is buried at the Ridge Wood Military Cemetery in West-Vlaanderen, Belgium.



IRVIN, Dickson "Dick" Sr.



WWII

Dick was born on July 19, 1892 in Limestone Ridge, Ontario. He served with the Canadian Armed Forces and Canadian Expeditionary Force from 1917 to 1919. He played the game of hockey with such style and power that sports writers praised him as the "World's Greatest Amateur Hockey Player". As an amateur he played with the Winnipeg Monarchs and the Strathconas, the Regina Victorias and the Capitals. Following his amateur career, Irvin joined the Portland Rosebuds, the team that in 1925 became the Chicago Blackhawks. In his second season with the Blackhawks, he suffered a career-ending injury. Over the next 26 years, from 1929 until 1955, Dick Irvin coached the Chicago Blackhawks for two years; the Toronto Maple Leafs for nine years; and the Montreal Canadiens for fifteen years. His teams won seven league championships and four Stanley Cups, missing the playoffs only twice.

He was sent to the 66/81 Field Battery with the Royal Canadian Artillery at Petawawa, ON during the Second World War. In 1941, he went to Aldershot, England with the 14th Field Regiment. L/Sgt. 












JESSIE, Henry

WWI & WWII

Henry was born on March 7, 1894 in Wyandotte, Michigan. In the spring of 1899, his father, Gus, and family arrived at Curt Hill, Assiniboia District of Canada, which was later known as Wordsworth, Saskatchewan. On November 24, 1920, Henry was united in marriage to Martha Krenz and to this union was born five daughters and one son: Myrtle, Muriel, Marjorie, Joyce, Gloria and Dallas. In about 1929, Henry moved to Frobisher and went into partnership with Frank Hannah in a garage. However, the effects of the depression were felt and many business adventures failed. He was forced to do many varied occupations and became jack-of-all-trades. As with so many others at that period of time in history, his life was disrupted when the Second World War broke out and he enlisted in the Veterans Guard of Canada. Henry served most of these years guarding the Japanese, who were taken inland from the coastal regions for security reasons, at Trail, BC and Lethbridge, AB. Mr. and Mrs. Jesse celebrated their Golden Anniversary in November 1970 and on February 14, 1971, Henry passed away. He had also served in the First World War.

JOHNSON, George

WWI

George was born in Kelso, Scotland on February 14, 1892. Farming at Disley, Saskatchewan, he travelled to Saskatoon to enlist on December 16, 1915. He served with the 96th Highlanders and the 47th Battalion during the First World War. He was killed in action on April 13, 1917 at Vimy Ridge and is buried near the Vimy Memorial at Canadian No. 2 Cemetery.





JOHNSON, George Herman

WWI

George was born on June 27, 1891 in Willow Lake, South Dakota. He was farming in Halbrite, Saskatchewan when he enlisted in the Army on August 17, 1915 in Regina, SK. He was awarded the Memorial Cross serving with the Canadian Engineers/20th Border Horse during the First World War. He was a Sapper with the 1st Tunnelling Company when he was killed in action at Passchendaele on October 27, 1917. He is buried at La Clytte Military Cemetery by Ieper, Belgium.

WWII


Lloyd was born in Hendon, Saskatchewan on June 12, 1919. He was farming in Hendon when he was called up for national resources mobilization act service in Regina, SK on February 19, 1942. He served with the Kings Own Rifles during the Second World War. He died of tuberculosis in a Saskatoon Sanitarium on April 29, 1946. He is buried at Scandia Cemetery by Henson, SK.

JOHNSON, William George Wesley

William was born in Melville, Saskatchewan on May 12, 1924. He had originally attempted to join the Royal Canadian Air Force in September 1941 but was refused due to his age. JUCKES, Gordon



WWII

Gordon was born in Watrous, Saskatchewan on June 20, 1914. He served in the Royal Canadian Artillery from 1940 to 1946. He played minor hockey in Melville and, in 1946, became the president of the Melville Millionaires. Gordon was awarded the International Ice Hockey Federation Diploma of Honour in 1967; the CAHA Meritorious Award in 1976; life membership in the SAHA; induction into the Hockey Hall of Fame in 1979; and received the Order of Canada in 1980. After his death in 1994, the CAHA established the Gordon Juckes Memorial Trust, the proceeds of which go to a worthy team or individual each year.



Ernest was born in Pontesbury, Shropshire, England on December 19, 1892. He enlisted in the Army in Estevan on January 4, 1915 and served with the 46th Battalion and 28th Battalion during the First World War. He was put with the 28th Battalion on January 29, 1916. He was reported missing on June 6, 1916 and presumed dead. He was officially recorded dead on June 20, 1917 for official purposes. He sailed out of Montreal in May 1915 and arrived in England on September 13, 1915.

KARTUSCH, Michael "Mike" C. M.



Mike was born on September 20, 1907 in Qu'Appelle, Saskatchewan. His involvement with youth hockey teams began while he was in his early twenties. He was a Cadet Instructor with the Canadian Air/Army Cadets. Locally, he organized, coached, and administered the city Parks Hockey League. Mike was also an administrator, coach, and president of the Senior Men's Inter-City Softball League and the Men's and Women's Inter-Parochial League. Mike joined the Regina Pats organization in 1948, which continued until 1978 when he retired as chairman of the board of directors of the Saskatchewan Amateur Junior Hockey League. Mike was awarded the Order of Canada in 1974 and the Queen's Jubilee Medal in 1977.



KEATING, Shane

PEACETIME

Shane was born on December 17, 1975 in Estevan, Saskatchewan and raised in Dalmeny and Saskatoon. Corporal Keating was stationed in Shilo, Manitoba and was a member of the North Saskatchewan Regiment from June 2, 1993 to September 1, 1997. He joined the regular forces on September 1, 1997 as a member of the 2nd Battalion Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry and toured twice in Bosnia from 2000 to 2001 and in 2003. He was stationed in Afghanistan since August 1, 2006. He died serving his country in Afghanistan on September 18, 2006, while handing out school supplies, toys, balls and biscuts to local children. Cpl Keating and three other soldiers were killed by a suicide bicycle bomb attack in the Panjwaii district. A man travelling on a bicycle donated his bomb near Canadian troops and several others were injured, including children.

WWII



Ray was the son of Elmer and Marie Kennedy. His siblings were Josephine, Logan, Audrey and Viola.










KINCAID, Robert James

KLEMPP, Theodore


WWI

Theodore was born on November 10, 1888 in Grey Co., Ontario. He was homesteading by Ponteix, Saskatchewan when he enlisted in the Army on May 4, 1916 in Cadillac, SK. He was killed in action at Valenciennes on November 1, 1918 and is buried at Aulnoy Communal Cemetery in France. In 1917 he had suffered a severe gunshot wound to his right arm but later cleared for duty. Theodore served with the 229th and 46th Battalion during the First World War.

KOLKE, Oscar

WWII

Oscar was born on October 19, 1919 on the farm seven miles south of Frobisher, fourth in the Leo Kolke family. His siblings were Elsi, Arnold, Helen, Elma, Ruth and Alice. When he was four years old, their house burned to the ground along with all their clothes and possessions except a foot pedalled organ. He attended grade school in the red brick south Frobisher School, graduating from the tenth grade in 1934. In 1935, he attended Frobisher High School graduating in the summer of 1937. He attended Regina Normal School in the 1940 to 1941 session. The classes were held in the Lakeview grade school because the regular Normal School was used as billets for the Air Force. After three months of teaching at Vineberg School, it was four years in the Army (artillery) during the Second World War from 1941 to 1946. In April 1945, he married Gwen King of Victoria, BC. After his discharge from the Army at Regina, they went to Winnipeg where he took the first year in engineering. He transferred to the University of British Columbia at Vancouver, graduating in 1949. He stayed one more year to get a Master of Applied Science Chemical Engineering degree before migrating to the United States in 1950. He works with DOW Chemical in the Unites States. He has two children, Dale and Caryn. His plan was to retire after 1979 and live on the coast of Washington State north of Seattle.



KOSOWAN, Kevin Curtis



WWII

Alexander was born in Slovakia on May 17, 1926. In 1929, the Kovar family immigrated to Canada. After one week, aboard a ship, they arrived in Quebec then by train to North Battleford. They purchased land in Mount Hope district where Alex began school. More land was purchased in Metropole. He continued his education until he joined the Canadian Army (with the help of a few little white lies) in 1942. Following base training in Dundern and specialized commando training in Nanaimo he served in war zones in countries along the English Channel going north with VIII RECEE 14th Canadian Hussars 2nd Division, ending in Germany at the end of the war he returned home. He served in the Battle of Normandy, France, Holland, Belgium, Germany and France during the Second World War. He was awarded the 1939-1945 Star, France and Germany Star, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp, War Medal 1939-1945 and the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal. He has been a member of the Legion Battleford Branch 9 for 32 years.

KOZAKEWICH, Walter

WWII

Walter was born in Sokal, Ukraine in 1920. He moved to Canada in 1926. He joined the Army in 1944 and trained in Truro, Nova Scotia and Vernon, British Columbia during the Second World War. He went overseas until the war ended and served with the Military Police in Holland for two years.

Since the family left Frobisher, three more brothers were born: Howard David (passed away one year after birth), Gerald Leslie and James Henry.

LAMB, Roy Ferris

WWII

Roy was born on the family farm north of Assiniboia in 1921. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force when he was nineteen and trained as an air-frame mechanic. He was posted to St. Thomas, ON; Mossbank, SK; Chicoutimi, QC; Greenwood, NS; Truro, NS and Debert, NS from 1939 to 1945 and served with Eastern Air Command during the Second World War. After the war ended, he returned to Assiniboia to farm with his wife Marjorie and raised four children. He was a member of Assiniboia Legion Branch 17 for many years. Roy passed away in 1981.

LAMB, Thomas Alexander

WWI

Thomas was born on September 2, 1892 in Watford, Lambton County, Ontario. Working as a printer with the News-Record, he enlisted in Regina, SK on October 24, 1914. He served with the 28th Battalion, 250th Tunnelling Company during the First World War. He received the Plaque and Scroll and the Memorial Cross. He was killed in action on the eve of the Battle of Sanctuary Wood near Ypres on May 31, 1916. He is buried at Bedford House Cemetery in Belgium.



LANDA, Sam



Sam was born on December 31, 1913 in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan. He served with the Canadian Air/Army Cadets from 1942 to 1946. The Manitoba Medical College fine-tuned Sam's talents. He became the team doctor for the Saskatoon Hilltops in 1947, and held the position for over 38 years. Sam attended winter games, indoor games and the 1972 Munich Olympic Games as a medical team member. He chaired the committee responsible for the ParticipAction Saskatoon Society; set up international exchange programs; and was a director of the Bob Adams Foundation. Honours bestowed on him include Kinsmen Sportsman of the Year (1975), Queen's Jubilee Medal (1976) and a Member of the Order of Canada (1976), and inducted into the Saskatoon Sports Hall of Fame (1986).

Jim was born on December 7, 1884 in Cleich, County of Kinroscshire, Scotland which is about forty miles from Perth. He arrived in Frobisher, Saskatchewan on May 10, 1903 with his father, Robert, and ten siblings - his mother had died. The family travelled via the Sarmation, Allen Liner Boat. He took up farming. He married Grace Wright on March 13, 1916 and had four boys. James enlisted in the Army on October 4, 1916 and served with both the 221st Battalion and the 11th Reserve Battalion during the First World War. He was discharged on March 21, 1919. James passed away in December 1960.







WWII

Jack was born in Ottawa, Ontario on October 27, 1912. He served with the Royal Canadian Army Medical Corps from 1941 to 1945. On the local scene, Dr. Leddy was instrumental in the encouragement and development of high school and junior golf in Saskatchewan. He was named a governor of the Royal Canadian Golf Association beginning in 1954 and was elected president of the national association in 1962. In 1960, as chairman of the National Handicap and Course Rating Committee, he introduced a new method of rating golf courses, thus standardizing handicaps across Canada. In 1962, he was selected as the non-playing captain of the second-place Canadian team at the World Cup match held in Japan.

WWII



WWII























LIGGETT, David James "Dave"

WWII


Dave was born in N. Ireland in 1912. He went to his uncle's farm at Moreland, Saskatchewan in 1929. He worked for many farms in the Lang and Yellow Grass area in the 1930s. He enlisted in the Army at Maple Creek in March 1943 and was sent overseas that fall. He served in England and France, Belgium and Holland with the Army Service Corps as Driver/Mechanic during the Second World War until his discharge in December 1945. Dave returned to the farm at Moreland in 1947 until his retirement to Pangman. Dave was a Life Member with the Pangman Legion Branch. He enlisted in the Army in June 1943 and served during the Second World War with the Regina Rifles in the United Kingdom and Continental Europe in the liberation of France, Belgium and Holland until his honourable discharge in July 1946. He was awarded the 1939-1945 Star, France and Germany Star and the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp. Lorne passed away on December 28, 1988 in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan. He was a member of the Army, Navy and Air Force Veterans Club in Saskatoon, SK Branch 38 for ten years.



LIVINGSTONE, R.C. "Scotty"




WWII

Scotty was born on July 6, 1920 in Regina, Saskatchewan. Prior to the Second World War, Scotty played junior hockey for the Regina Abott Generals, and attended the New York Rangers Hockey Camp. He served in the Royal Canadian Navy from 1940 to 1945. Unfortunately, due to a serious war disability, Scotty's playing days were over. Coaching hockey and softball was his next step. In 1953, Scotty became active in high school football. In 1961, he joined the Regina Ram organization. By 1962, he was president. Over the years, Scotty has chaired every Ram football committee. He has also been a director of the Saskatchewan Roughriders for sixteen years.

LIZUCK, Joseph

WWII

Joseph was born on December 27, 1923 on a farm in the Elswick District to Nicholas and Ann Lizuck. He grew up on a farm near Colgate, Saskatchewan. He joined the Regina Rifles which was a regular force unit deployed overseas during the Second World War. This was a unit that remained for a period even after the war ended. Joseph was married to Norma Carlson and they lived in Weyburn where they raised six children. Joseph died of a heart attack on November 21, 1975 at the age of 52.



LOVING, Leslie R. B.

WWII

Leslie was born in Regina, Saskatchewan on February 10, 1921. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force on September 7, 1939 and eventually ended up in Europe flying with Royal Canadian Air Force 424 Squadron. In 1942, he was the pilot on a low-level attack on a German submarine base near Bremen. His determined effort resulted in a successful mission. For this action, he was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross (DFC) in May 1943. Unfortunately, he went missing in action in November 1944 over Bochum, Germany. F/L Loving is remembered at the Canadian Virtual War Memorial in Surrey, UK. In addition to the DFC, he was awarded the 1939-1945 Star, Air Crew Europe Star, France and Germany Clasp, Bomber Command Clasp, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp and War Medal 1939-1945. He was posthumously awarded the Operation Wings (over forty missions) and his next of kin were awarded the Memorial Cross GRV1.

























LYNN, Victor "Vic"



WWII

Vic was born in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan on January 26, 1925. His very interesting hockey story began in Saskatoon, where he had a short junior career with the Saskatoon Quakers that included a Memorial Cup appearance in 1942. Vic had a one game trial with the NHL's New York Rangers the next year, but finished the season with the New York Rovers of the Eastern Hockey League. Vic's next stop in the NHL was with the Detroit Red Wings, he spent two games with the Montreal Canadiens. He served with the Royal Canadian Navy from 1943 to 1945. His NHL break came the next year (1946-1947) when he was picked up by the Toronto Maple Leafs. Vic was part of the famous "Kid Line" with the Leafs that saw him and his line mates, "Teeder" Kennedy and Howie Meeker, lead Toronto to three Stanley Cups. During his time with the Leafs, Vic was selected to play in NHL All-Star games in 1947, 1948, and 1949. Following his playing career, Vic joined the ranks of coaching and management spending many years with the Saskatoon Quakers of the Saskatchewan Senior Hockey League (SSHL). His efforts in these fields resulted in seven Saskatchewan championships, and four Western Canadian titles.

MacDOUGALL, Allison Ivan "Mac"

WWII

Mac was born in Craven, Saskatchewan in 1920. He enlisted in the Army and served with the 14th Army Tank Regiment during the Second World War. He served from February 18, 1941 to April 23, 1946 with the Calgary Tanks first as Driver/Mechanic and then as a Gunner Operator. He fought in Belgium, Sicily, Italy and France, including the Dieppe Raid. He was discharged at the rank of Corporal. 



MADDIA, John "Jack"




McCOOL, Charles "Charlie"





McCUTCHEON, Frederick David


WWI



Angus was born in Mullingar, Saskatchewan in 1922. He served in the Air Force as a wireless operator during the Second World War from 1941 until the end of the war. Angus passed away in 1980.

lan was born in Mullingar, Saskatchewan in 1919. He served during the Second World War with the Royal Canadian Air Force as a rear gunner until the end of the war.



McNAUGHTON, Andrew George Latta WWI & WWII

Andrew was born on February 25, 1887 in Moosomin, Saskatchewan. He joined the Canadian militia in 1909. He took the 4th Battery overseas with the outbreak of the First World War in 1914. While there he helped make advances in the science of artillery creating a new target detection technique and was wounded twice. In March 1916 he was promoted to Lt. Col and took command of the 11 Brigade RCA. In early 1917 he was appointed the Counter Battery Staff Officer. On the day before the armistice he was promoted to Brigadier-General and appointed General Officer Commanding Canadian Corps Heavy Artillery. In 1920, Andrew joined the regular army and in 1922 was promoted to Deputy Chief of the General Staff and Chief of the General Staff in 1929. He also was the main driving force behind the relief camps of the 1930s. Andrew commanded the 1st Canadian Infantry during the early part of the Second World War. He commanded VII Corps from July to December 1940 when it was renamed the Canadian Corps. By the end of the war he reached the rank of General. After the war, Andrew chaired the UN Atomic Energy Commission from 1946 to 1948, served as Canada's Ambassador to the United Nations from 1948 to 1949 and chaired the Canadian Section of the International Joint Commission from 1950 to 1962. His decorations include: Order of the Companions of Honour, Companion of the Order of the Bath, Companion of the Order of St. Micheal and St. George, the Distinguished Service Order and the Canadian Forces Decoration. Andrew passed away on July 11, 1966.



He served with the 28th Battalion during the First World War. On July 1, 1918 he became severely ill with Bronchial Pneumonia. He died four days later on July 5, 1918. He is buried at Sainte-Hilaire Cemetery extension in Frevent, France.

McNEICE, Thomas George

WWI

Thomas was born on January 9, 1897 in Lumsden, Saskatchewan. He was working as a Bank Clerk in Lumsden when he enlisted in the Army on November 15, 1915. Thomas served with the 68th and 16th Battalions during the First World War. On June 4, 1917 he obtained the rank of Lance Corporal which he retained until his discharge on January 10, 1919. He had earned a Good Conduct Medal. Upon his return he moved to Los Angeles at some point where he worked as a bookkeeper for a lumber company. He passed away on April 9, 1936 at 16:05 due to heart complications. He is buried at the Sunnyside Cemetery in Los Angeles, California.





MEADOWS, Annie

WWII

Annie was a baby when her family immigrated from England to Canada in 1910. After several moves, the family relocated and settled in Frobisher, Saskatchewan. In 1927, Annie left to train in Moose Jaw General Hospital where she graduated in 1930. She contributed a great deal to her profession and to her patients both in Canada and overseas during the Second World War. She spent about six years in the Army Medical Corps during which time she served in Canada, Holland, Belgium, France and Germany.



MEADOWS, Frank Sr.

BOER WAR

Frank was born in England in 1875. He enlisted in the British Army in the Regiment of Royal Engineers under age using a deceased brother's birth certificate. He served in the Egyptian Campaign. He later served in the Boer War. He was taken prisoner, reported missing, and then reported dead. As the Boers fought mainly guerrilla war, prisoners were either shot or released. Frank was lucky to be released. The cross which marks the grave read "Sapper F. Meadows" but this was a case of wring identification. Frank had served in the Army under Queen Victoria and King Edward VII. Upon returning to England in 1902, he married Nellie and opened a blacksmith shop in Harmondsworth, Essex. In 1910, Frank and Nellie immigrated to Canada with three children: Frank Jr., Walter and baby Annie to live in a tent in Moose Jaw. On September 7, 1910 he opened a shop in Pense where two more children were born: Roy and Harry. They moved to Gouverneur in Southwest Saskatchewan and Vera was born. Drought and unsatisfactory school drove the Meadows back to Moose Jaw for one year. Then they bought the blacksmith shop and moved to Frobisher. He was a member of Frobisher Legion Branch 343. In 1949, Frank passed away at the age of 74 and is buried in Roselawn Cemetery in Moose Jaw.

MEADOWS, Roy

WWII

Roy was born in Pense, Saskatchewan. The Meadows family moved to Frobisher when Frank Sr. bought the blacksmith shop. Roy left school in grade nine to go to work for four years in his dad's shop then went back to complete his education. He operated the Post Office as an assistant from 1932 to 1934. He moved to Regina where he worked in a garage for a short time and in December 1935 entered the insurance business. From 1942 to 1946 he was in the Army attaining the rank of Captain during the Second World War. Following the Army, he started an insurance business and moved to Toronto.





MEARS, James Harry "Jim"

WWI & WWII

Jim was born in Steeple Bumstead, England in 1890. In August 1911, an Englishman, Jim went to Moose Horn District. James built a homestead shack and cleared some land. When the First World War broke out in 1914, Jim sold his land to C.O. Welle and enlisted in the Canadian Army, serving overseas. After the war he returned to Canada and bought land in the Wooler School District north of Clair, Saskatchewan. He married Mae Warriner and raised a family of nine children. When the Second World War broke out Jim again enlisted and served his country. Jim passed away in 1971 and is buried in the Wadena Cemetery in Wadena, SK.

MELVILLE, Tom "Scotty" SASKATCHEWAN SPORTS HALL OF FAME




WWII

Tom has played a major role in many sports: as the secretary-manager of the Saskatchewan Amateur Hockey Association for sixteen years; as an ardent booster of amateur baseball; in the evolution of school-boy curling to its present status as a national event, and in his persistence in the Saskatchewan Roughriders developing a provincial identity. Softball, tennis, swimming, golf, and many other sports have also benefited from his efforts. For example, he developed the highly successful "Learn-to-Swim" campaign with the City of Regina.

MESSHAM, John Jr.

WWII

John Jr. was born in 1909 to John Sr. and Elizabeth (Melville). His siblings were Willie, Tom and Margaret. In the year 1913, the family moved to the Mayflower district where they continued to farm. John Jr. attended school there. Being a violinist, he played for many of the school dances. A few years later, they moved back to the Frobisher district and farmed the Downer land. On February 14, 1930, he married Ivy Dallin of Frobisher. They had three children: Jean, Marina and Jack. John worked for Hamill & Goodwin hauling coal from the mines. John spent several years in the Royal Canadian Air Force during the Second World War. Upon his return, he was employed as a grain buyer. He was very active in the community; he was Secretary-Treasurer of the Frobisher Legion for thirty years, and active in the United Church. He enjoyed all sports as a player and a fan. John passed away on April 3, 1971 at the age of 62.





WWII

Don was born in Wilcox, Saskatchewan on January 10, 1916. He began his hockey career under Père Athol Murray at Notre Dame College. From 1931 to 1933, Don played for St. Michael's College in Toronto. He then played for the Toronto Goodyears for three years. He moved to the Toronto Maple Leafs in 1938, where he played right wing up until 1949. Don and his brother, Nick, played together on the winning Stanley Cup teams in 1942, 1945, 1947, and 1948. Don also played on the 1949 championship team. In the 1942 final against Detroit, the Leafs, who were three games down, made a comeback when Metz scored a hat-trick in the fifth game. He served with the Canadian Armed Forces from 1942 to 1945.



WWII

Nick was born in Wilcox, Saskatchewan on February 16, 1914. During the fall of 1934, he went to the Toronto Maple Leafs. After a stint with a Syracuse farm team, he was back in Toronto for the play-offs. He served in the Canadian Armed Forces from 1943 to 1945. In twelve seasons with the Leafs, between 1934 and 1948 (minus the WWII years), Nick scored 131 goals and 119 assists, playing centre and left wing. He played nine out of twelve years in Stanley Cup finals, and was a member of the winning Leafs in 1942, 1945, 1947, and 1948 (along with his brother, Don). Metz was also known as a curler, baseball, and lacrosse player.

MICHENER, Lloyd Albert

WWII

Lloyd was born in Wilcox, Saskatchewan in 1917. He completed his schooling at Craik, SK. Lloyd was working as a postal clerk in Regina, SK. He enlisted in the Canadian Postal Corps in 1940. He served during the Second World War with the 3rd Division Postal Unit in the United Kingdom, France, Germany, Belgium and Holland and was discharged in 1946. He was awarded the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp, 1939-1945 Star, France and Germany Star and Defence Medal. In addition to the regular medals, Lloyd was awarded the Médaille de la Reconnaissance Française - Bronze by France. He returned to his duties with the Canada Post Office in Regina but eventually left to farm at Chelan, SK, where he married and had three children. The family relocated to farm near Craik and then, because of health issues, to Melfort, SK where he passed away in 1969.





MILLER, David Dennis

PEACETIME

David was born in 1971 in Kipling, Saskatchewan. He enlisted Army and served as a Vehicle Technician during Peacetime with the Electrical and Mechanical Engineers. He was posted to CFB Winnipeg and later to CFB Gagetown with 2RCR from 1989 to 1997. He completed a United Nations tour in Haiti in 1995.

The poem on page 401, entitled *Vimy "The Legacy of Willie Milne"*, was written about William's heroic actions that undoubtedly saved the lives of many of his comrades.

Harold was born in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan on July 3, 1922. He served his community of Saskatoon in the capacity of photo referee, track referee and timer or walk judge, at every level possible. He also served in the Royal Canadian Air Force from 1941 to 1945. At the provincial and Western Canadian level, Harold officiated at numerous competitions, one being the Western Canada Summer Games. He also served on a variety of provincial sport-related boards. Harold worked as a timer or photo referee at national track and field competitions, as well as national junior football championships. WWII

Cecil was born on May 29, 1922 in Moosomin, Saskatchewan. He enlisted in the Army with the 8th Light Anti-Aircraft Regiment Royal Canadian Artillery and the 101st Battery Royal Canadian Artillery. He served during the Second World War from July 10, 1941 until May 21, 1946 in Europe, France and Germany. He experienced first action against enemy fighter planes, the Battle of the well-fortified city of France. The enemy's army surrounded at Falaise, Gap, there were more prisoners than allies, Canadians, Polish and Americans. The enemy was short of petrol, no planes so they modified their guns to use as artillery as well as anti-aircraft. They were at Oldenburg, Germany on VE Day. Cecil was decorated with the French Cross of War with Silver Star.

MONK, Joseph

wwi

Joseph was born August 6, 1893 in Thurlaston, Leicestershire, England. He enlisted in Regina, Saskatchewan on August 16, 1915 and served with the 46th and 13th Battlion during the First World War. He gave his occupation as a porter and was listed as single. He listed he was living in Lumsden, SK at the time. He was killed in action in Courcelette, France on September 4, 1916. He is commemorated on the Vimy Memorial.



MOORE, George "Geo"

NORTH-WEST REBELLION

Geo was born in County of Perth, Township of Elma, Town of Listowel, Ontario on October 16, 1863. He left on March 16, 1880 and went to High Bluff, Manitoba. He joined the North-West Rebellion in 1885 with the Manitoba Grenadiers. He was a charter member of the North West Field Force from 1885 until 1945 then joined in with the Legion and they pensioned him off in January 1945. He moved to Alameda on April 1, 1891 and lived in a sod shack on his homestead. In the fall of 1901 he was burnt out and lost everything. He moved to Frobisher in 1902 and built a livery barn and a house. While Geo lived in town, his brother Ed farmed his land. Together they bought up bronchos in Montana, brought them back, broke them and then sold them. On October 26, 1904, he married Mabel Hutson. He and Mabel had a family of four children: Violet, Walter, Isabel and Verna. Together they built a new home on the homestead and resided until their deaths. Geo passed away on April 1, 1956.

WWII






MORTON, John Leslie "Jack"





WWI



He gave his life on September 20, 1916 at Courcelette and is commemorated on the Vimy Memorial, having no known grave.

MURSELL, Norman George

WWII

Norman was born on February 17, 1921, son of Norman George Mursell the first and Maisie Rose (Mary Elizabeth) in Alameda. Norman was known only to his friends as "Tub". He served in the Second World War from 1940 to 1945 with the Lake Superior Regiment. Returning from serving in the Canadian Armed Forces, he accepted employment with Bill Whatmore's Implement Agency in Frobisher. On September 22, 1947, he married Winnifred Lorraine Whatmore and to this union three children were born: Norman Wayne, Brenda Darlene and Debra Lynn. This young family lived a happy, loving and fun-filled fifteen years together in the village of Frobisher. On June 15, 1963, Norman passed away suddenly at the age of 42.





MUTCH, John Thomas

WWI

John was born on August 12, 1891 in Regina, Saskatchewan. He enlisted in the Army and served with the 72nd Battalion during the First World War. Lieutenant Mutch was killed in action at Quarouble, France on November 7, 1918 while raising himself to observe the enemy position and was struck with a round to the chest. He had previously been awarded the Military Cross during the crossing of the Canal de L'Escaut, leading his men safely across after the boats were swamped due to enemy machine gun fire. He is buried at the Denain Communal Cemetery in Nord, France.


























NEEDHAM, Thomas Francis

He was a member of the Saskatoon Main Branch and Calgary North Branch for many years. Len passed away in 2012.

Stanley was born in 1920 in Hendon, Saskatchewan. He enlisted in the Army and he was a TPR with the 1st Hussars during the Second World War. He was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion in Rose Valley, SK. Stanley passed away in 2000 and is buried in the Rose Valley Cemetery in Rose Valley.



WWII



Bill was born in Regina, Saskatchewan on April 21, 1922. While growing up in Regina, he participated in a wide variety of sports. In high school he starred in hockey, football, boxing and athletics. He continued with these throughout his academic career enjoying football, hockey, and boxing at the senior levels in Canada. He served with the Royal Canadian Navy Volunteer Reserve from 1942 to 1945. Bill was the first Canadian to obtain a PhD in Exercise Physiology and while working on this degree became involved in the testing of world-class athletes. He was employed by the Canadian Department of Defense where he developed the famous "5 BX" (Five Basic Exercises) fitness program that proved to be one of the most popular fitness regimens ever developed with over 23 million copies sold worldwide. Soon after this success, Bill went to the University of Saskatchewan as the Director of the School of Physical Education. In 1963, he became associated with a very successful longitudinal study on Child Growth and Development in which a randomly selected group of boys in Saskatoon was followed and studied for ten years. Bill moved to the University of Ottawa in 1966 as Professor and Dean of the School of Physical Education. In 1967, he worked with the Medical Research Team at the Winnipeg Pan-American Games and acted on the Advisory Committee of the National Hockey League. He maintained a steady involvement with the Canadian Association for Health, Physical Education and Recreation (CAPHER) throughout his academic career and reached the level of president by 1971.

PACHOLKA (MORAN), Pamela

WWII

Pamela was born in Croyton, England in 1923. She was a nurse then joined the Royal Air Force during the Second World War where she trained as a meteorologist and met Wally. They were married in 1944 and raised five children. After Wally's retirement, Pan and Wally became passionately involved in the Liberal Party during the Chrétien years, Wally more so than Pam. They also spent much of their spare time travelling. Pamela died on January 16, 2005 at St. Annes Veterans Hospital. She is buried at the Field of Honour in Point Claire, Quebec.



PACHOLKA, Walter "Wally"

WWII

Wally was born on March 8, 1919 in Yorkton, Saskatchewan. He moved to Montreal where he worked at Nordyne Aviation, now Bombardier. In 1942, he joined the Royal Air Force where he flew as a navigator on decoy missions accompanying bombers. He served in Europe during the Second World War. He met Pamela Moran and they were married in 1944. In 1945, he continued in the AF where he would fly C119's and F100's rising to the rank of S/L 402 in Winnipeg, EWU in St. Hubert, and as a CO in Royal Canadian Air Force Stn. Winisk. He spent time in Texas and three years in Metz, France. He completed 55 missions and left the Air Force. He did Flight Instruction with Air Canada. In 1981, after doing some work in Jamaica and Sri Lanka, he retired. He became passionately involved with the Liberal Party in Chrétien years. Wally died on July 25, 2014 at St. Anne's Veterans Hospital in Montreal. He is buried at the Field of Honour in Pointe Claire, Quebec by his wife.

In 1970, he enrolled in The Lorne Scotts PD&H Regiment in Oakville, Ontario until honourably released in 1975 with the rank of Master Corporal Infantryman. He also joined the Lorne Scotts 1188 Royal Canadian Army Cadet Corps from 1970 to 1971. PARKER, Donald "Don"


WWII

Donald was born on December 6, 1924 in Saskatoon, SK. He and his older brother Eric went to Caswell School and Saskatoon Technical Collegiate. In September 1943, he joined the Canadian Army at #12 District Depot in Regina, SK and took Basic Artillery training at Brandon (Gunner). He sailed for England during the Second World War on British Troop Ship ANDES, not in a convoy. Ten days later, they landed in Southampton on December 4, 1944. He was attached to 13 +2/14 Canadian Field Regiment. In 1945, he went to Utrecht, Holland then Germany near Oldenburg, going from town to town rounding up German prisoners of war; then to the naval barrack at Wilhemshaven, releasing Germans back to civilian life. Due to sickness, he was sent to hospital near Brennan, then to 22nd General Hospital at Bramshott, England. He left the hospital on March 22, 1946 on the hospital ship Lady Rodney for Canada. The screened top deck housed mental patients; second deck, pregnant English War Brides; the bottom deck was for wounded or sick soldiers. After about fourteen days at sea, they docked in Halifax, then took the hospital train to Regina. Don was discharged on May 1, 1946. He married and had three children. He was a member of Saskatoon Legion Branch 63 for 45 years. Don passed away on August 26, 2009 and is buried in Saskatoon Woodlawn Cemetery.



PARKER, John James Frederick "Eric" "Jack" WWII

Eric was born on September 30, 1922 in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan. To his family and in his younger years, he was known as Eric. In later years, he was also called Jack. Eric was a reservist with the Saskatoon Light Infantry at an early age. Eric volunteered for his country and was in the Army during the Second World War and served in England. His younger brother, Don, would follow later. Eric returned to Saskatoon after the war and began working for the City of Saskatoon. In 1952, Eric joined the Royal Canadian Air Force, trained at Camp Borden, Ontario then posted to Squadron 23 Wing 406 (Lynx) Squadron. In 1955, Eric returned to civilian life after a career ending injury and was re-employed with the City of Saskatoon until retirement. Eric and his wife Isabel raised their family in Montgomery Place, a veterans holding. Eric passed away on November 22, 2003 and is buried in Woodlawn Cemetery with his name on the wall of honour. Eric was a member of the Legion Branches 63 and 362.

PAUL, George


WWI

George was born in Sarnia, Ontario on April 24, 1884. He was farming in Alsask, Saskatchewan at the time of enlisting in Saskatoon on March 9, 1916. He served with 96th Battalion, 5th Battalion, 15th Battalion and Canadian Highlanders during the First World War. He was injured with fractured ribs on April 11, 1917, noting that his pocket watch saved his life. Later, he ended up being medically discharged from a fracture to his right leg on February 22, 1918 which impeded his movement and showing a shorter right leg.

PAUL, John James

John was born in Sarnia, Ontario on January 7, 1877. He listed his occupation as a farmer from Alsask, Saskatchewan when he enlisted on Decemeber 30, 1914 in Saskatoon. He reached the rank of Lance Corporal after making a request to transfer from 1st C.M.R. to the Canadian Ordnance Corps during the First World War. He was discharged upon demobilization in January of 1919. John passed away on January 5, 1960.



PEARCE, David "Dave"



RCMP

David Pearce, who was born in Montreal on October 7, 1937, began his association with the sport of softball in Regina when he was posted there with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and continued following his retirement from the force. Three groups in Regina that felt his administrative support were the Regina Minor Girls Softball League, A.C.T. Boys Softball, and Regina Gold Softball. David organized a series of clinics that served to improve the skill areas of the sport throughout the province. From 1990 to 1994, he served as the Canada Games coach for the province and conducted a series of coaching clinics throughout the province. He also coached the Regina boys' team in the 1974 Saskatchewan Games. David has served softball throughout the world by conducting coaching clinics in Italy, Australia, Bahamas, USA, China, Japan, Central and South America. He, along with the 1983 Pan American Games gold medal team, was inducted in the Softball Canada Hall of Fame in 1997.

Bert was born in Newport, Isle of Wight, UK on August 14, 1897. He served with the Canadian Expeditionary Force during the First World War. He dedicated his life to the promotion of figure skating at the national, regional, provincial, and local level. Bert was chairman of the Western Section of the Canadian Figure Skating Association (CFSA) for fifteen years, and served as judges' chairman for many years. He was chairman for the first Western Canadian Figure Skating Championships, the North American Figure Skating Championships in 1955, and the Canadian Figure Skating Championships held in 1965. In 1967, Bert received the Centennial Medal and was appointed to represent the Canadian Figure Skating Association at the World Figure Skating Championships. Bert was an international figure skating judge for many years.



PETERSEN, Arnold Sofus

WWI

Arnold was born in Horesens, Denmark in 1891. He served two years in the Jutland Rifles in Denmark prior to moving to Canada. Upon arrival, he began homesteading in the Carlea are near Nippawin, SK. He enlisted in the Military on May 15, 1915 in Prince Albert, SK. He served with the 53rd Battalion, 2nd Canadian Mounted Rifles in Belgium, France and England during the First World War. On December 25, 1916 in Arras, France, he was injured from shrapnel to the left leg. After surgery and some recovery time he returned to service, remaining in England. He was discharged upon demobilization on February 12, 1919. Arnold passed away in 1973.














PETIT, Claude





Claude was born in Duck Lake, Saskatchewan on October 31, 1935. He is not only a distinguished serviceman, serving with the Armed Forces from 1951 to 1966, and athlete, but also a role model for the First Nations community. Claude kept his focus on Saskatchewan boxing circles, quickly becoming well known within them. Youth in Saskatoon, Regina, Prince Albert, Ile-a-La Crosse, Green Lake and Meadow Lake all benefited from his boxing clubs. A veteran of the Canadian Armed Forces and a member of the Princess Patricia Canadian Light Infantry, Petit was a five-time Canadian Army heavyweight boxing champion (1958-1963). In 1964, he became the only Canadian to win the British Army Heavyweight Boxing Championship. His military in-ring accomplishments earned him a place on the Canadian Forces Sports Hall of Fame Honour Roll.

PHILLIPS, James "Leslie"

WWII

Leslie was born on April 8, 1919 in the Tate, Saskatchewan District. He was the son of Alsworth (Allie) and Laura Phillips. He attended School at Tate, SK. Leslie was a gunner in the Royal Canadian Artillery 24th Field Regiment during the Second World War. Leslie married Edna Shaw on September 15, 1941. Edna travelled with Leslie to various places where he was stationed. Their first son was born in Winnipeg in 1942. Their second son was born in Vernon in 1945. He was also stationed at Wainwright. After his discharge, they purchased a farm in Semans and in 1947 a daughter was born. Leslie continued farming until 1983 when ill health forced him to quit. He passed away on March 26, 1984. He was a member of Legion Branch 108.



POPP, Miles M. WWII, SPECIAL DUTY AREA & PEACETIME

Miles was born in Truax, Saskatchewan in 1928 and was raised in the Smoky Ridge area. As a teenager, Miles did some cowboy work near Seabee, Alberta in the early 1940s. In 1943, he went back home and enlisted with the Prince Albert Volunteers and later transferred to the 16/22nd Saskatchewan Horse. He served until 1946 and upon being discharged from the Army he went to work for the Canadian National Railway. In 1954, he married and then joined the Royal Canadian Air Force. He served in many air bases in Western Canada, most notably in Cold Lake, Alberta; Whitehorse, Yukon Territory and Alert, NWT. He was honourably discharged in 1969. He was awarded the Canadian Special Services Medal with Alert Bar, Canada 125 Medal and the Canadian Decoration. He was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion in Whitehorse, YT and Pincher Creek, Alberta. Miles passed away in 2014.



WWII



Starting in 1952, Dave coached numerous provincial teams in national and international competition. Among his accomplishments were 115 provincial championships and 42 medals in Canadian competition. These national medals include 25 gold won by ten different wrestlers, five of whom went on to international competition.

George was born on March 12, 1906 in Kirkcaldy, Scotland. He immigrated to Canada in 1928 and worked in farms until he moved to the Stowlea District in 1934 to become a homesteader. He enlisted with the Artillery on August 12, 1943 and served in France, England, Belgium, Germany, and Holland until his discharge on March 8, 1946. He received the following medals: 1939-1945 Star, France and Germany Star, George VI DG Medal, and the 1939-1945 Canadian Volunteer Service Medal. He was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion Turtleford Branch 128 for fifty years. George passed away in 2003.

WWI








RACETTE, Norman C.


WWII

RAMSAY, William Beattie



WWI

William was born in Lumsden, Saskatchewan on August 11, 1895. After serving three years as a pilot overseas during the First World War, William returned to captain the University of Toronto Blues hockey team. They were university and Ontario Hockey Association champions in 1920, and then in 1921, Allan Cup winners. William joined the Toronto Granites which won the Allan Cup in 1923. They were selected to represent Canada at the 1924 Winter Olympics at Chamonix, France. Outscoring their opponents 88 to 3, they won Canada's first hockey Olympic gold medal. After playing one year with the Toronto Maple Leafs (1927/28), William went on to become a successful coach. WWII


Robert was born in Swift Current, Saskatchewan on October 3, 1917. He started playing golf at an early age. By the time he was in college, he was the Inter-Collegiate Golf Champion in 1937 and 1938. He served in the Royal Canadian Army Medical Corps from 1940 to 1946. In Saskatchewan golf history, Dr. Reid has the distinction of winning three major events: Saskatchewan Junior Golf Championship in 1934, Saskatchewan Amateur Golf Championship for five years (1936, 1941, 1946, 1950 and 1952), and the Saskatchewan Senior Golf Championship in 1973 and 1975. Reid was a member of the Willingdon Cup team for six years between 1936 and 1955; a member of the Canadian Army Team overseas in 1945; and with scores of 75, 76, and 75, was the third lowest amateur in the 1952 Canadian Open.

REID, Robert J. "Bobby"



WWI

Bobby was born on September 13, 1891 in Hamilton, Scotland. From 1914 to 1926, he played soccer with the Saskatoon Thistles, the CNR Soccer Club, and the Fifth Battalion Soccer Club. He served with the Canadian Expeditionary Force. An all-round athlete, Bobby boxed for, and was also the physical instructor for, the 96th Highlanders. His next sixteen months were spent in the employ of the New York Americans Hockey Team as trainer and physiotherapist. Upon returning to Saskatoon in 1935, Bobby was active as a player, coach, trainer, manager, and administrator of many local sports until his retirement.





REINHART, Charles Anthony

PEACETIME

Charles was born in 1924 in Tompkins, Saskatchewan. He enlisted with the Royal Canadian Air Force and served in Canada and West Germany. Charles passed away in 2000.

Herbert was born in 1921 in Tompkins, SK. He enlisted with the Army and served in the Aleutian Islands. Herbert passed away in 2007.

REIRGARDIN, Bert

WWI & WWII

Bert was born in Ada, Minnesota, a few miles east of Fargo. His parents lived there after moving from Iowa in 1875. On the Fargo land, they raised four hundred to five hundred bushels of potatoes per acre and shipped them to Chicago. In 1906, his dad farmed out the four boys with Bert ending up in Ulen, Minnesota. His father went to Estevan and bought a quarter-section at Mount Green. Bert arrived at Ambrose, North Dakota in 1909 and his father drove in and took him to Canada. Bert went to school for two or three years at Mount Green and helped farm. In 1916, he had a rust year and enlisted in the Army. In 1938 to 1939, he owned a garage and bulk station in Hoffer but later closed it. He enlisted in the fall of 1939, but did not get called up, so in 1940 he went to Regina and in ten days he was on the road to Kingston. With ten other boys, Bert enlisted in the Core Signals. In 1942, he got caught in an explosion and was in the 18th Field Hospital for nine months. The King's yacht was turned into a Red Cross boat in December 1942 and they boarded her.

RENNIE, Clayton Atkinson Francis

WWII

Clayton was born on February 15, 1917 to parents Len and Jennie May (Atkinson) in Frobisher, SK. His siblings were Melba Marion Isabel, Huel Alexander and Leona. The first social activity Clayton remembers was in 1924 when Jean Riddell invited their class to her home to take turns with radio earphones listening to King George V message to the Empire. The first exasperating thing he ever did was trying to catch gophers at three cents per tail in a multi-million dollar oil field. Clayton left Frobisher in 1939, obtained a job as salesman for the Maytag Washing Company, took a course in Winnipeg and then went selling door to door in Regina. The washer business was good but short lived. Canada was now at war with Germany and the washer companies converted to manufacturing war equipment. Clayton took the Federal Census in Frobisher and then worked as G.M. parts man at Perry Motors in Estevan until he was called up on February 13, 1942 into the Communications Branch of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and spent time in Quebec, Victoria, Prince Rupert and West Coast Patrol. On January 28, 1945, he married Mayda Elizabeth Broberg. They bought a house in Victoria, BC and Clayton got his discharge on August 25, 1945. Clayton and Mayda had three children: Warren, Brian and Sharolyn.



WWI

Francis was born on November 10, 1890 in Frobisher, Saskatchewan. He was a salesman, and one of Frobisher's most eligible bachelors. He joined the Army near the end of the First World War, he said he fought, but had to join anyway. Frank was another of Frobisher's merchants. After John Forsyth sold out, he started a business on the premises. When Frank moved, he took over the W. Lochart building which is now the Senior Citizen Centre. Later he sold the Gent's Furnishings to his brother Len. He then moved into the Wood's and Wylie building across the street and took on the General Motors and Massey Harris dealerships. When the depression closed him out, he worked as a truck driver, then as manager of the L. E. Rennie branch butcher shop in Glen Ewen. After which he worked for Wm. Boyd in the Glen Ewen hotel until 1938 when he went to Winnipeg with Mr. Cooney to start an armored car service and ended up as a salesman. He retired to Frobisher in 1940 and died in 1941 at the age of 51.

RENNIE, Jack Douglas

WWII

Jack was the second son of Arthur and Leah (Remmer) born at home in Frobisher, Saskatchewan. Jack had a brother named Grant. He attended South Frobisher, Roscoe and Frobisher schools. Jack moved to Regina sometime between 1936 to 1940 and was in the Royal Canadian Air Force during the Second World War from 1940 to 1945. In 1945 he married Verna L. Hansen from Mont Nebo, Saskatchewan. They had one son Douglas Arthur born in 1954 at Vancouver, British Columbia where they still reside.





RENNIE, John Malcolm

WWII

John was born in 1925 in Wadena, SK. He enlisted with the Canadian Army on January 25, 1944 and served in England, France, Germany, and Belgium with the Scottish Regiment, 2nd Division, 6th Brigade until 1946. He received the following decorations: France and Germany Star, King George 1939-1945 Medal, and the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal. Having previous military experience with the 95th Saskatchewan Rifles, John enlisted with the 46th Battalion on December 19, 1914 in Regina, Saskatchewan. He shipped overseas and was transferred to the 3rd Battalion. On May 7, 1916, he became ill with the measles, but was able to rejoin his battalion on June 15 of that year. He lost his life on September 9, 1916 after being wounded from shrapnel. He is buried at Puchevillers British Cemetery in Amiens, France.

RIDDELL, William Irwin "Bill"

WWI

Bill was born on October 1, 1898 in Alameda, Saskatchewan. He attended school in Frobisher, Winnipeg and Regina College. When he was sixteen he enrolled in the Army as being an eighteen year old. At the age of eighteen he left the Army to join Canada's Royal Flying Corps towards the end of the First World War. After returning from France, he went back to Frobisher and worked for a while in his father's store. In 1925, he joined the Royal Canadian Air Force. Bill was stationed at Vancouver, Trenton, Camp Borden and Ottawa during which time he established himself as the most colourful acrobatic pilot in Canada. He was a Wing Commander of Canada's ace flying team Siskin aircraft pilots. He held honorary membership with Canada's Golden Hawks flying team. He rose to the rank of Wing Commander and was commanding officer at the large air force base at Rockcliff near Ottawa. He married Margaret Isobel McLean from Montreal on October 17, 1931 and they had two daughters: Martha Adaline and Margot Ann. Bill passed away on December 18, 1969 in Ottawa and is buried in Cobourg, Ontario.






RIEDERER, Frederick







He also served in the Navy during the First World War. After a lengthy illness he passed away in November 1949. He was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion in Frobisher.



SACKNEY, Harry

WWII

Harry enlisted with the Royal Canadian Artillery during the Second World War and served in Canada and in England until his discharge. After the war he returned to Sheho and farmed for quite a few years. He joined the Foam Lake Legion Branch in 1947 and was transferred to the Sheho Branch in 1950 when it was formed. He was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion for over 35 years before he passed away in March of 1987.



WWII





SERVATIUS, John Raymond


WWII

John was born in 1914 in Melrose, Minnesota. He immigrated to Canada with his parents in 1920. He enlisted with the Canadian Army when the Second World War broke out. In September of 1944 he was wounded in action in France. A piece of shrapnel went into his stomach and he spent the next several months in hospitals and returned home to Canada on January 25th, 1945. He was discharged from the Army on May 25, 1945 and was awarded four medals. John passed away on March 18, 1984.

SHARP, Harry

WWI & WWII

Harry was born in April 1898 in Ontario. In 1900, at the age of two he moved with his family to a farm in Frobisher. In 1909, he moved into town where Harry completed Grades 1 to 8 by the age of eleven. He completed high school at Oxbow by age fourteen. He enlisted in the 52nd Regiment of the 3rd Division and served for three and a half years in the First World War. He also served for four and a half years in the Second World War. Army life did much to instill in Harry the necessity of leadership, team work and discipline. In addition, he acquired a love of fair play and respect for his fellowman. The wars were major events in Harry's life. During the hard years of the Second World War, his rise through the ranks was nothing short of phenomenal. Between 1939 and 1945, he rose to the rank of brigadier-general. After the war, he again became a colonel during which time he commanded the Regina Rifles. Harry recalled with pride that these troops were the first to land on the shores of France on D-Day. Between 1919 and 1923 he attended university and also taught in country schools. He was awarded his degree at the age of 25, after which he was appointed to the position of principal at the North Battleford Collegiate. Harry married Doris McCarthy and was blessed with four children: Tom, Jack, Mary and Joan. On February 19, 1963 Harry retired after forty years.



SHAW, Alvie Greet

WWII

Alvie was born on June 24, 1918 in the Saline Creek District, north of Semans, Saskatchewan. He was the oldest son of James (Jake) and Gladys Shaw. He was a private in the South Saskatchewan Regiment Canadian Army during the Second World War. He was discharged due to medical reasons. He married Mary Cowling of Semans on October 24, 1942. They made their home in Semans where they raised a daughter and a son. Alvie worked for farmers and then ran the dray. In 1949, he was hired as Town Maintenance man until his passing on February 12, 1974.



WWII



WWI



SIMPSON, Jack


WWI




SMITH, A. L. WWII







During his tenure with the Pats, Ed established records for the best goals against average, most shutouts, most games played, and the most saves by a goalie. In 1974 and 1975, he was named the Western Canada Junior Hockey League's (WCJHL) most valuable player and led the Pats to their third Memorial Cup in the 1973/74 seasons. Ed joined Canada's military following the completion of his hockey career and has advanced to the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel. His military duties have seen Ed in a peacekeeping role in Cyprus, Croatia, and Bosnia.

Alfred was born in Pendennis, Manitoba. He moved to Saskatchewan in 1932 and married and had two children. He enlisted with the Royal Canadian Artillery on July 21, 1941. 




STEINHAUER, George Henry

WWII



WWII & SPECIAL DUTY AREA



TAYLOR, Harvey

WWI

Harvey was born in Dashwood, Ontario on June 23, 1897. He was drafted for service from Regina on June 15, 1918. He served in the Army with the 1st Depot Battalion Saskatchewan Regiment during the First World War. He was a member of the Frobisher Ex-Servicemen's Association which was formed prior to the Second World War. The last meeting was January 17, 1942.

TAYLOR, Neil J. "Piffles"



WWI

Neil was born in Collingwood, Ontario on March 29, 1895. As a member of the 1915 Regina Rugby Club Piffles, Taylor led the team to the Western Rugby Championships in 1913, 1914, and 1915. In 1916, he joined the Royal Flying Corps and became a fighter pilot. He lost an eye when he was shot down and spent a year in a German prisoner of war camp during the First World War. His brother Sam, also a pilot, was shot down and killed. In 1919, he won the coveted Hugo Ross Trophy. He served in the Canadian Expeditionary Force from 1916 to 1918. Neil became the president of the Regina Roughriders in 1934, president of the Western Interprovincial Football Union in 1937, and he was president of the Canadian Rugby Union in 1946. Following his untimely death in 1947, Park de Young in Regina became Taylor Field. Neil was inducted posthumously into the Canadian Football Hall of Fame in 1963.



TAYLOR, Percy

WWI

Percy was born in Norfolk, England on January 28, 1897. He moved to Canada in 1913. The First World War broke out in August 1914 and Percy enlisted on November 15 as part of the 152nd Battalion. The first winter was spent in Estevan and Shilo, Manitoba before being sent overseas to England and then to France in a great hurry. Percy was wounded at Vimy Ridge on April 9, 1916 and sent back to England for hospital care. After recovery, he transferred to the Air Force and was in this service until the war ended. He was honourably discharged in June 1919. He married Catherine Walker in 1925 and had five children. He moved to Summerland, British Columbia. Percy passed away in April 7, 1976 at the age of 79. He is buried in The Legion Plot at the Field of Honor, Canyon View Cemetery.

WWII







WWII

Jack was born on September 21, 1912 in Kelwood, Manitoba. He moved with his parents to Pleasantdale, SK. He enlisted with the Royal Canadian Engineers in 1939 and served in Canada, England, France, Germany, Holland, and Belgium until his discharge in January of 1945. He married Myrtle Pendleton and in 1948 they moved out to the homestead. They finally went to Arborfield and there they raised a family of eight children. Jack passed away on October 24, 1981.



WWI

Earl was born in Birch Hills, Saskatchewan on April 19, 1892. He served in the Canadian Expeditionary Force in 1916. He was regarded as one of the finest hurdlers in North America. Internationally he had twice set world records with 110-metre hurdles in 1915 and 1919. Earl qualified for the 110-metre hurdles and long jump in the 1920 Olympic Games in Belgium. He won gold in hurdles equaling his own record time of 14.8 seconds, setting a new Olympic and world record that stood for eleven years. He was the fourth Canadian to win an Olympic Track and Field Championship since the start of the modern games in 1896. After the games, Earl returned to Dartmouth College where he won three USA Inter-Collegiate Hurdles Championships. He also had a distinguished seventeen-year coaching career at the US Naval Academy in Maryland.





THORBURN, James Henry Walter

WWII

James was born in 1906 in Maymont, SK. He enlisted with the Prince Albert Volunteers on May 18, 1942. He later joined the South Saskatchewan Regiment and served in Canada and England as a Driver for officers, ambulance, trucks and troops until his discharge on December 19th, 1945. James passed away in 1987.





Bob was born in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan on January 13, 1922. He has had a long-standing association with the sport of softball in Saskatoon and the world. After the war, he moved on to the administrative side of the sport, organizing a team in the Saskatoon Amateur Softball League and then eventually becoming the first commissioner of the Saskatoon Senior Men's Softball League in 1965. In 1969, Bob was elected as president of the Canadian Amateur Softball Association. He served in this capacity until 1986 and his term is marked by rapid growth in the number of players to over one million, and the overseeing of the development of a national officiating program that resulted in over 2,500 umpires receiving training and guidance to improve their skills.



WWII





VERBOOM, Marinus







WWI





WALLS, Thomas Jr.





He had also played on five Stanley Cup winning teams (1943, 1947, 1948, 1949 and 1951). Harry finished his career with 236 goals, and 207 assists, in 809 games. In 1948, he led the Leafs with 26 goals and no penalty minutes. Upon retirement, Harry was in the NHL's top 15 All-Time scorers.







WWII





WWI


John was born in Lumsden, Saskatchewan on January 2, 1888. He enlisted in the Army from Lumsden, SK where he was a clerk on December 6, 1915. He was sent to England during the First World War arriving on May 8, 1916. From there he was sent to France on June 6, 1916. In October of that year he was hospitalized for shell shock. He spent some time with the 7th Res. Battalion before returning to the front in February 1917. On September 29, 1917 he was killed at Mericourt, France and is buried in the Beehive Cemetery in Willerval, France.

WILSON, Arthur

WWII

Arthur was born in Govan on October 20, 1920 to Harry and Alice (Brabiner of Leeds, England). His siblings were Kathleen and Edith Victoria. The family moved to Seamans where Arthur took two years of schooling before they moved again to Estevan until their father for a job in the Munro district living on a farm one mile north of the Collop's. The depression was over by the outbreak of the Second World War. Arthur joined the Air Force and became a pilot and returned home uninjured. He married Ida Londry of Minnedosa and they had no children.





WILSON, Frederick "Fred"



WWI

Fred was born in Hastings, Ontario on October 3, 1892. Having spent his early years in Balgonie, he joined the Regina Rugby Club in 1913 (the year they won the Western Canada Football Championship) and over the next three years earned himself a reputation as the best kicker in the league. At 145 pounds he was too small to do any hitting but was amazingly fast when sent around the end. He also had the remarkable ability to kick the ball with either foot on the dead run. He served with the Canadian Expeditionary Force from 1917 to 1919. After the First World War, he returned to Regina, playing four great seasons from 1919 to 1922; in 1921 the Regina Rugby Club had become the Regina Roughriders.



WOOD, Robert William

WWI

Robert was born in Dudley, England on October 5, 1893. He immigrated to Canada in 1906, homesteading in Verwood, SK. He joined the 68th Battalion in Regina, SK on September 9, 1915. He served in Canada, England and France during the First World War. During training, he slipped on some ice and severely dislocated his ankle. He was given a medical discharge on January 31, 1916. Still wanting to participate in the war, he returned home and then travelled to Scotland. Arriving in Aberdeen, he joined the Gordon Highlanders of the 51st Highland Division in March 1916. While in Aberdeen, he met his future wife and married her in May 1916. In June 1916, he was sent to France and right into the Battle of the Somme. In early 1918, his ankle gave out and he was sent to England where he worked for the British Army in a Labour Company. In 1919, he returned to Canada on a Canadian Troop Ship. He returned to Scotland to bring his War Bride home to the farm in Verwood, SK. They had two sons and two daughters. In 1930 they moved to Assiniboia where he worked at the Court House for 25 years. In later years he wrote his biography telling many stories about the Battle of the Somme and the War. Robert passed away in 1977 and is buried in the Assiniboia Cemetery.



WOOD, Stephen Alfred


WWI

Stephen was born in Hoxbury, Gloucestershire, England on May 22, 1892. He was a farmer around Craven, SK before travelling to Regina to enlist in the Army on October 24, 1914. He served with the 28th Battalion during the First World War. He was killed in action during the Battle of Courcelette on September 15, 1916. He has no known grave and is commemorated on the Vimy Memorial.



RCMP

Ron was born in Aneroid, Saskatchewan on January 28, 1930. He served with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. He competed in pistol shooting championships at the provincial level between 1961 and 1971. He won the indoor provincial title eight times and placed second three times. Ron won the Provincial Outdoor Pistol Shooting Championship seven times, and in 1967 competed in, and won, the British Columbia Open Championship. At the national level, he competed between 1962 and 1969, winning the Canadian Closed Championship in 1968. Ron Woolgar was a member of Canada's International Team for six years. He also competed at the World Shooting Championships in 1970.



WOZNY, Albert "Al"

WWII

Al was born on August 1, 1922 in Hafford, Saskatchewan. He joined the Canadian Navy by enlisting in Vancouver in 1942. He joined the HMS Bayfield in late 1942. He was leading seaman on the minesweeper HMS Bayfield. He went overseas during the Second World War aboard HMS Bayfield in 1943. His ship was the leading minesweeper in the English Channel for the landing force on June 6, 1944. He retired from the Navy right after the war. Al received the following service medals: 1939-1945 Canadian Volunteer Service Medal, 1939-1945 Defence Medal, 1939-1945 Star and the 1939-1945 War Medal. All passed away on December 9, 2014 in Vancouver, British Columbia.



WWII


Rosalie was born in Mullingar, Saskatchewan in 1913. She joined the U.S. Army in 1939. She served two tours in the China-India-Burma theatre, Japan, Korea, Panama Canal and stateside. Her honours include: Asiatic-Pacific Campaign, American Campaign, WWII Victory Medal, Army of Occupation Medal and National Defence Medal. She received a Meritorious Service Citation in the China-India-Burma theatre. Rosalie worked at the 14th Evacuation Hospital caring for injured service personnel, refugees and members of the Merrill's Marauders. During her service, she obtained her U.S. citizenship. In 1954, she received an Honourable Discharge from the Army Nurse Corps as a Captain. She was an active member of the Disabled American Veterans Scottsdale, Chapter 22. In 1979, she received a Certificate of Appreciation from the Commander of the DAV Chapter 22 for her service. Rosalie was a Charter Member of the Women in Military Service for America Memorial at Arlington National Cemetery in Washington, D.C. Rosalie passed away in 2006.

WOZNY, Zigmund Stanley "Ziggy"

WWII & KOREAN WAR

Ziggy was born on May 28, 1919 in Hafford, Saskatchewan. He was a member of the Regina Rifles Regiment. He joined the military in 1939 and served in several capacities until his retirement in 1968 at age fifty. He served during the Second World War and the Korean War. Zigmund S. Wozny reached the rank of Lt. Colonel during his distinguished military service. He received the following medals: 1939-1945 Star, Italy Star, Defence Medal, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp, War Medal 1939-1945, Korea Medal, United Nations Service Medal, Korea Service Badge and Canadian Forces Decoration. Ziggy passed away on October 28, 2007 in Vancouver, British Columbia.

Arthur was born in Havenhill, England on March 29, 1878. He was working as a carpenter when he enlisted in the Army in Regina on March 20, 1915. He served during the First World War. Arthur passed away in 1956 and is buried in Regina Beach Cemetery.

YALTE, Nels Alfred


WWII

They moved to Ipswitch, Manitoba where Bill was a Grain Agent for Patterson Grain. They moved back to Stonehenge and eventually Bill took over the family farm. He farmed for many years even after the family moved to Assiniboia. He retired from farming in 1995. Bill was very involved in the community. They had three daughters. Bill passed away in September 2016 and is buried in the Assiniboia Cemetery.

PEACETIME



NELSON (SHORT), Barbara Ellen

Barbara was born in Cobham, Surrey, England. She met Leonard Glen Nelson, a Sapper in the Royal Canadian Engineers and they were married in 1944 at St Andrew's Church in Cobham. She departed to Canada from London on the Queen Mary in late May, early June 1946 while six months pregnant. She arrived in Halifax, Nova Scotia and took the train to her final destination of Ruthilda, SK. She was taken aback by the very long journey to rural Saskatchewan, the endless flat landscape and by the lack of modern amenities, so different compared to home. Although Len, her father, tried to prepare her, reality was a bit of a shock.

REED (KERR), Jean

Jean was born in Crossford, Lankshire, Scotland. She married James Whitby Reed, a Lance Corporal in the Army, in 1945 in Crossford after a whirlwind courtship. She embarked on a journey on SS Letticia, arriving at Pier 21 in Halifax, Nova Scotia on March 24, 1946. She went to Springside, Saskatchewan and shortly after, she and Jim moved to Rose Valley, SK where they raised four children – a daughter and three sons. Jean was an active member of the Rose Valley Legion Ladies Auxiliary. She now resides in Tisdale, SK.





SMITH (PRELOG), Maria

Maria was born in a Villach, Austria in 1918. As Maria reached early adulthood, she and two friends decided they wanted to see the world. They headed to England where they obtained employment. When the Second World War broke out, Maria stayed in England to contribute to the war effort as a munitions factory worker. In 1943, while living in Uxbridge, Middlesex, England, she met and married Wesley Smith, a Canadian soldier with the 49th Loyal Edmonton Regiment. She arrived in Halifax, NS and left by train for Melfort, SK. Nicki had a wonderful welcome and was accepted by her husband's family. She loved Canada from the first day of her arrival and has had no regrets. Nicki was active in the Melfort Legion Ladies Auxiliary.

PARTINGTON (THEED), Eunice Frances

Eunice was born in Long Island, New York, USA. She married Reginald Francis Partington, a Sergeant in the Royal Canadian Engineers in 1945 in East Horsley, United Kingdom. She departed from Southampton on March 15, 1946 on the ship Aquitania. She arrived in Halifax, Nova Scotia on March 22, 1946 and made her way to Evesham, Saskatchewan. Eunice first noted with pleasure that there was no rationing.





WOOD (TOUGH), Christina Raitt

Christina was born in Aberdeen, Scotland in May 1891. She met Robert William Wood in Aberdeen and they were married in June 1916. Robert was a Corporal with the Gordon Highlanders, 51st Highland Division. She remained in Scotland during and after the war. Robert went home to Verwood, SK to work for a short time and then he returned to Aberdeen to bring Christina to Canada in March 1920. Christina believed Verwood was a much larger center than she found. Thus her statement when she stepped off the train, "Where is it?" She greatly missed her family and would cry every day when the train whistle blew. Christina adapted from the roll of sales clerk to a farm life. She was a fastidious housekeeper inside and outside. After moving to Assiniboia in 1930, she became known for her sparkling boardwalks. No speck of dirt was left unturned as she scrubbed the walks every day, bleaching the wood white. Her four children agreed that the saying "you could eat off the walks" was true. Christina was involved in her church and made many friends. After the birth of her fourth child, her health began to fail. In 1949, she fell and broke her hip which left her an invalid to the end of her life in 1963. During this time, she enjoyed visitations by family, friends, and ministers. Christina is buried in Mount Hope Cemetery in Assiniboia.

Dorothy was the eldest daughter of James and Mary Ellen Bradburn (Fidis). Her home was Southport, England. At age 5 or 6, she remained in England to attend school, in care of a paternal aunt. Her father, mother and one-year-old twin brothers in Lima Peru apparently perished from yellow fever, a disease carried by mosquitos. Dorothy married World War I solidier Andrew (Andy) Walker in England in April 1917; Dorothy was 22 and Andrew was 29 years old. Coming from England to a cold, isolated Saskatchewan farm life was a radical change for Dorothy. She and Andrew raised three daughters. She belonged to two competing ladies clubs – the Stanleyville Homemakers and the Russellville Ladies Aid. Dorothy passed away at home on Saturday March 19, 1949 at 54 years of age.

WALLACE, Isabelle

Isabelle was born in Scotland and went to Frobisher, SK as a War Bride in 1919. She married James Wallace and they had one son on August 17, 1920 but their son, Robbie, passed away on August 22, 1925. Isabelle was a member of council and overseer of the village of Frobisher. After her husband died, Isabelle returned to Scotland in 1954. She often spoke of her time in Canada, where she left her husband and son buried in Frobisher Cemetery. Isabelle passed away on October 19, 1989 at102 years of age.





WHITING (MURRAY), Jessie

Jessie was born in Wales, United Kingdom. She was brought to Canada by her aunt, May Logie, who came to live with her brother, William Murray, in May 1903. Jessie was one of ten children - four boys and six girls. She married Harry Whiting, who served in the Army, on December 25, 1914 in Frobisher, Saskatchewan.

Vimy "The Legacy of Willie Milne"

Canadian Expeditionary Force, Vimy Ridge, Thelus, France Easter Monday, April 9, 1917

As the winds grow weak and the sun grows long, As the clouds grow heavy and the stars shine strong; A rolling stretch of Douai Plain is what I might look on, O'er the ridge today.

The boys they lie upon the ground, they laugh and sing and pray; They're thankful for the heroes like Willie Milne today: Who filled with life and dreams and hope, gasped his final say, Up on the hill this day.

Vimy Ridge above this lair, has taken lives so young; The fighting lads from Canada going dusk to dawn; Yard by yard they must charge up, until the fight is won; On each and every day.

Round on round the rifles fire, up at the men we see; Sans love, sans hope, sans will, sans amore, sans d'espoir, sans esprit; With bodies of their countrymen lying in between; Upon this very day.

Climb up the hill at any cost, take 'er foot by foot, Through blood and guts and body parts; through mud and stench and soot, Until the enemy gives in, or 'til the ridge took; It should be ours today.

Inch by inch, man on man, cringing through their sites; The fight goes on at any cost, the ridge is ours tonight, Or tomorrow morn' the scurge goes on, 'til no man's left to fight; On and on each day.

Leaping, pounding thwarting, charging, "will" be on our side, Redeeming usurpations, avenging those who've died. The soldiers grit, "Oh Canada!"; We won't retreat or hide, On this or any day.

Go, go, go unto your death, despair; with bullets fly'n overhead, with cordite in the air; Until the Germans one by one, give way. "We must reach there!" Tripping o'er the ridge this hour;

The Germans cannot stay.

Victory isn't sweet, or light hearted, nor captured in a song; It's clamour brought to silence, winds drawn weak and sun grown long. Across the Douai Plain we stare; Our enemy's withdrawn, From Vimy Ridge today.


