Application Process:

Each application is reviewed and will be kept on file for 2 years. Due to the volume of application not all names will be selected. Each name will be submitted into the Military Service Recognition Book.

We also accept the family name if there are multiple family members that have served. Please indicate this in the bio and on the form.

Veterans are deemed to be anyone who has served or is currently serving in the Canadian Armed forces, its allies, and the RCMP.

Each name for a variety of seed is vetted using an international standard (as follows):

Every variety must be identified by a denomination (name). The denomination must be unique and not previously used within that class/crop type. That denomination is proposed by FP Genetics/Royal Canadian Legion, Saskatchewan Command and approved by the Breeder and Commissioner. The proposed denomination is subject to a six-month objection period and if there are valid objections to the name it could be rejected.

One variety – one name

Once a denomination has been approved that name would be reflected and used worldwide.

Variety naming guideline:

1. Names must not mislead and/or cause confusion.
2. Names must contain a minimum of two characters.
3. Names must be unique and cannot be accepted if already in use.
4. A variety name shall not be such as to be considered offensive.
5. Names consisting of mixtures of upper and lower case letters are discouraged.
